Dear Sir:

I have your letter of May 30th requesting copies of the law governing the sale of lands for delinquent taxes and their redemption and in reply will say that I do not have the law printed in pamphlet form.

For your information, the Clerk of the Court of each county is the custodian of the records of delinquent taxes covering all lands in that particular county. He is informed as to the application of the law and is the only person who can give you definite and specific information concerning the amount of delinquent taxes and their status against any particular piece of land.

Perme to suggest, therefore, that you confer with the Clerk of the Court of the county in which the land is situated for any information as to the delinquent taxes against such land.
