

STREET LIGHTING

1960-61 Improvements

Between July 1, 1960, and September 30, 1961, the City of Miami increased its street lighting by better than 10%. There was a net gain of 590 luminaires installed (or in the process of being installed), increasing the total output of Miami's street lighting system by 12,400,000 lumens. These improvements represent an annual increase of \$89,000 in the City's street lighting budget. Major projects include: Biscayne Boulevard (from S.E. 2nd Street to N.E. 5th Street), S.W. 1st Street, S.W. 8th Street, the Central Business District, the Central Negro Area, and Coconut Grove.

1961-62 Proposed Improvements

During the 1961-62 fiscal year, street lighting will be further improved to the extent of an additional \$55,000 annual increase in the street lighting budget. This will be for such lighting projects as:

Modernization of Lighting on Residential Streets	\$20,000
Modernization in Connection with State Road Projects	11,000
Modernization in Connection with City Highway Development	6,000
Individual Lighting Improvements at Requested Locations	13,000
Test Lighting Program	5,000

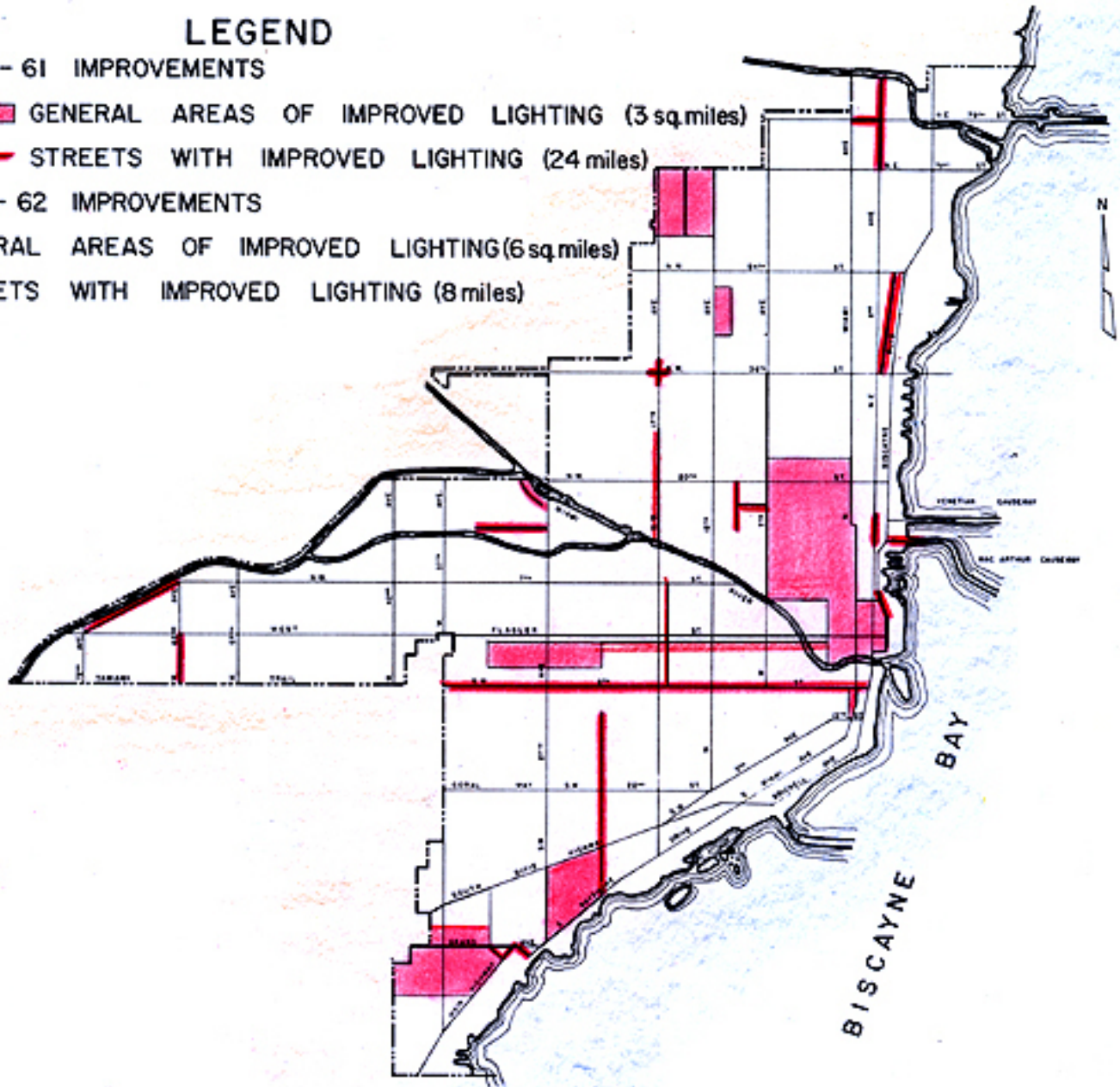
 GENERAL AREAS OF IMPROVED LIGHTING (3 sq.miles)
