THE EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK PROJECT, COMPRISING AN AREA OF ABOUT TWO THOUSAND SQUARE MILES AND SITUATED IN THE SOUTHERNMOST PART OF CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES AND WITHIN ITS ONLY CLIMATIC TROPICS, IS AUTHORIZED BY ACT OF CONGRESS (MAY 30TH, 1934).

This National Park project is making marked progress and will eventually be freely accessible to the public as now are Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, Yosemite and other of the national parks. In the meantime much of interest can be visited within the Park area notwithstanding most of it is at the present time an impenetrable wilderness.

BY AIR: The Park area can be seen advantageously from the air. Its labyrinth of interlocking waterways, thousands of islands, colorful shallow bays, and bird life present pictures of intense interest. Consult local airplane companies for flight arrangements.

VIA BOAT: Boat trips into the Park region waters offer opportunities to enjoy much of the charm of the Park area. Boating trips can take off from Miami, Everglades City on the west coast, and Tavernier (Monroe County Keys); all three of these places have competent charter captains.

BY AUTO: The maximum eastern Park boundary is crossed by the Tamiami Trail thirty miles west of Miami. From that intersection going west the autoist travels through the Park on the Trail for about fifty miles; the maximum authorized western boundary being crossed by the Trail several miles east of the town of Ochopee, the first settlement met after leaving Miami.

The Royal Palm State Park, ultimately to be included in the greater National Park project, is located southwest of Homestead, and is well worth visiting, containing as it does fine examples of tropical hammock growth and many other features of Park interest.

The Florida Keys. A trip to the Florida Keys, at least as far south as Lower Matecumbe, can be made a pleasant day's auto outing from Miami. Part of the way is through the maximum boundaries authorized for the Everglades National Park.

This Association will be very appreciative of expressions of opinion from those who take any of the trips above recommended or otherwise have gained a familiarity with the Everglades National Park project. Also photographs taken within the general Park area, and contributed to the Park Association will be greatly appreciated.
