Minutes of January 7, 1915, read and approved.

The matter of advertising for sale 10,000 acres of land in Palm Beach and Lee Counties was considered, and the Secretary was instructed to advertise the same for five consecutive weeks in a paper published in Palm Beach County and in a paper published in Lee County, as required by law.

Mr. Luning read a letter from Mr. T. J. Champion, of Chicago, Illinois, relative to an agreement made by the Trustees and said Champion for the sale of a certain tract of land, to-wit: $E \frac{1}{2}$ of Section 28, Township 43 South, Range 35 East, in Palm Beach County, March 16, 1914, in which he requested said Trustees to make an agreement conveying the Lake Front under certain 1 strictions and conditions;

Whereupon the following agreement was entered into:

THIS AGREEMENT, Made and entered into this 9th day of January, 1915, by and between Park Trammell, Governor; W. V. Knott, Comptroller; T. F. West, Attorhney General; J. C. Luning, State Treasurer; and W. A. McRae, Commissioner of Agriculture, of the State of Florida, composing the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida, parties of the first part, and T. J. Champion of the City of Chicago, County of Cook and State of Illinois, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, A certain agreement was heretofore entered into on March 16th, 1914, by and between the same parties regarding the purchase by the second party of the East Half of Section 28, Township 43 South, Range 35 East, in Palm Beach County, Florida, recorded on the 9th day of June, 1914, in Book 59 of Deeds, on page 176, and which said agreement is hereby referred to and hereby made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, The first parties now desire to retain an easement for a boulevard across said land near the shore of Lake Okeechobee; and

WHEREAS, Under the aforesaid agreement of March 16th a question has arisen as to the conveyance to the second party of the land between the waters of Lake Okeechobee and the meander line shown on the plat hereto attached marked "Exhibit A";

NOW THEREFORE, In consideration of the mutual promises and of payments heretofore made and hereafter to be made, and of other good and valuable considerations, the receipt of which is hereby confessed by all the parties hereto, the first parties agree that they will, upon the completion of the payments to be made by the second party in accordance with, and as provided by the aforesaid agreement of March 16th, convey to the second party all of the land in the East Half of Section 28 aforesaid, up to the waters of Lake Okeechobee, the quantity of land to be considered as 132.11 acres.

The second party hereby agrees that the first parties may reserve in the aforesaid conveyance an easement for a public boulevard, not to exceed 80 feet in width, across the East Half of Section 28 aforesaid, near the shore of Lake Okeechobee, and four rights-of-way, each 30 feet wide, as openings from the said boulevard to said Lake, one of which shall have as its Eastern boundary the East

line of said Half Section, one of which shall have as its Western boundary the West line of said Half Section, and the other two to be situated at such places along said boulevard as the second party may select. This boulevard is to be located as follows: The North and South boundaries shall be parallel to the meander line along said Lake Shore, as shown by a plat of Lots 1 and 2. Section 28 aforesaid, dated at the office of the Chief Drainage Engineer, Tallahassee, Florida, September 26th, 1914, hereto attached marked "Exhibit A" and hereby made a part hereof, the North line of the boulevard being 20 feet distant Northly from, and the South line 60 feet distant Southerly from said meander line-the entire acreage of this boulevard to be considered as 7.48 acres, in payment of which the first parties agree to allow the second party to deduct from its final payment as provided in the aforesaid agreement of March 16th, the sum of Seven Hundred Forty-eight Dollars (\$748) and the accrued interest thereon.

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The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The construction of the Florida Coast Line Canal was authorized by law of the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, The said Florida Coast Line Canal has now been fully completed in accordance with the conditions and provisions of the law; and

WHEREAS, Under Section 3 of Chapter 3995, of the Laws of Florida, it was and is made obligatory that the Florida Coast Line Canal and Transportation Company, owners of the said canal, shall maintain the same according to certain dimensions; and

WHEREAS, Under Section 12 of Chapter 1639, of the Laws of Florida, "The President and Directors of any canal or navigation company are authorized to agree upon such rates of toll for the use of such navigation as they may deem reasonable and as shall be approved by Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund, etc. ;" and

WHEREAS, In December 12, 1913, a schedule of tol's was submitted by the said Company and was approved

by the Trustees, till their further order, and later complaints having been made to the Trustees from various sources along waterway that the canal, South of the Haulover, was, in places, not in proper usable condition, and praying the temporary suspension of tolls on that portion of the said canal till the said canal shall have been restored to good condition. And the Trustees having on January 17, 1914, given due notice of a public hearing to be conducted for the purpose of considering the temporary suspension of tolls on the canal, and further, on January 26, 1914, the said hearing having been conducted and the Canal Company and complainants heard, it was

ORDERED, By the Trustees that tolls on the canal South of the Haulover should be temporarily suspended till such time as the canal shall have been placed in good condition by the said company; and

WHEREAS, The work of restoring the said canal to a depth of five (5) feet and a width of fifty (50) feet has been accomplished, and the Canal Company has, under date of January 15, 1915, made request to be authorized to restore the three tolls South of the Haulover, and to place in effect a new rate of toll; it was

RESOLVED, By the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund that it is the opinion of this Body that the Florida Coast Line Canal and Transportation Company is obligated by law to maintain the said canal; that the law has authorized the said company to levy tolls on the said canal; that it is the purpose of the said tolls to enable the said Company to maintain the said canal by means of revenue derived from tolls as far as may be; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the said Florida Coast Line Canal and Transportation Company be and the same are hereby authorized to restore the three chains heretofore, on the 26th day of January, A. D. 1914, ordered temporarily discontinued, and that the rates of toll approved by this Body on December 12, A. D. 1913; be restored and continued in full force and effect until further action by the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That it is the opinion of the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund that the regulation of toll rates on the Florida Coast Line Canal properly comes under the jurisdiction of the State Railroad Commissioners; and that they do hereby recommend that the said Trustees be relieved of their powers and duties in regard to tolls, and that the same be by legislative enactment vested in the said Railroad Commissioners of the State of Florida.

SATISFACTION OF MORTGAGE: WHEREAS. Heretofore, to-wit, on the 28th day of November, A. D. 1914, Richard J. WHEREAS, Said described land, to-wit: Section Twenty-four (24), in Township Forty-five (45) South, Range Thirty-seven (37) East; and Section Nine (9), in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-seven (37) East, was, by error, of the said Bolles and the said Trustees, included in said deed of mortgage; and

WHEREAS, The said Bolles and the said Trustees desire to release said Sections of land from the lien of said mortgage;

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That in order to correct said error and to release the said Sections of land from the lien of said mortgage, and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida in hand paid by the said Richard J. Bolles, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Sections of land, to-wit: Section Twentyfour (24), in Township Forty-five (45) South, Range Thirty-seven (37) East; and Section Nine (9), in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-seven (37) East, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, are hereby released and discharged from the lien of said mortgage and the said mortgage is hereby released as to the said Sections of land. It is expressly stipulated that the lien and effect of said mortgage upon the remainder of the lands therein described shall not be waived, modified or affected by this release, but shall continue in full force and effect thereon.

A communication from Capt. R. E. Rose, relative to the reclamation of the Everglades Drainage District, was read and same was ordered filed.

A communication from the Miami Board of Trade protesting against the establishment of the three toll chains in the Florida Coast Line Canal, South of the Haulover, as there were a great many yachtsmen who objected to the numerous chains, and as it was further considered by said Board of Trade a very unsatisfactory method of raising revenue for the maintenance of the canal, and had created much public dissatisfaction.

Weems, at present employed as Instrumentman, was a competent engineer and that he would like to be authorized to employ him as Assistant Engineer at such time as he needed him, at a salary of \$125.00 per month. It was agreed by the Trustees that the Chief Drainage Engineer should employ Mr. J. D. Weems as Assistant Engineer at the salary stated, when he found it necessary.

Minutes of March 6, 1915, read and approved.

The Attorney General submitted certain Articles of Agreement with the Furst-Clark Construction Company, which he had formulated, as follows:

WHEREAS, On June 25th, 1910, a contract in writing was entered into between the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund and the Board of Drainage Commissioners of the State of Florida, of the one part, and Furst-Clark Construction Company, of the other part, providing for the construction of certain drainage canals and other works in the Everglades of Florida, described and set forth in said contract and the specifications thereto an nexed; and,

WHEREAS, Subsequently by an Act of the Legislature of Florida, approved June 6th, 1913, Chapter 6456, said Board of Drainage Commissioners of the State of Florida was abolished and all its powers and duties were vested in the Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District, which is the successor in law of said Board of Drainage Commissioners of the State of Florida; and,

WHEREAS, It is desired by the parties to this contract to modify and amend in certain respects said contract of June 25th, 1910, and to provide for the construction of the St. Lucie Drainage Canal, extending from Lake Okeechobee to the South Fork of the St. Lucie River in the State of Florida, as set forth below; and,

WHEREAS, Said Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund have consented to the changes and amendments in said contract of June 25th, 1910, provided for herein:

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT, Made and entered into the 11th day of March, 1915, between the BOARD OF COMMISSION-ERS OF EVERGLADES DRAINAGE DISTRICT, a public corporation created and existing under and by virtue of said Chapter 6456, Laws of Florida, approved June 6th, 1913, party of the first part, hereinafter for convenience called the Board, and Said FURST-CLARK CON-STRUCTION COMPANY, a corporation organized and existing under the Laws of the State of New Jersey, having its principal office and place of business in the City of Baltimore, State of Maryland, party of the second part, hereinafter for convenience called the Contractor;

WITNESSES: That, in jursuance and execution of the premises above recited, and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) paid by the Board to the Contractor, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and of the mutual covenants and obligations herein contained, said Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District and said Furst-Clark Construction Company have covenanted and agreed with each other as follows:

Ι.

That the Contractor will furnish the necessary machinery, dredges, tools and labor, and, at its own cost and expense, construct a drainage canal, known as the St. Lucie Canal, extending from Lake Okeechobee to the South Fork of the St. Lucie River in the State of Florida, pursuant to and strictly in accordance with the plans and specifications for said St. Lucie Canal which are attached to and made a part of this contract, and marked Exhibits "A," "B," "C," etc., and identified by the signatures of the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Cents per cubic yard for earth excavation and Twenty Cents per cubic yard for rock excavation, as designated and set forth in such specifications, to be paid, evidenced and secured in the manner hereinafter set forth.

II.

That the Contractor will construct said St. Lucie Canai in strict accordance with said specifications, observing the width, depth, side slopes, grade of bottom, disposition of the excavated material, clearance of right-of-way, inlets for surface drainage, locks and dams, classification of material, method of doing the work and all other provisions, requirements and directions contained in said specifications.

III.

That at the option of the Contractor the said proposed canal be cut approximately one-half the specified width on the bottom, extending from the waters of Lake Okeechobee into the waters of the South Fork of the St. Lucie River, and in the event that it is decided by the Contractor to so cut the approximate one-half of said canal, as specified, then it is agreed between the parties hereto, that the cut so specified shall be made within two and one-half vears from the date hereof, and said canal shall be entirely completed, according to said contract and specifications, within four years from the date of the execution of this contract; and that the Contractor will commence work on the construction of said canal within three months from the date of this contract; and that thereafter the Contractor will continuously carry on said work at such a rate of progress as will insure the completion of the contract within the specified period of four years, as aforesaid.

It is mutually agreed that time shall be considered as the essence of this contract.

That if for any unforseen cause, beyond the control of the Board, and not due to any default on the part of the Contractor, the work on said St. Lucie Canal under this contract is suspended for a longer period than six months, and if this contract is annulled or declared inoperative by the Board before Seventy-five per cent, of said work has been completed, the reserved percentage hereinafter mentioned shall be due and payable forthwith to the Contractor with the further sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars as fixed and liquidated damages, in full settlement and satisfaction of all damages and causes of action of every kind for such suspension and abandonment; and the Contractor shall accept the said sum in full satisfaction therefor. If such suspension or annullment shall take place after Seventy-five per cent of said St. Lucie Canal has been completed, the Contractor will accept the reserved percentage due to it with the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars as fixed and liquidated damages and in full settlement and satisfaction of all damages and causes of action for such suspension or annullment. If the Contractor shall fail to complete the construction of said canal pursuant to and in accordance with this contract and such specifications within said period of four years from date hereof, then said Contractor shall pay to the Board the sum of One Hundred Dollars per day (but not exceeding the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars in the aggregate) for each and every day beyond said period of four years during which said canal shall be incomplete, as liquidated and stipulated damages for the breach of this contract and not as a penalty, and the said sum shall be received and accepted by the Board in full settlement and satisfaction of said breach.

V.

That the Contractor shall observe and fulfill all of the provisions of said specifications relating to sub-letting, and no part of said work shall be sub-let without the approval of the Board, and, if with such approval, any part of said work shall be sub-let, no sub-contract shall in any manner or respect affect the relations existing between the parties hereto, or release the Contractor from any responsibility or obligation under this contract.

VI.

That the Board will employ a competent drainage engineer, who shall have general supervision of the work and furnish to the Contractor such right-of-way for canal purposes, with necessary area for spoiling excavated materials when dredged by hydraulic method, grades, levels and lines as are necessary for the proper construction of said canal. The Board shall cause said drainage engineer to make a careful estimate each month of the amount of work done by the Contractor during the next preceding calendar month, which estimate shall show the length of canal excavated, the average width and depth, the number of cubic yards of material removed and the classification thereof, and the total cost thereof at the contract price. The Board shall thereupon, within fifteen days after such report is submitted. pay to the Contractor as herein provided, the amount shown by such report to have been earned, payment to be made, evidenced and secured in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

VII.

Until final inspection and acceptance of and payment for all of the work of cutting said canals agreed upon, no prior inspection, payment or act is to be construed as a waiver of the right of the Board to reject any defective work or material, or to require the fulfillment of any of the terms of the contract. Provided, however, that

VIII.

The Contractor shall hold and save the Board harmless from and against all and every demand or demands of any nature or kind for or on account of the use of any patented invention, article or process included in the materials hereby agreed to be furnished and work to be done by the Contractor under the provisions of this contract, and further to hold the Board harmless from and against all and every demand or demands of any nature or kind on account of any claims for personal injuries to laborers or employees employed by the said Contractor in the performance of the work contemplated and agreed upon in these Articles of Agreement.

IX.

That the parties hereto will faithfully observe, abide by and perform the various provisions, covenants and stipulations contained and set forth in the specifications hereto attached, in the manner, at the periods and within the time respectively therein provided, except only as they or either of them may be prevented by the act of God or the public enemy.

Х.

If the Contractor shall become insolvent or be declared bankrupt, or shall from any other cause in the judgment of the Drainage Engineer in charge of the work be unable to carry on the work, or if it shall make default in the due performance of this contract or if all or any of the terms, provisions and stipulations contained in this contract and said specifications or in duly proceeding with

said work at the time and in the manner provided in this contract and in said specifications (time being of the essence hereof), and the Drainage Engineer in charge shall give notice in writing of such delay or neglect, or if the Contractor shall fail to commence with the delivery of the material or the performance of the work as specified herein, or shall, in the judgment of the engineer in charge for the Board, fail to prosecute faithfully and dilligently the work in accordance with the specifications and requirements of this contract, then, in either case, the Board shall have power to annul this contract by giving thirty days notice in writing to that effect to the Contractor, and upon the giving of such notice all pavments to the Contractor under this contract shall cease, and all money or reserved percentage due or to become due thereunder shall be retained by the Board until the final completion and acceptance of the work herein stipulated to be done. And it is stipulated and agreed on behalf of the Contractor that it will in such event surrender, turn over and deliver unto the Board all of the dredges, machinery, equipment, tools, boats, appliances, material of every kind and description whatsoever then in use by the said Contractor, and the possession thereof immediately unto the Board to be used by the Board in the furtherance and completion of the work contracted for as set forth in these Articles of Agreement. the consideration for the use thereof to be considered in connection with the result of the work carried on by the Board as provided herein. And the Board shall have the right to recover from the Contractor whatever sums may be expended by the Board in completing the said contract in excess of the price herein stipulated to be paid the Contractor for completing the same, and also all cost of inspection and superintendence, including all necessary traveling expenses connected therewith, incurred by the said Board, in excess of those payable by the said Board,

during the period herein allowed for the completion of the contract by the Contractor, and the Engineer of the Board may deduct all of the above mentioned sums out of or from the money or reserved percentage retained as aforesaid; and upon the giving of the said notice the Board shall be authorized to proceed to secure the performance of the work or delivery of the materials, by contract or otherwise, at their discretion.

XI.

It is mutually agreed and covenanted by the parties hereto that further work or excavation on the Miami Canal and the South New River Canal, in accordance with the specifications of said contract bearing date of June 25th, 1910, be and the same is hereby permanently discontinued without liability to either party.

XII.

That the specifications for the construction of the North New River Canal and the Hillsborough Canal under the contract of June 25th, 1910, be abrogated and superseded, and the construction of said North New River and Hillsborough Canals be hereafter continued under the modified plans and specifications hereto attached and made a part of this contract, marked "1", "2", "3", etc., and that the North New River Canal shall be fully completed according to said modified plans and specifications and delivered to the Board within eight months and the Hillsborough Canal shall be completed according to said modified plans and specifications and delivered to the Board within twenty months from the date hereof.

XIII.

That this supplemental agreement is executed by the parties without prejudice to a correct statement of the

accounts between them in respect to any work which has been completed or performed by the Contractor under said contract of June 25th, 1910, at the time of the execution of this instrument, and that as to said work a true and just accounting shall be made between the parties as soon as practicable hereafter in respect to all work heretofore performed and a settlement reached between them and payment made as soon as practicable thereafter, except that the retainage of Fifty Thousand Dollars already in the hands of the Board shall be kept and retained by it as security for the prompt and faithful performance of this supplemental contrast by the Contractor in lieu of a bond, but nothing herein contained shall abrogate or impair the obligation of said Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund to pay the Contractor any balance found due it on such accounting.

XIV.

That all sums to become due by the Board to the Contractor under this contract shall be paid and secured in the following manner:

During the progress of the work provided for herein the Board shall pay to the Contractor, in cash, not later than the 15th day of each month, one-third of the amount actually earned by, the Contractor during the preceding calendar month, as shown by the Drainage Engineer's certificates, not to exceed, however, the sum of Seventy-five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) for or during any such month. The remainder of each such monthly estimate, as shown by the Drainage Engineer's certificate, shall be represented and evidenced by the promissory note of the Board in the form and upon the terms and secured in the manner stated in the next succeeding paragraph hereof.

That the notes to be given by the Board under this contract shall be payable on or before at maker's option one year from their respective dates of issue, and shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, payable annually. Each of said notes shall contain in the face thereof a proviso that the same may be renewed by and at the option of the Board for a further period of one year from the date of its maturity, such renewal note to be upon the same terms and to bear like interest and security as the note for which it is a renewal. Each of said notes shall be in collateral form, and shall be secured by the pledge of bonds of said Board to be issued under and pursuant to the terms of Chapter 6456, Laws of Florida, approved June 6th, 1913, in principal amount or par value equal to the amount of said note. The terms, maturities and other specifications of said bonds shall conform to the provisions of the next succeeding paragraph of this contract.

XVI.

Said collateral notes shall authorize the sale of the bonds pledged as collateral to secure the same as aforesaid, upon notice, sent by registered mail, to the Board, at Tallahassee, Florida, not less than thirty days prior to any such sale. The notes shall contain the further provision that the bonds pledged as collateral thereto shall be sold so as to credit the notes with not less than ninety per cent. of the par value of said bonds and accrued interest thereon, and upon the payment of any of said notes the bonds thereto attached shall be surrendered and cancelled by the Board. The bonds herein referred to as collateral may be sold at any time at a price to be agreed upon by said Board, but in no event shall the credit on the notes be less than ninety cents on the dollar, of the par value of such bonds, with accrued interest thereon.

XV.

XVII.

The bonds to be issued by the Board which will be accepted as collateral to secure the payments of its promissory notes provided for in this contract shall be dated and be pavable thirty years thereafter. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually. Said bonds shall be in denominations of One Hundred Dollars, Five Hundred Dollars or One Thousand Dollars. each, in such proportion as may be determined by the Board. Not more than Three and a Half Million Dollars in the aggregate of the bonds authorized by Chapter 6456 shall be issued and outstanding at any one time by said Board during the life of this contract or the existence of any of the indebtedness secured by any of said bonds. The principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the State Treasurer in Tallahassee, Florida, or at a Bank or Trust Company in the City of New York, in gold coin of the present standard weight and fineness. and all of said bonds shall be issued in strict conformity with the provisions of said Chapter 6456, and said Board will adopt all resolutions and take all action which may be necessary to make the issue of said bonds legal and valid and the said bonds a binding obligation of the said Board in every respect, and shall duly execute and cause the same to be certified to by the Attorney General of the State of Florida, as provided in Chapter 6456, Laws of Florida. Said bonds shall be lithographed or engraved and prepared immediately ready for execution and delivery, as necessary for the requirements of this contract, from-time to time, to be finally executed and delivered as and in the amounts required with the notes of the Board as herein provided.

Any of said bonds so pledged may at the option of the Board be redeemed and paid on any interest payment date before the date of maturity of such bonds, upon pay-

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ment by the Board to the holder thereof, or to the Treasurer of the State of Florida for the benefit of such holder. of the principal sum thereof and all interest due thereon at the date of such redemption, together with a premium of two per cent. of the principal thereof. Such option of the Board shall be exercised and previous notice of any proposed redemption of any bond before its maturity shall be given, as required by Section 20 of Chapter 6456. Whenever the said Board shall desire to redeem any of said bonds it shall pass a resolution designating the numbers of the outstanding bonds desired to be redeemed, and shall cause a certified copy of such resolution to be delivered to the Treasurer of the State of Florida, who shall thereupon publish notice, as required by said statute, calling said bonds for redemption which are designated in said resolution. If said bonds should be registered, then a copy of said resolution and notice shall be sent to the Post Office address of the party in whose name the bonds are registered. The bonds having been so called for redemption and such notice having been duly published and given shall become due and payable on the date of redemption mentioned in said resolution, and the Board shall not be obligated to pay any interest to the holders thereof after the date mentioned for such redemption, and the Board from and after the deposit by it with the Treasurer of the State of Florida on or before the date fixed for such redemption for the benefit of holders of such bonds so called shall be privileged to consider such bonds as paid and redeemed. All such bonds and coupons so redeemed shall be forthwith cancelled and surrendered to the Board and shall not again be issued or used for any purpose whatsoever.

XVIII.

The payment of said bonds shall be provided for by the creation of a sinking fund amounting to not less than five per cent. of the amount of the drainage taxes annually levied and imposed by Chapter 6456, Laws of Florida, which amount shall be set apart and paid by the Board into the sinking fund annually out of said taxes of the District, but said Board may in its discretion increase the amount of said sinking fund at any time or from time to time. The proceeds of said sinking fund shall be applied proportionately from time to time to the retirement of the bonds so long as they may be held as collateral, under the provisions hereof; and the bonds so paid out of the proceeds of the sinking fund shall be surrendered by the holder and cancelled from time to time as the amounts received are available.

XIX.

That the Legislature shall levy annually a drainage tax on the lands described in Chapter 6456, Laws of Florida, of not less than Five Cents per acre, during the term of this contract and until all outstanding notes, obligations and bonds issued under said contract are paid and redeemed.

XX.

That in order to put the Board in funds sufficient to construct certain locks, dams and similar work in connection with the Everglades drainage operations authorized by said Chapter 6456, and in consideration of the execution of this contract by said Board, the Contractor agrees to lend to the Board not exceeding the aggregate sum of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) in amounts and installments as and when required and called for by the Board, which loan or indebtedness shall be represented and evidenced by the promissory notes of said Board to be secured by bonds of like character and description as hereinabove provided, to be accepted as security for the construction notes of said Board to the Contractor and upon the same rate or proportion of security. The notes and terms of pledge, power of sale and limitations on the amount for which said bonds may be sold and all other terms, specifications and restrictions in regard to said construction notes shall apply to the notes evidencing said loan. Said notes shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable annually, and shall contain the same privilege of renewal for not exceeding one year from date of maturity as provided and specified in this contract in respect to said construction notes. This provision of the contract is an essential part thereof, and a failure on the part of the Contractor to carry out and comply with the same shall be deemed a breach of this contract.

XXI.

Any question that may arise under the specifications or the provisions of this contract between the Board and the Contractor that they are not able to adjust, shall be submitted to a Board of Arbitration to be agreed upon by the interested parties, and the finding of such arbitors shall be binding on both parties.

XXII.

Should the Contractor be obstructed or delayed in the prosecution or completion of its work by the act, neglect, delay or default of the Board, its engineers or agents, or by any damage which may happen by fire, lightning, earthquake or cyclone, or by the abandonment of the work by the employees through no default of the Contractor, then the time herein fixed for the completion of the work shall be extended for a period equivalent to the time lost by reason of any or all of the causes aforesaid; but no such allowance shall be made, unless a claim therefor is presented in writing to the Board within thirty days of the occurrence of such delay. The duration of such extension shall be terminable and fixed by the Board, and if the parties are unable to agree, such claim shall be determined by arbitration, as herein provided.

XXIII.

It is further covenanted and agreed on behalf of the Board that these Articles of Agreement shall be binding upon the Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District, a body corporate created and existing under and by virtue of Chapter 6456, of the Laws of Florida, approved June 6th, 1913, as aforesaid, and their successors in office.

XXIV.

It is further covenanted and agreed on behalf of the Contractor that these Articles of Agreement shall be binding upon the said Furst-Clark Construction Company, as aforesaid, and its successors and assigns.

These Articles of Agreement executed in duplicate.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, The Board has caused its name to be subscribed and its official seal affixed hereto by and under a resolution and authority duly adopted by said Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District, as aforesaid; and that the due execution thereof and the affixing of the corporate seal thereto to be attested by the Secretary of the Board. And the party of the second part has hereunto subscribed its corporate name by its duly authorized officer and affixed its corporate seal under resolution duly authorizing the execution of said contract by the Board of Directors at an authorized meeting thereof of the said Furst-Clark Construction Company, the corporation aforesaid, the day and year first above set forth.

The matter of deeding the Miami Land and Development Company, (Messrs. Tatum Bros.) of Dade County, certain lands in Dade County as per minutes of October 24th, 1914, and later the Trustees made a proposition to deed Sections 28 and 33, Township 57 S. Range 40 E., in lieu of Section 31, Township 57, S. Range 40 E.; and

WHEREAS, Said Tatum Bros. in a letter dated April 1st 1915, decided to accept Sections 28 and 33, Township 57 S. Range 40 E.,

IT WAS ORDERED, That an agreement be made grant, ing said Trustees and Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District of the State of Florida the right to use the canals now constructed and in course of construction by the Miami Land and Development Company for drainage purposes by entering said canals with ditches, drains, etc., and upon the execution of the said agreement by the Miami Land and Development Company, deed would be issued the said Company for the above described lands.

The Chief Drainage Engineer reported that the motorcycle owned and used by Asst. Engr. Glenn V. Scott was worn out, and recommended the purchase of one by the Board to be used in the engineering work in the Glades, whereupon it was ordered that a motorcycle be purchased.

The Chief Drainage Engineer was instructed to dispose of an old house boat used in the Deerfield Canal, also an old pile driving outfit used in lock construction.

Hon. T. F. West, the Attorney General, presented the form of final decree and stipulation covering the agreement of settlement in the case of Palgrove Company vs. Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District et al, also a copy of proposed stipulation that William F. Maloney, as Tax Collector of Monroe County, be made a party defendant in place of Theodore A. Sweeting, together with a letter showing that the amount agreed to be paid by the complainants to the Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District is on deposit with the First National Bank, of Tallahassee, to be paid over to the Board when the final decree is entered. The final decree and stipulation were read, and the Attorney General was directed to sign the stipulation as Attorney for and on behalf of the defendants, and thus close and dispose of the matter.

The Chief Drainage Engineer reported relative to the marsh and tidal lands owned by the State in Township 55 South, Range 41 East. The report was read and ordered filed. The Trustees having received application from Shutts, Smith and Bowen for the purchase of said lands, it was unanimously decided that this land was held as the property of the State by right of sovereignty and that the said Trustees had no right to dispose of the same, and the Secretary was instructed to so inform Messrs. Shutts, Smith and Bowen.

CONTRACT.

The First Party: Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund, Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District.

The Second Party: Palm Beach Everglades Railroad Company.

WHEREAS, Under Chapter 6456, Laws of Florida, the Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District of Florida, composed of Park Trammell, Governor; W. V. Knott, Comptroller; J. C. Luning, Treasurer; T. F. West, Attorney General, and W. A. McRae, Commissioner of Agriculture, and their successors in office, was created and vested with certain authority pertaining to the construction of, maintenance and protection of canals, drainage ditches, levees and other works; and,

WHEREAS, The Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida, also composed of Park Trammell, Governor; W. V. Knott, Comptroller; J. C. Luning, Treasurer; T. F. West, Attorney General, and W A. McRae, Commissioner of Agriculture, and their successors in office, are the owners of certain rights-of-way of certain lands in the Everglades Drainage District of Florida, and are vested by law with certain authority relative to said lands; and,

WHEREAS, The Palm Beach Everglades Railroad Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Florida, proposes to construct a certain railroad, a part of which shall pass through a portion of the Everglades; and,

WHEREAS. The said Railway Company has made application to the Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District and to the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund for the construction of a railroad along the bank or banks of a certain canal or canals in the said Everglades, and has further made application to acquire such right-of-way and the use of such spoil banks of the canal or canals as may be necessary for the construction of the said railroad, and for right-of-way through lands belonging to the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund, and for the purchase and acquirement from the said Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund certain lands in the Everglades Drainage District;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS AGREEMENT, Entered into this 9th day of April, A. D. 1915, by and between the Board of Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District of the State of Florida and the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida, hereinafter jointly called the Board, and the Palm Beach Everglades Railroad Company, hereinafter called the Company, in consideration of the premises and of One Dollar (\$1.00) paid each to the other, the receipt of which is hereby ac knowledged, agree as follows:

That for and in consideration of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per mile, to be paid to the Board by the Company, the Board agrees to convey to the said Company all of its interest in that portion of the right-of-way along the North side of the West Palm Beach Canal described as a strip lying parallel to and twenty feet from the North edge of the Canal, extending to the North side of the Canal right-of-way, beginning at or near the West Shore of Lake Clark and extending Westward along the said

l. ati Canal to its intersection with the Range Line between Ranges 39 and 40 East of Tallahassee Meridian, and the use of the spoil bank of the said Canal on the North side thereof between the West Shore of Lake Clark and the above named Range Line, upon the conditions hereinafter named. The Board specifically reserves a strip of land twenty (20) feet wide and contiguous to the said Canal between the North edge of the Canal and the South line of the right-of-way herein agreed to be granted.

2.

The Board further agrees to convey to the said Company, without cost to the Company, a right-of-way not exceeding one hundred feet in width, through such lands as are owned by the said Board, situated along the route of the railroad which shall hereafter be determined and filed, as provided by law, with the Secretary of State.

The Board further agrees to permit the crossing by the said railroad of such canal or canals, ditches or drains, as may lie across or within its route, in accordance with certain conditions to be hereinafter named.

3

The Board further agrees that for the purpose of constructing and maintaining any portion of its road between the points named, the Company shall have the right to remove material from the spoil bank on the side next the canal covered by the right-of-way, and may move and transport the same to such place or places where there may be a deficiency of material for constructing the said roadbed, provided that the spoil bank shall not be so weakened by such removal of material as to endanger its usefulness as a protective dyke to the canal.

The Board further agrees to sell and convey to the said Company the following described lands, to-wit:

4.

All of Sections Twenty-three (23), Twenty-seven (27) and Thirty-five (35) in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-nine (39) East.

All of Section Seven (7) in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Forty (40) East.

All of Section Thirty-one (31) in Township Forty-three (43) South, Range Thirty-nine (39) East.

All of Sections Thirty-one (31) and Thirty-five (35) in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-five (35) East.

All of Sections Seven (7), Nineteen (19), Twenty-three (23), Twenty-seven (27), Thirty-one (31) and Thirty-five (35) in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-four (34) East.

All of Sections Thirteen (13) and Twenty-five (25), in Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-three (33) East.

All of Section Eleven (11) in Township Forty-five (45) South, Range Thirty-five (35) East.

All of the foregoing described lands lying and being in the Counties of Lee and Palm Beach and containing ten thousand two hundred and forty (10,240) acres, more or less, the same having been duly advertised as provided by law, for and in consideration of the sum of ten Dollars (\$10.00) per acre, the same being the best price bid for the said land, to be paid by the said Company to the said Board on or before the first day of March, 1917, in accordance with certain conditions hereinafter named.

5.

The Company hereby agrees to build and construct at its own cost and expense a railroad of standard gauge and of steel rails weighing not less than sixty pounds per linear yard, equipped with standard rolling stock, extending from and connecting with the Florida East Coast Railroad at or near West Palm Beach, Florida, thence to the West Palm Beach Canal near the West Shore of Lake Clark, thence on and along the right-of-way hereinbefore provided, by a route to be hereafter exactly determined, with the Western terminal of the said road at or near the Eastern end of the Caloosahatchee Canal or near Lake Hicpochee.

6.

The Company further agrees that in the construction of the said road through that portion of the Everglades not adjacent to a canal or canals the excavation which it may make for the purpose of building a roadbed will be dug connectedly so as to form a canal or ditch as far as the same may be practicable, and that the Board shall have the right to use and improve the said ditch or ditches provided for the purpose of converting the same into a canal and of maintaining and protecting the same.

7.

The Company further agrees that where the roadbed follows the bank of a canal the center line of the road shall be not nearer the edge of the canal than thirty-five (35) feet, except in such special cases as may be necessary for approaching or crossing a canal or for constructing a spur or siding at a landing or slip, and that such special case shall be the subject of a permit from the Board.

8.

The Company further agrees that in making use of and preparing the spoil bank of the canal for a roadbed, the same shall be done by widening the spoil bank toward the side away from the canal, and any material moved in building said roadbed shall be done in such manner that it shall not be placed nearer the canal than its natural position in the spoil bank, and that the berm shall not be lessened or encroached upon.

The Company further agrees to construct at each point where the railroad crosses a canal a steel bridge of some practicable draw type; that the net clearance between the abutments of the said bridge or bridges shall be not less than thirty-six (36) feet across the West Palm Beach Canal, the Hillsborough Canal and the Miami Canal and shall not be less than fifty (50) feet across the North New River Canal, and that should the railroad be constructed across the Caloosahatchee Canal the net clearance between abutments shall not be less than fifty (50) feet; that the overhead clearance of the lowest member of the bridge or bridges shall not be less than eight (8) feet above the normal ground surface at the location of the bridge; that the operation of the draw bridge or bridges shall be in accordance with the pilot rules of the United States as applying to draw bridges crossing navigable waterways; that the said bridge or bridges shall be constructed in accordance with plans to be approved by the Chief Drainage Engineer of the Board; that the Board shall have the right to pass its dredges or other vessels, or those under its control, through any of the said railroad bridges at any time without cost to the Board; that should other canals be constructed across or under the said railroad at any time by the Board the Company agrees to provide suitable bridges at such crossings with out cost to the Board

10.

The Company further agrees that in the event of wreck or accident to any of its rolling stock, plant or other railroad property along any canal resulting in the falling of objects or material into the canal causing an obstruction therein, it will promptly remove such objects or obstruction from the canal.

11.

The Company further agrees to pay to the Board the purchase price of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per mile for each mile of spoil bank on the West Palm Beach Canal, which may be used by the said Company for its roadbed in not less than ninety (90) days from date hereof, and that actual work of construction shall begin not less than six (6) months from the date hereof, and be prosecuted continuously until the work of construction on the said road shall have been completed; and that the said railroad shall have been completed and shall be in operation within not less than two (2) years from the date hereof.

12.

It is hereby mutually agreed that the right which the Board hereby agrees to convey to the said Company shall be an easement for the purpose of occupying the said land with the said railroad and with such other works and appurtenances as may be necessary and needful in and about the construction, operation and maintenance of the said railroad so long as the said road shall exist and operate, but in the event of failure of the Company to construct the said road, and to begin operation of the said road, or the becoming of the same inoperative from any cause, the right-of-way granted to the said Company shall revert to the said Board with all the rights and privileges which the Board had granted to the Company.

It is further mutually agreed that the right-of-way herein agreed to be granted shall not be exclusive, but that similar rights for other purposes may be hereafter granted to other companies or individuals, provided that such subsequent grants shall not interfere with the enjoyment of the rights herein agreed to.

14.

It is further mutually agreed that the Board reserves the right to use the land granted as right-of-way for the purpose of depositing excavated material from the canal and may use the said strip in such manner as in the judgment of the Board may be necessary for the protection, preservation, maintenance and improvement of the canal, provided that such shall not injure the said road or its roadbed, nor interfere with the operation or maintenance of the same.

15.

It is agreed that time shall be of the essence of this contract, and that if either of the parties hereto shall fail to perform in the manner stated and within the time herein prescribed any one or more of the covenants, conditions, or obligations imposed or prescribed herein, then, and in that case, this contract shall become void, all rights hereunder shall cease and immediately terminate, and all property or property rights granted herein or agreed to be granted by the said Board shall immediately revert to the grantor.

IT IS FURTHER MUTUALLY AGREED That this agreement shall be binding upon the successors and assigns of both parties hereto.

Otis, it was ordered that deed be issued The Hillsboro Canal Land Company for the above described property by the Honorable Commissioner of Agriculture.

Application having been made to the Trustees by a Committee from the Miami Chamber of Commerce to aid the County of Dade in locating and constructing hard surfaced roads within said County along the routes of certain canals in the Drainage District, the following agreement was made and entered into with the Board of County Commissioners of Dade County:

THIS AGREEMENT Made and entered into on this 8th day of July, A. D. 1915, by and between Park Trammell, Governor, W. V. Knott, Comptroller, J. C. Luning, State Treasurer, T. F. West, Attorney General, and W. A. McRae, Commissioner of Agriculture, as Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the "Trustees," and the Board of County Commissioners of Dade County, State of Florida, hereinafter called the "Board;"

WITNESSETH, That for the purpose of aiding the County of Dade in locating and constructing hard surfaced roads within the said County along the routes of the certain drainage canals known and designated as the "Miami Canal" and the "South New River Canal," The Trustees do hereby give and grant unto the said Board the privilege of locating and constructing upon any lands owned by the Trustees hard surfaced roads on the east side of the Miami Canal and upon the south

side of the South New River Canal, with the express understanding and agreement that the said hard surfaced roads shall not be located and constructed, or any part thereof located and constructed within sixty feet of the outer edge of the east side of the Miami Canal, or the south side of the South New River Canal, but that the boundary of the right-of-way of the said hard surfaced roads nearest to the said canals shall be sixty feet from the outer edge of the said canals and the rightof-way of such roads shall not extend a distance exceeding thirty feet from said sixty feet from the outer edge of said canal banks at any point along the said banks.

The Board of County Commissioners shall have a right to excavate a ditch parallelling said hard surfaced roads on the outer edge for drainage purposes should they deem the same necessary.

That for the purpose of aiding in the construction of the proposed hard surfaced roadways, the Trustees relinquish to the said Board whatever right the Trustees may have to one-half of the material excavated from the said canal and deposited on the side of the canals upon which the proposed roads are located. Provided, however, that in case one-half the material shall not be sufficient the Board may have the privilege of taking such additional amounts owned by the Trustees as may be required to construct the said hard surfaced roadways. Provided further, that at no one point or place shall more than two-thirds of the rock or material be taken or removed.

It being understood that a representative of the Trustees shall be the judge of the amount of material that is being used by the said Board and that the amount used shall not exceed one-half of the entire material deposited upon the sides of the canals next to the roads except as provided above. That the material handled by the Board shall be handled in such manner as not to damage the said canals or the right-of-way thereof, and if the Trustees or their representatives disapprove of the manner of handling the said material then the Board shall have it handled in a manner satisfactory to the Trustees. It is also understood and agreed that the Trustees shall retain the right in constructing or maintaining said canal or canals to deposit material excavated therefrom in the usual manner, and that the presence of the road shall not require the Trustees to take extraordinary measure in depositing material excavated from said canal or canals.

That the Board agrees and promises that they will at the expense of the County of Dade, build and construct the said roads along the said canals within Dade County; that they will place good substantial bridges over all lateral canals, ditches and openings across which the said roads may cross at the time of their construction and over those that may be excavated by the Trustees, or their authority, after the construction of said roads; and that said bridges shall be so constructed as to allow a clearance of at least six feet above water levels of said lateral canals or ditches. Provided, that the Board shall begin the construction of said roads within six (6) months and shall complete them as expeditiously as practicable.

That the Trustees reserve to themselves the right to excavate lateral canals, ditches and openings across the said hard surfaced roads at any time they may desire and that the expense of repairing the said roads and constructing bridges across or over such canals or ditches shall be paid by Dade County, through its Board of County Commissioners, said bridges to be constructed as above designated. It being expressly understood and agreed that the Board does not agree to construct or maintain any draw bridges across any of the lateral ditches or canals. Mr. Bryan Jennings appeared before the Trustees relative to the exchange of certain lands owned by the Southern States Land and Timber Company for certain lands of the Trustees, which was taken under consideration.

Upon motion, Attorney General West was instructed to employ Dillon, Thompson and Clay, of New York, as Attorneys to confer with the Trustees relative to the validity of the present drainage law and the bonds to be issued under said Act, being Chapter 6957 of the Laws of Florida of 1915.

The Secretary presented a letter from R. M. Price, President of the Miami Bank and Trust Company, requesting the Trustees to advance them, as Receiver for Johnson and Company, \$3,000.00 of the retainage now held by said Trustees, and, after discussion, upon vote of Governor Trammell and Mr. Luning, it was ordered that \$3,000.00 be loaned the said Receiver from the retainage, same to be returned by an additional retainage of 10% from the monthly estimates for work on the West Palm Beach Canal as soon as the former advance of \$3,000.00 from the retainage made February 23rd, 1915, had been credited upon the said retainage.

The Chief Drainage Engineer reported that the bills submitted by George F. Miles, Dredging Contractor, for moving the dredge "South Carolina" from St. Augustine to Fort Lauderdale, were incurred on account of shouls in the Florida Coast Line Canal, there having been certain places in the said canal where the dredge had to dig a passage on account of the depth being less than five feet; whereupon the Chief Drainage Engineer was authorized to make a bill for the additional cost on account of said excavation for presentation to the Florida Coast Line Canal and Transportation Company for payment.

Minutes of July 14, 1915, read and approved.

Mr. S. B. Jennings appeared before the Trustees and submitted a proposition drawn by Hon. W. S. Jennings, of which the following is a brief outline:

About the first of May last certain negotiations were pending between a Mr. Adams and Mr. Moore for the purchase of 16,000 acres of land situated in Township 44 South, of Range 38 East, comprising that part of the Township lying North of the Hillsborough Canal. At that time Mr. Adams was under the impression that Mr. Moore had title or contracts authorizing a conveyance of said lands, but such not being the case, and as Mr. Moore is a very worthy citizen to have interest himself in the Everglades, and the purpose for which he wants the land, to-wit, that of planting a fibre in the Everglades which he has tested sufficiently to be assured of its success as an enterprise, Mr. Adams having made four trips to the Orient for seed and having expended upwards of \$75,000.00 in experiments, and if he can secure these lands it is his purpose to establish this enterprise on said lands, all being of great advantage to the Everglades section. A large part of these lands are owned by the Southern States Land and Timber Company, and the same can be purchased at \$5.00 per acre, the price which Mr. Adams is willing to pay. If your Board will exchange the Sections of land that you own in this area with the Southern States Land and Timber Company for an equal acreage, also if the School Board will exchange Section 16 in Township 44, Range 38, thereby blocking up the lands desired by Mr. Adams, also the lands of the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund. If Mr. Adams can procure this particular land, which has no specially enhanced value over lands offered in exchange for same, he will establish this fibre enterprise which will require the expenditure of several hundred thousand dollars in the next few years.

After due consideration of the proposition, as outlined above, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, The Southern States Land and Timber Company, a corporation, proposes to make an exchange with the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund and the State Board of Education of certain lands owned by said Company and lying and being in Palm Beach County, Florida, for certain other lands in said County owned by said Trustees and the State Board of Education; and WHEREAS, The said Trustees are willing to make such exchange and find the lands which are to be conveyed to them to be of equal value to the lands which are to be conveyed to said Company, and such exchange being desirable in order to make more compact the bodies of land owned and held by each of the parties hereto, therefore be it

RESOLVED. That the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund do convey by deed, in the usual form, to the Southern States Land and Timber Company, a corporation, or its order, the following described lands, to-wit: All Sections 3, 9, 11, 15, 17, 21, 23, and that part of Section 33 estimated at eighty (80) acres, lying north and east of the Hillsborough Canal, in Township 44 South, of Range 38 East, containing 4,560 acres, more or less, and that in exchange therefor the Trustees do accept from the said Southern States Land and Timber Company a warranty deed, in the usual form, to the following described lands, to-wit: Section 32 in Township 44 South, Range 38 East, also Sections 4, 6, 8, 18, 20, 28, 30 and 32, containing 5,760 acres, more or less. It being understood that the State Board of Education shall also convey by deed, in the usual form, to said Southern States Land and Timber Company the following described land, to-wit: Section 16, in Township 44 South, Range 38 East, containing 640 acres, more or less, and that the said Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund, upon receipt by them of the deed herein referred to from the Southern States Land and Timber Company, shall convey to the State Board of Education the following described land, to-wit: Section 15 in Township 45 South of Range 37 East, containing 640 acres, more or less, the result of said exchange being that the said Board receives 560 acres in excess of that conveyed by the said Trustees.

Minutes of August 23, 1915, read and approved.

The Board met from adjourned meeting of August 23rd for the purpose of considering bids on three locks and dams, in accordance with advertisements for opening said bids as published in the Engineering News, Engineering Record, Manufacturers Record and Engineering and Contracting. A letter was submitted by the Chief Drainage Engineer of August 25th stating that the standing bid of the Savannah Engineering and Construction Company was the only one received in response to the advertisement for bids under the proposed plan of payment for construction on the basis of one-half cash and one-half in bonds of the Everglades Drainage District.

On examination and comparison of the prices submitted by the aforesaid Company, it appeared that the same com-

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pared favorably with prices heretofore submitted by other parties under former advertisements for locks, and the Board therefore decided to award the construction of the three locks and dams, to-wit: The North New River Canal Lock and Dam, the Hillsboro Canal Lock and Dam, and the Caloosahatchee Canal Lock and Dam to the aforesaid Savannah Engineering and Construction Company, and directed the Chief Drainage Engineer to forward copies of the contract, plans and specifications heretofore approved by the Board to the said Company for final acceptance and execution.

Messrs. Jaudon and Highleyman of Dade County appeared before the Board and presented the following communication from the Board of County Commissioners of Dade County:

"Miami, Florida, August 14, 1915.

Honorable Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund and Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District, of the State of Florida:

Gentlemen—We would respectfully call your attention to the partial report of the surveying party into the Everglades west of Miami, which has been received and accepted by us. This Board has, by resolution, appointed R. E. McDonald, L. T. Highleyman and J. F. Jaudon, to be known as Miami-Marco Road and Canal Commission, to—

1st. Circulate a petition for the creation of a Special Road and Bridge Tax District in Dade County to embrace the lands adjacent to line of proposed road and canal west from Miami, to determine whether or not bonds, in the sum of \$275,000.00, shall be issued for the construction of a road from Miami west to the Lee County line and such other roads as are necessary in this Special Road and Bridge Tax District (and the construction of these roads will necessitate the digging of canals parallel thereto).

2nd. Immediately prepare drawings and plates of proposed roads and canals in such Special Road and Bridge Tax District, and circulate blanks and receive subscriptions from the owners of lands lying adjacent to the proposed roads and canals, for funds with which to promote the work.

3rd. Present facts and figures to the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund and Commissioners of Everglades Drainage District of Florida, to the end that you either apply \$250,000.00 of the proposed bond issue on the Everglades Drainage District as authorized by the Legislature of 1915, or the proceeds thereof, or in case neither of these be possible that you place a minimum price on lands owned by you adjacent to the proposed road and canal, aggregating a value of \$250,000.00, the proceeds thereof to be used on this project, and that the Commission appointed by this Board be authorized to circulate a subscription for the sale of these lands at the price and on the terms named by you.

We wish to assure you, as representatives of Dade County, that we are in accord with the movement to construct this road and canal and it is our opinion that more actual drainage and greater development can be accomplished by the construction of this road and canal than any like expenditure in any other section of the Everglades Drainage District. We would respectfully ask that your Honorable Board give this Commission your support, and adopt either the plan of applying \$250,000.00 of the proposed bond issue, or the proceeds thereof, or set aside land to the value of \$250,000.00 adjacent to the proposed road and canal, proceeds thereof to be used in prosecution of this work.

After due consideration of the same the Chief Drainage Engineer was instructed to take up the matter from a drainage and reclamation standpoint and report to the Trustees.

The matter of a probable injunction by the War Department as to the construction of the St. Lucie Okeechobee Canal was discussed and it was deemed necessary that Hon. Park Trammell, Governor and Chairman of the Board, should proceed to Washington in the interest of said Board.

It was deemed necessary for the Attorney General, Hon. T. F. West, to consult with Messrs. Dillon, Thompson and Clay, of New York, relative to certain drainage bonds, notes, etc., and he was unanimously requested to proceed to New York in the interests of the Trustees.

L'Engle appeared before the Trustees relative to having the lands of the Florida Everglades Land Company located in Lee County, in Townships 43, 44, 45, 46 and 47 South of Range 33, 34 and 37 East, surveyed, and stated that said Land Company was willing to advance the money for said survey under the same arrangements as formerly provided in a resolution of the Trustees under date of September 21, 1914. Whereupon it was agreed by the Trustees that the matter be referred to the Chief Drainage Engineer for an estimate of the cost of said survey, and that upon report from the Engineer further action would be taken in the matter of said survey.

Hon. W. S. Jennings appeared before the Board and the matter of notes and bonds of the 1915 issue were discussed.

Afternoon Session, October 9, 1915.

Same members present.

Messrs. Jaudon, McDonald and Wilson, of Miami and Lee County, appeared before the Board and asked the Trustees to donate \$250,000.00 worth of land to aid in the construction of a canal in connection with a hard surface road to be constructed by the Counties of Dade and Lee from Miami to Marco, said Counties to bond for the sum of \$250,000.00. After discussion, upon motion of Mr. West, a recess was taken until Monday morning. Monday Morning, October 11, 1915. Same members present.

The matter of a canal and road from Miami to Marco was taken under further advisement by the Trustees. Messrs. Jaudon, McDonald and Wilson were present, and it was tentatively agreed by the members present that they would sell 20,000 acres of land, the proceeds from the sale of said land to be used in conjunction with amount of \$200,000.00 to be furnished by the Counties of Dade and Lee in building said canal, the same to be located as recommended by the Chief Drainage Engineer in the report to be made by him to the Trustees: provided, that the Counties of Dade and Lee should expend a total of \$375,000.00 in the construction of said canal and hard surface road, the construction of said canal to be under the supervision of the Chief Drainage Engineer. The representatives of the Counties did not accept the proposition submitted by the Trustees, and it was mutually agreed that the matter should be taken under further consideration at some time when a full meeting of all members of the Trustees could be present.

A telegram addressed to Hon. Park Trammell, Chairman, from Francis W. Perry, as Chairman of a Committee of Citizens of Lee County, requesting the placing of another dredge in the Caloosahatchee Canal, was read, and after due consideration the Secretary was instructed to write Mr. Perry that the Trustees did not have sufficient money on hand at present to undertake the additional expense of such work, but would be willing to consider a contract should said Committee be able to find a Contractor who would be willing to do the work at a reasonable figure and accept bonds in payment for the work.

The Miami Bank and Trust Company, Receiver for Johnson and Company, requested the Trustees to advance \$6,000.00 from the retainage on hand, said amount

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to be repaid by deducting an additional 10% from the monthly estimates. Upon motion of Governor Trammell the amount of \$5,000.00 was authorized paid said Receiver from the said retainage, same to be refunded at the rate of 10% from monthly estimates, beginning with estimate for October, and the Secretary was instructed to draw check for said amount of \$5,000.00 in favor of said Receiver.

Minutes of December 1, 1915, read and approved.

A communication from the Mayor and City Council of the City of Miami requesting the Trustees to deed them certain submerged lands across Biscayne Bay for the purpose of building a channel to deep water in accordance with plans as outlined by Mr. Isham Randolph for Harbor Development for said City of Miami was presented by Messrs. H. C. Ralston, L. T. Highleyman and Casper Hefty. After reading and discussing said communication, upon motion of Attorney General West, duly seconded, the following resoution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, It has been made known to the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund that the City of Miami has acquired at large expense to it title to the property in and on Biscayne Bay between Bay Street and Second Street to enable it to build wharves, docks, basins, channels, facilitate commerce and benefit shipping, and the State of Florida, by an Act approved June 2, 1915, and . known as Chapter 6961 of the Laws of Florida, granted to said City of Miami all of its right and title in and to the water front, riparian rights, submerged lands and soil in and under Biscayne Bay between said streets as aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, The War Department of the United States has granted to the said City the right and authority to dig a channel from the said property of said city across Biscayne Bay to what is known as the "Government Cut," and the United States has appropriated the sum of \$100,-000.00 to dig and deepen said Government Cut to connect with the said channel, which sum of money is now available for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, The said City of Miami has, under authority of its City Charter and by vote of a large majority of its qualified electors at a special election held for that purpose, authorized the issuance of \$360,000.00 City of Miami Municipal Bonds for the purpose of digging said channel, which said Bonds have been duly issued; and

WHEREAS, The United States Government has advertised for and received bids to let a contract for the digging and deepening of said Government Cut to connect with said channel, and the City of Miami has advertised for the letting of a contract to dig said channel, the said channel to be dug according to plans of Isham Randolph, Harbor Engineer, and which said plans have been approved by the War Department of the United States, and that it is greatly to the advantage and benefit of the City of Miami and of all the people on the Southeast Coast of Florida that the said docks and wharves be built and the said channels be cut; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund, insofar as they have the power and authority so to do, do consent and agree that the said City of Miami may, for the purpose of conveniently depositing the material excavated from the channel so dug, use for that purpose a strip of land upon the bottom of said Bay of Biscayne describel as follows:

A strip of submerged land in Biscayne Bay Two Hundred Fifteen (215) feet wide, located parallel with the proposed straight-away channel across Biscayne Bay. The Northerly line of the strip conveyed is Two Hundred Ninety-five (295) feet from and parallel with the center line of said proposed straight-away channel and said center line is a straight line between two points whose position is determined as follows:

The Westerly point is in Biscayne Bay in the center line of First Street produced into the Bay Two Thousand Three Hundred Fifty feet, more or less, from the intersection of said center line of First Street with the center line of the Boulevard along the Bay front, all as shown upon a map made by Isham Randolph and Company, dated October, 1915, on a scale of one inch equal to Six Hundred (600) feet, said map being attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and made a part hereof.

The Easterly point is in the center line of and at the westerly end of the channel already cut by the United States Government and known as the "Government Cut" as shown by the said Government map attached hereto, marked "Exhibit B" and made a part hereof.

The Westerly end of the strip in question is located One Thousand and Forty (1040) feet, more or less, Easterly from the Westerly point of the center line of the channel in Biscayne Bay as hereinbefore located and described.

The Easterly end of the strip hereby described is located Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty (13,720) feet, more or less, Easterly from the Westerly point of the center line of the proposed channel in Biscayne Bay as hereinbefore located and described. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That if the work of excavation and deposit of said excavated material is sufficient when completed to bring the said property within the class affected by the provisions of Chapter 6451, Acts of 1913, Laws of Florida, the Trustees shall thereupon, within a reasonable time, offer for sale the said property to the City of Miami under the provisions of said chapter, and shall give to the authorities of said city due notice of said offer; and in negotiating a sale of said property the said Trustees shall have in mind the fact that the said land is built and created by and at the expense of the City of Miami, and such expense shall be regarded by said Trustees as a part of the consideration paid by the City of Miami therefor upon a sale of said land being made as herein provided for.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in order that the said improvement be not delayed, but be expeditiously carried on, a quit claim deed for said property be made by the said Trustees to the said City of Miami.

Minutes of December 14, 1915, read and approved.

On account of the unusual press of engineering work in the field at this time, on which the regular engineering corps are engaged, the Trustees deemed it advisable to employ temporarily an additional engineer for the purpose of conducting surveys and examinations of the territory northwest of Lake Okeechobee. The Chief Drainage Engineer was authorized to employ Mr. J. B. Phinney at a salary of \$150.00 per month for the purpose of making the surveys and examinations for canal location between Lakes Istokpoga and Okeechobee.

The Chief Drainage Engineer informed the Trustees that the Contractor was beginning work on the North New River Canal lock and that it would be advisable for the Trustees to employ a competent and experienced man as their representative on Lock Construction to see that the work is properly done. Mr. C. A. Slayton, a Civil Engineer, having made application for the position and having presented satisfactory references as to his former work on concrete construction, was employed at a salary of \$125.00 per month subject to the same arrangements as for Assistant Engineers on Everglades Drainage work and was detailed on work of supervising lock construction.

The Chief Drainage Engineer was directed to prepare contract covering the survey of certain lands in the Everglades Drainage District under arrangements with the Florida Everglades Land Company as set forth in the following resolutions, which the Trustees adopted: WHEREAS, The Florida Everglades Land Company has applied to the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of Florida to have the lands of that Company in the following Townships and Ranges in Palm Beach County, Florida, to-wit:

Towaships Forty-two (42) and Forty-three (43) South, Range Thirty-seven (37) East, and in Lee County, Florida, to-wit:

Townships Forty-three (43), Forty-four (44), Fortyfive (45), Forty-six (46) and Forty-seven (47) South, Range Thirty-four (34) East; and Township Forty-four (44) South, Range Thirty-three (33) East, surveyed by said Trustees pursuant to the methods and instructions officially adopted by said Trustees for the survey of lands included in the Everglades Patent to the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, It appears that the lands of said The Florida Everglades Land Company were derived by it through deeds from the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of Florida to N. P. Bryan and P. A. Vans Agnew in satisfaction of drainage contracts heretofore entered into by said Trustees with Florida Gulf Coast Canal and Okeechobee Land Company, and that said The Florida Everglades Land Company is entitled to have its said lands in said Townships surveyed by this Board without expense to it; and

WHEREAS, It appears further that said Trustees, the State Board of Education and private persons and corporations are the owners of lands in said Townships which it will be necessary to survey at the same time in order properly to survey the lands of said The Florida Everglades Land Company; and

WHEREAS, Said Trustees are willing to assume and pay the cost of surveying all the lands in said Townships except so much thereof as may be proportionate to the

acreage of lands conveyed by said Trustees in satisfaction of said statutory railroad or canal land grants, unless it should be otherwise judicially determined as referred to below; and

WHEREAS, Said The Florida Everglades Land Company, by its representative, who has appeared before said Trustees, has offered to advance to said Trustees the total cost of said survey of said Townships, not to exceed, however, Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per mile for such survey, if said Trustees will agree to refund to said The Florida Everglades Land Company within three (3) years from the date of these resolutions, without interest, the entire cost of said survey, not exceeding Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per mile, except so much thereof as may be proportionate to the acreage of lands conveyed by said Trustees in satisfaction of statutory railroad or canal land grants as set forth below, which said Trustees shall agree to refund also if it should be determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction within said period of three (3)years that said Trustees are liable for the cost of the survev of lands conveyed by said Trustees in satisfaction of statutory railroad or canal land grants;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of Florida as follows:

1.

That said offer of said The Florida Everglades Land Company be accepted, and that said Trustees shall proceel forthwith to have all of the lands of said Company situated in the Townships hereinabove described officially surveyed in accordance with the method and instructions heretofore adopted and issued by said Trustees, and that said survey be conducted by the Chief Drainage Engineer, or other officer or agent appointed by said Trustees, under the terms and in the manner hereinafter set forth. That the entire cost of said survey, to an amount not exceeding Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per mile, shall be advanced by said The Florida Everglades Land Company to said Trustees on their monthly requisitions in sufficient amounts to meet the expenses of said survey estimated for the next ensuing month, and that all such sums so advanced by said corporation shall be used solely and exclusively by said Trustees as a trust fund for the purpose of paying the actual cost of conducting such surveys of said Townships under these resolutions, and for no other purpose.

3.

That said Trustees will reimburse and pay to the Florida Everglades Land Company, within three (3) years from date of these resolutions, without interest, the entire amount advanced and paid by said corporation for the purpose of said survey, except the proportionate cost thereof chargeable to the owners of lands conveyed by said Trustees in satisfaction of statutory railroad or canal land grants as set forth in the next succeeding paragraph of these resolutions.

4.

That the area of the lands in the Townships hereinabove described, which have been conveyed by said Trustees in satisfaction of statutory railroad or canal land grants, aggregates 16,640 acres, and that the total area of lands in said Townships aggregates 33,920 acres, and that the area of the lands conveyed in satisfaction of statutory railroad or canal land grants is forty-nine per cent. of the entire area of said Townships; therefore said Trustees will reimburse said The Florida Everglades Land Com-

pany within three years from date of these resolutions, without interest, the entire amount advanced by said corporation to the Trustees for the surveys made under these resolutions, except forty-nine per cent. of said amount, for which reimbursement shall not be made by said Trustees to said corporation unless it shall be determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction at any time within said period of three years from the date of these resolutions that said Trustees are responsible for the survey of lands in the Everglades conveyed under statutory railroad or canal land grants, in which event said Trustees will pay to said corporation the proportionate part of the cost of said survey chargeable to the lands so conveyed.

5.

That said Trustees shall proceed forthwith to let the contract for said surveys to the lowest bidder whom the Trustees shall determine to be competent, experienced and fit to conduct said work, and that such survey shall be carried on without interruption and as rapidly as possible until it shall be fully completed.

6.

That the said Trustees will enter into a contract with said corporation in regard to said surveys, pursuant to these resolutions; if such contract shall be requested by said corporation.

Said contract to be in accordance with a proposition submitted by Otis A. Hardin to the Trustees, wherein the said Hardin proposes to purchase from the Trustees the gas power tractor or survey machine at the price of \$850.00, and the making of certain reductions in the price per mile of surveys as set out in his former contract with the Trustees under date of October 14, 1914. A letter dated November 22, 1915, from Marshall Carr was read, in which claim was made for damages alleged by him to have accrued to his property in the destruction of certain crops declared by him to have had a value of \$35.00. A report relative to the subject was presented by Mr. Glenn V. Scott, Assistant Engineer, verifying the statements of Mr. Carr. The Trustees approved the claim and directed that the same be referred to the Board of Commissioners for payment in the sum of \$35.00 in complete satisfaction and settlement of said claim, in which amount claim was made.

The matter of alleged damage to the property of the Palm Beach Farms Company in Section 36, Township 47 South of Range 42 East, caused by the deposit of material from the suction dredge on the South side of the Hillsboro Canal, was presented. Upon previous correspondence and understanding with the Palm Beach Farms Company relative to adjustment of the matter by Mr. Orrin Randolph for the Company and the Chief Drainage Engineer for the Trustees, with some disinterested person as a third party, the name of Mr. R. M. Price, of Miami, was suggested as a party who would be satisfactory to the Trustees and it was directed that Mr. Price be asked to act in the capacity of arbitrator.

The dipper dredge SOUTH CAROLINA, George F. Miles, Contractor, operating on Extension of Three-Mile Canal, now being operated under the single shift plan, and the Trustees deeming it advisable to operate if possible two shifts, in order that the work may be more speedily and economically accomplished, and further in order to overcome the difficulty and uncertainty of continuous fuel supply, directed that the dredge be changed from the burning of coal and wood as fuel to the burning of oil and that all the necessary oil burning equipment be installed on the dredge at the earliest possible date, and that the double shift plan be put into operation. A letter was presented to the Trustees from R. H. Rousseau relative to matter of road construction in the Everglades. The Trustees took the matter under 'advisement.

Letter and petition from J. H. Tatum was presented to the Trustees relative to road construction along the banks of the Miami Canal and the excavation of certain material from the said Miami Canal. The matter presented by Mr. Tatum was taken under advisement by the Trustees.

The Trustees then adjourned.

Minutes of December 19, 1915, read and approved.

There were also present at this meeting Hon. F. C. Elliot, Chief Drainage Engineer, Mr. J. M. Burguirres, and Hon. E. J. L'Engle, the last two named gentlemen representing the Southern States Land and Timber Company.

Mr. Burguierres presented to the Board the propriety of organizing a sub-drainage district to embrace all of the lands in Township 42 South, Range 37 East, known as the "Pelican Bay Township," and any lands in the immediate vicinity properly a part of such sub-district, and directed the attention of the Board to the following matters in connection with the subject:

(a) Survey of the lands:

(b) Description, location and boundaries of the proposed district;

(c) Selection of Engineer and Attorney for the distriet;

(d) Method of financing the work, including means to be used by the Trustees for raising their part of the cost of the work.

As a result of the discussion, the following points were informally agreed upon:

An exact and accurate survey of the territory be-(a) ing an essential prerequisite to the organization of the district, it was agreed that Chief Drainage Engineer Elliot should proceed as rapidly as possible to have the lands in the Pelican Bay Township officially surveyed. This work is to be commenced immediately after January 1st, 1916, by a party to be sent out by the Trustees to locate United States Government corners in the vicinity, and when this is done Contractor Hardin will be transferred from his present work to the Pelican Bay district, and, taking the corners established as above, will proceed to survey the Pelican Bay Township to a completion, making a separate report thereof to the Trustees, who will thereupon confirm the same without waiting for the remainder of the work in that vicinity to be begun or completed. It was agreed that it is necessary for this work to be completed and approved before legal steps looking to the incorporation of the district can be instituted.

(b) All the lands in Township 42, Range 37, are to be included in the new district, and possibly also the West half of the Township immediately East, to-wit: 42-38. Mr. L'Engle is to advise in answer to the legal question whether it would be preferable to embrace the West half of Township 42, Range 38, in the district when first formed or to have the proceedings later amended, after the district has been organized, and thereby extend the boundaries of the district. The plan is to completely drain only the lands in the Pelican Bay Township, leaving the West half of Township 42, Range 38, to be subsequently improved, although the Range Line canals would encompass the West half of Township 42. Range 38. The point in question arises over the fact that it is not intended to do any local drainage work elsewhere than in the Pelican Bay Township; hence a question might be raised whether a part of the sub-drainage district can be completely drained and another part only partially drained.

(c) It was further understood that Mr. Elliot is to act as the Chief Engineer and Mr. L'Engle as the Attorney for the subdrainage district. Any questions of detail regarding the subdrainage district are to be referred to Attorney-General West and Chief Engineer Elliot for decision on the part of the Trustees.

(d) The money necessary to complete the drainage of the sub-drainage district, which is estimated to cost about \$4.00 an acre, is to be raised by a bond issue. Southern States Land and Timber Company offered to take its acreage proportion of these bonds. Negotiations will be had with Bryant and Greenwood to see whether they can get the purchasers from Florida Everglades Land Company to take their acreage proportion of the bonds. It seems that the Trustees own about one-fourth, the Southern States Land and Timber Company about one-half, and Bryant and Greenwood's customers a little less than one-quarter of the acreage of the Township in question. Perhaps about one Section of land is owned by other persons. The Trustees being not in funds with which to buy their proportion of the bonds and pay the flat tax, they stated that they would be willing to borrow sufficient money for that purpose, to be evidenced by their note payable on or before three years secured by pledge of their part of the sub-drainage district bonds and also by a mortgage upon all of their lands in the sub-drainage district, with the right to have partial releases of lands as sold, on an agreed basis, but without any liability on the part of the Trustees if a deficiency arises on account of the lands and bonds being insufficient to pay the debt.

(e) It is understood that this matter is contingent upon the co-operation of the Bryant and Greenwood interests, and that in the event the said Bryant and Greenwood interests do not join in the organization and carrying out of the proposed sub-drainage district, that the plan herein proposed shall be open to such further modification as may be required in order that the Trustees and the Southern States Land and Timber Company may jointly proceed with the drainage of such district, embodying their own lands, as they may agree apon.

The Trustees then adjourned.

WHEREAS, An Agreement has been made by and between the Miami Land and Development Company, a corporation organized and existing under the Laws of the State of Florida, hereinafter for convenience referred to as the Company, and Park Trammell, Governor; W. V. Knott, Comptroller; J. C. Luning, Treasurer; T. F. West, Attorney General, and W. A. McRae, Commissioner of Agriculture, as Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida, hereinafter for convenience referred to as the Board, whereby the said Company has agreed to convey to the said Board the right and privilege to use certain canals of the said Company, hereinafter described, in the drainage and reclamation of certain State land, for and in consideration of a grant and conveyance by said Board to said Company of certain lands hereinafter described.

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the Miami Land and Development Company, a corporation, in pursuance of a resolution duly passed by its Board of Directors, and for and in consideration of the sum of One DoHar, and other valuable considerations as hereinafter stated, to it in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has bargained and sold, and does hereby grant and convey unto the said Park Trammell, Governor, W. V. Knott, Comptroller, J. C. Luning, Treasurer, T. F. West, Attorney General, and W. A. McRae, Commissioner of Agriculture, as Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida, the following described land, rights and privileges, to-wit:

The right and privilege to perpetually use the canals of said Company in Dade County, Florida, heretofore excavated and constructed and hereafter to be excavated and used or to be used in its drainage operations now being carried on by said Company in said County, and especially the right to use the canal commonly called the Detroit Canal located near the town of Florida City in Township 57 South, Range 40 East, Tallahassee Meridian, leading from the town of Florida City to the Atlantic Ocean, by tapping said canal or canals with such other canals, drains, ditches or laterals as may be necessary and apropriate to coordinate the drainage work in which the State is interested in said vicinity with the drainage operations of said Company, or its successors or assigns; and the location and construction of said canals, ditches, drains and laterals so tapping the canals of said Company shall be under the direction and supervision of the Drainage Engineer in charge of the drainage work of the State, or such public board as may be carrying on said work; together with the further right to turn the waters upon the lands of the State into the canals of said Company and run such waters through said canals, to the end that the lands of the State adjacent thereto may be drained and reclaimed.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD The said land, rights and privileges unto the said grantees, and their successors, forever.

The said Hardee, Trustee, having submitted evidence of title in him and having quit claimed to the Trustees Lot 4 Sec. 26 and S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 1 of Sec. 35 all East of River in T. 11 S., R. 13 E., to further correct said error.

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING

OF THE

TRUSTEES OF I. I. FUND.

Tallahassee, Florida, December 30, 1916. Λ special meeting of the Trustees of the I. I. Fund of the State of Florida was held at 10:30 o'clock A. M. on December 30th, 1916, at the Capitol, Tallahassee, Florida. There were present at this meeting Governor Park Trammell, Comptroller W. V. Knott, Treasurer J. C. Luning, Attorney General T. F. West, Commissioner of Agriculture W. A. McRae, Chief Engineer F. C. Elliott and Secretary J. S. Lewis.

Governor Trammell acted as chairman of the meeting and Mr. Lewis as secretary.

Mr. Luning referred to the negotiations covering a period of the last year with reference to the creation of a special sub-drainage district to include the Pelican Lake territory and stated that the matter had come up before several former meetings and that no doubt all the Trustees were familiar with the plan. He stated that in order for all thoroughly to understand the plan, he would explain it in detail.

He stated that the Trustees held title in fee simple to 2,560 acres of land in the proposed territory, description of which land is hereinafter more particularly set forth in resolution recited hereinafter, and that the Trustees had agreed, with other owners of land in the proposed territory, to participate in the creation of the Pelican Lake Sub-Drainage District, to include the said lands belonging to the Trustees and all other lands in that proposed territory. The whole scheme had been discussed, and it had been concluded that this was the best plan for the draining of that territory. He further stated that the Trustees would need \$12,800.00 to participate in this plan and that the money would be used through the necessary channels for the drainage of said lands of Pelican Lake Sub-Drainage District, in which, as above stated, the Trustees held title to 2,560 acres. He said that the Trustees would use the money to take bonds of like amount of the proposed Pelican Lake Sub-Drainage District, and thus the money would be available for the Trustees of that said Drainage District to carry out their drainage projects. He also stated that in his opinion this proposition was the best one with respect to that district for carrying out their duty to drain.

He thereupon stated that arrangements had been made with J. R. Anthony, Jr., of Jacksonville, Florida, to borrow the said sum, provided that the Trustees would execute to him collateral notes to be secured by the said bonds when issued to the Trustees, and also by a first mortgage upon all of the lands aforesaid to which they had title in said district.

The matter was thoroughly discussed, and it was apparent that all thought same was for the best interest of said territory.

Thereupon Mr. West offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Trustees of the I. I. Fund deem it proper to borrow \$12,800.00 for the purpose of raising funds to continue and prosecute, and to aid in the continuance and prosecution, to final completion the canals, drains, dykes, dams, locks and reservoirs that are now in process of construction and to build and to aid in the building of such other canals, drains, dykes, dams, locks and reservoirs as in the judgment of said Trustees are necessary to drain and reclaim the following lands which are still in said Fund, in Palm Beach County, Florida, to-wit:

All Sections Three (3) and Eleven (11), in Township Forty-two (42) South, Range Thirty-seven (37) East, and

All Sections Seven (7) and Nineteen (19), in Township Forty-two (42) South, Range Thirty-eight (38) East,

Containing 2,560 acres, more or less, and being part of the swamp and overflowed lands acquired by the State of Florida under Act of Congress approved September 28th, 1850: and

WHEREAS, J. R. Anthony, Jr., has signified his willingness to lend said sum provided that the Trustees agree to the terms set forth in this resolution; therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the Trustees of the I. I. Fund do borrow of J. R. Anthony, Jr., of Jacksonville, Fla., the sum of \$12,800.00, and do execute for him five (5) collateral form notes in the sum of \$2,560.00 each; payable on or before three (3) years after date, with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, and principal and interest payable at the People's Bank of Jacksonville, Florida, said notes to be equally secured by bonds of said Pelican Lake Sub-Drainage District of the aggregate par value of \$12,800.00; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Trustees are hereby authorized and empowered, also, to execute to said J. R. Anthony, Jr., to secure said notes, a first mortgage on all of the aforesaid lands in said Pelican Lake Sub-Drāinage District in Palm Beach County, Florida, to-wit: All of Sections Three (3) and Eleven (11), in Township Forty-two (42), South Range Thirty-seven (37) East, and all Sections Seven (7) and Nineteen (19), in Township Fortytwo (42), South Range Thirty-eight (38) East, being 2,560 acres, more or less; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Trustees deliver to said Anthony, as soon as they can procure same, the aforesaid bonds of said Pelican Lake Sub-Drainage District.

This resolution was duly seconded and unanimously carried.

Thereupon the collateral notes and mortgage prepared to conclude the said transaction in accordance with the foregoing resolution were presented to the meeting and same were carefully examined and all the terms of same studied, and same were found to be in accordance with their understanding and the foregoing resolution. The said notes and mortgage were then executed in accordance with law.

Mr. Luning then moved that each of said five (5) collateral notes of \$2,560.00 each, payable to said J. R. Anthony, Jr., and the mortgage to secure the same, be each ratified and confirmed and that same be delivered to Mr. Anthony at such time that Mr. Anthony shall place to the credit of the Trustees of the I. I. Fund the sum so borrowed, and that the Trustees do proceed with all diligent speed to secure the bonds of said Pelican Lake Sub-Drainage District and deliver same to said Anthony as security for said notes in accordance with the foregoing agreement.

This motion was unanimously carried, after being duly seconded.

The meeting then adjourned sine die.
