MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI

On the 26th day of November, 1947, the Commission of the City of Miami, Florida, met at the City Hall in said City pursuant to an adjournment taken at the meeting of November 19th, 1947. The meeting was called to order at 2:01 o'clock P.M. by Chairman Perrine Palmer, Jr., and on roll call the following members of the Commission were found to be present: Messrs. Dunn, Gardner, Hosea, Palmer, Thomson. Absent: None.

REGULAR ELECTION - CANVASSING RETURNS:

The following resolution was introduced by Mr. Hosea, who moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 20291

A RESOLUTION CERTIFYING AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD NOVEMBER 25TH, 1947, FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF MIAMI, FLORIDA, AND FOR AN EXPRESSION OF OPINION BY THE VOTERS UPON THE QUESTION "ARE YOU IN FAVOR OF THE USE OF DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME IN THE CITY OF MIAMI?"

WHEREAS, the returns of Inspectors and Clerks of the regular election held November 25th, 1947, have been delivered to the Commission; and WHEREAS, the Commission has canvassed such returns made by said Inspectors and Clerks of Election and has determined the total number of votes cast at such election for each of the six candidates as shown by said returns; and on the question "Are you in favof of the use of Daylight Saving Time in the city of Miami?":

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That the Commission finds, and hereby declares and certifies that 42,599 ballots were cast at said election; and the following candidates received the number of votes set opposite their respective names, to wit:

 James A. Dunn
 17,006

 Ralph B. Ferguson
 10,878

 Robert L. Floyd
 29,193

 Fred W. Hosea
 11,543

 H. Leslie Quigg
 18,091

Section 2. That it is hereby certified and declared that Wm. W. Charles, Robert L. Floyd and H. Leslie Quigg were duly elected Commissioners of the City of Miami, Florida, at said election; and that of the three Commissioners so elected Wm. W. Charles and Robert L. Floyd received the highest number of votes and were elected to hold office for a term of four (4) years, and H. Leslie Quigg was elected to hold office for a term of two (2) years; and that the election was fairly held according to the provisions of law.

Section 3. That on the question:

Are you in favor of the use of Daylight Saving Time in the City of Miami?

there were 14,132 votes cast "yes" and 12,850 votes cast "No".

Section 4. That the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to perform any and all incidental duties in connection herewith as required by law.

Upon being seconded by Mr. Thomson, the resolution was passed and adopted by the following vote - AYES: Messrs. Dunn, Gardner, Hosea, Palmer, Thomson. NOES: None.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Commission at this meeting, on motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 2:24 o'clock P.M.
