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SUMMARY

During the past fifteen months (the 1960-61 fiscal year plus the three month extended budget period), the City of Miami let contracts for Capital Improvements the total cost of which came to \$4,825,000.


Scheduled for the 1961-62 fiscal year (October through September), is an additional \$6,206,000 in improvements.

These are summarized below and discussed in further detail in the following pages.

In addition to the above, the City improved its street lighting during the period to the extent of an annual increase of \$89,000 to its street lighting budget. During the 1961-62 fiscal year, street lighting will be further improved by an additional \$55,000 increase in the budget.

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SANITARY SEWERS

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, contracts were let for ten sanitary sewer projects (plus twenty smaller sanitary sewer jobs done by Public Service). The total cost of these improvements was \$1,928,000.

These included five sanitary sewer improvement districts (totaling 17 miles), one trunk main, two pump stations, one expressway modification project, and one infiltration project. A brief summary of these follows.



STORM SEWERS

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, contracts were let for seven storm sewer projects (plus twenty-seven miscellaneous small local drainage projects done by City forces). The total cost of these improvements was \$494,000.

These included three storm sewer improvement districts, two interceptors, and two local drainage projects.

A brief summary of these follows.





HIGHWAYS AND STREETS

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, twenty-nine contracts were let for paving projects. Adding in the \$166,000 spent for right-of-way acquisition and the several miscellaneous small paving jobs done by City forces, these improvements totaled \$1,018,000. A brief summary of these follows.

Special paving projects included such items as turning lanes, and some parking facilities.

The forty-seven miles of remacadamizing consisted of 238 streets, predominantly residential.





1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, contracts were let for about thirty recreational facility projects. The total price of these projects was \$680,000. About two-thirds of this was for the two big items; the first nine holes of the LeJeune Golf Course with appurtenant structures, and the Plaza Park Swimming Pool. 
Proposed recreational facility improvements scheduled for 1961-62 total \$515,000. The three big items are the construction of the second nine holes at the LeJeune Golf Course, bulkhead improvements at Dinner Key, and Plaza Park development. The latter consists of acquisition of additional land and construction of a community house and other facilities. The proposed 1961-62 improvements are as follows.





DEVELOPMENT OF PLAZA PARK

STRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENTS

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, contracts were let for several structural improvements to City facilities and for the construction of new facilities. The total cost of these improvements was \$672,000, with the new Central Fire Station accounting for the bulk of this. These improvements are as follows:





MOTOR POOL BODY AND FENDER SHOP





CITY BEAUTIFICATION

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, the City landscaped the following highway areas at a cost of \$33,000.


Dixie Highway from Brooker Street to S.W. 27 Avenue Biscayne Boulevard from N.E. 13 Street to NE 23 Street S.W. 3 Avenue from SW 15 Road to SW 22 Street DuPont Plaza Area - four small beautification projects

1961-62 Proposed Improvements

One major beautification project, the Biscayne Boulevard Plaza, is proposed for the 1961-62 fiscal year. This project, costing \$550,000, will consist of the redevelopment and beautification of Biscayne Boulevard from S.E. 2nd Street to N.E. 5th Street. Traffic islands will be relocated and special service lanes provided. These islands as well as sidewalk areas will be landscaped with tropical plantings, fountains, and pools. Sidewalks will be widened and constructed of colorful terrazzo. Consideration is also being given to the incorporation of sidewalk cafes.



STREET LIGHTING

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, the City of Miami increased its street lighting by better than 10%. There was a net gain of 590 luminaires installed (or in the process of being installed), increasing the total output of Miami's street lighting system by 12, 400, 000 lumens. These improvements represent an annual increase of \$89,000 in the City's street lighting budget. Major projects include: Biscayne Boulevard (from S.E. 2nd Street to N.E. 5th Street), S.W. 1st Street, S.W. 8th Street, the Central Business District, the Central Negro Area, and Coconut Grove.


During the 1961-62 fiscal year, street lighting will be further improved to the extent of an additional \$55,000 annual increase in the street lighting budget. This will be for such lighting projects as:
