
Flamingo Inn the Everglades National Park

And then there's the fishing!





Flamingo is right on the Gulf of Mexico, so you can take your choice of two great fishing experiences: in the open waters of Florida Bay and the Gulf, or the sheltered mangrove waters of the Everglades. Fishing boats of all sizes are available for rental, complete with native guide-captains.

Or come down in your own boat. We have a 100-slip marina that will even accommodate 100-footers. Dockside electric power and fresh water. 5 foot depth control and hoist that can handle boats up to 5,000 lb. capacity. Free launching ramp for private boats brought by trailer. And, of course, a complete line of marine supplies, from gas to groceries.


How do you like to















And there's Flamingo Inn.


Try our seafood: lobster, shrimp, pompano; delicious because it's fresh from the waters you look out on as you dine.


