# Her ideal is opportunity for all

Midge Costanza isn't pushing a new book, she has nothing to sell except her ideas. And ideals.

The tough, former aide to President Carter will speak at the Trade Center building on the North Miami Campus Saturday, April 21 at 7 p.m. Students can attend free.

One of Costanza's ideals is that everyone should have equal opportunity.

"I guess you could call me a feminist," Costanza said by telephone from Washington, D.C. "I am a person who happens to be a woman who wants the right of equal opportunity and to guarantee that right to all."

Costanza says she has an idea for a book but hasn't started writing a doesn't have a publisher. She has private sector job offers and an offer from New York Governor Hugh Carey.

So why has she been on the public lecture tour since she left the White

House?

"Time is the most valuable possession of anyone," Costanza said. "I want to use my time to emphasize the underlying need for human dignity. For the elderly, the young, the handicapped, minorities and women."

There were problems when she was trying to accomplish these goals as assistant to the president for public liaison.

She didn't quit in disgust. "I left the White House when it became apparent that my style was different from the other advisors," Costanza said.

"I was from Rochester, New York and the other advisors were from different areas, therefore there was controversy about my ability to address the issues."

She says issues were more important to her than her own self-perpetuation.

Her controversy was deserved, Costanza said. "I gave 400 press interviews in 20 months in office and all were fair. There were few slanted

stories."

Although she said it is too early to talk about 1980 presidential candidates, Costanza said she would probably support Carter if he ran.

"I will support a president I could believe in," she said.

Would she like to be the "top man" in the country?

"I like to provide leadership but I wouldn't want to be president," Costanza said. "There are men and women better qualified than me."

## Costanza happy to visit

Midge Costanza, who quit a \$56,000 a year job with the White House, lectures at North Miami Campus Saturday at 7 p.m.

The lecture is free to students and costs \$3 for non-students.

The lecture is sponsored by the School of Public Affairs, the Institute on Sexism, Campus Ministry and Student Affairs. Also sponsoring are Athalie Range, WMBM radio, the Wesley Foundation and Campbell Publications.

Costanza said she looks forward to lecturing here.

"Florida is my favorite vacation spot," she said Friday. "I had a great time when I spoke at the University of Florida."

She also said she was unaware that FIU wasn't a "flagship university" like UF.

"Tell critics of FIU to get off your back," Costanza said. "I hope I can help publicize your North Miami Campus. If we are going to have equal opportunity, we must have equal education."

"Everyone should be able to choose the type of education they want."

## City of Miami offers internships

An internship program for students who have completed two years of college or more is available to FIU students who meet established low-income requirements.

The City of Miami Career Development Intern Program, sponsored by the South Florida Employment and Training Consortium, has been especially designed to develop qualified potential employees among eligible residents, particularly women and minorities, for the City of Miami.

Providing the student with full reimbursement of tuition fees and a \$50 book allowance per quarter, the Career Development Program familiarizes interns with the workings of the municipal government and provides a formal setting in which to apply classroom training.

Undergraduate trainees earn \$4.14 an hour for a maximum of 25 hours weekly or 1,000 hours yearly, while graduate interns earn \$5.18 an hour for 30 hours per week.

Students must be enrolled for 10 credit hours per quarter to participate in the program.

The Career Development Program provides participants with an opportunity to improve professional skills, thus enhancing their employment potential with the City.

# Paper art display opens June 1

Fifty-one artists from across the United States who are working with paper are included in the exhibition "Paper as Medium" which opens June 1 at the Visual Arts Gallery.

This exhibition, organized by Jane M. Farmer for the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition is only traveling to 15 locations.

Paper used as an artists' medium has witnessed recent popularity in the United States, challenging previously held notions that it be limited to simply a support for a painting, drawing or print.

Artists are finding that they can successfully emboss, fold, tear, cut, burn, color, imbed, laminate,

puncture, cast, and otherwise manipulate paper into visual statements.

A fascinating variety of experimental techniques can be observed in this exhibition, some serious, some quite whimsical.

The main purpose of the "Paper as Medium" exhibition is to provide a national survey of recent uses of paper as an expressive medium by contemporary artists, without regard to whether it is hand or commercially-made.

Gallery hours are: Monday and Tuesday, 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.; Wednesday and Thursday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Friday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

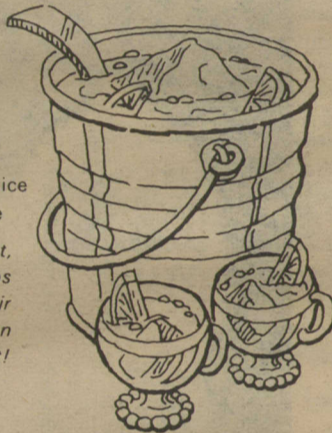

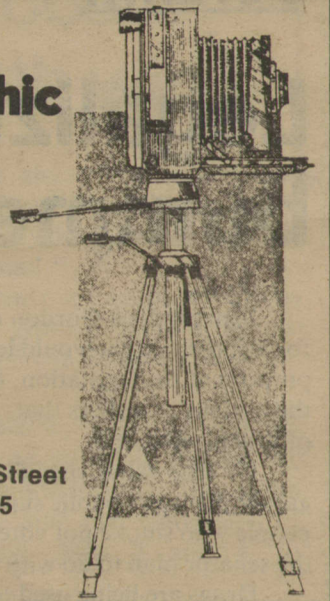

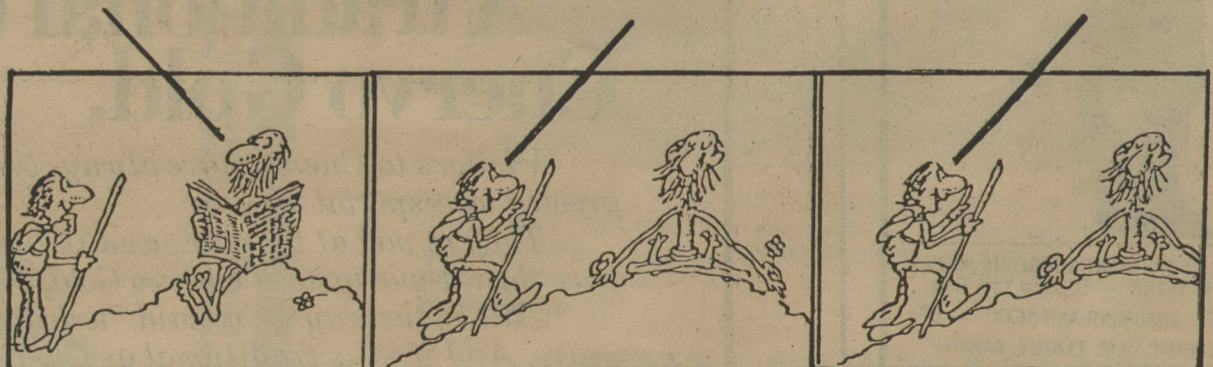

# Anita Tejon elected chair

Anita Tejon has won a tough SGA spring election to become chairperson.

Lucinda Deadmen was elected comptroller last week and Laurel Lanier is the new scribe.

The four candidates for chair were Tejon, Castellanos, Martin Verster and Albert Hoskin.

# Tennis team hits road in search of NCAA bid

The men's tennis team faces a critical road test next week when it attempts to secure its second consecutive bid to the NCAA Division II National Tennis Tournament.

The Sunblazers (7-5), winners of their last four matches, play the University of Central Florida, Florida Institute of Technology, and Rollins College, all on the road.

"Right now, the way it stands, Rollins is the No. 1 team in the state," Coach Bill Nuttal said. "It's between Central Florida and us for that No. 2 spot."

In previous years, the NCAA has selected eight players from the state of Florida (two, four-man teams) to participate in the 64-player nationals.

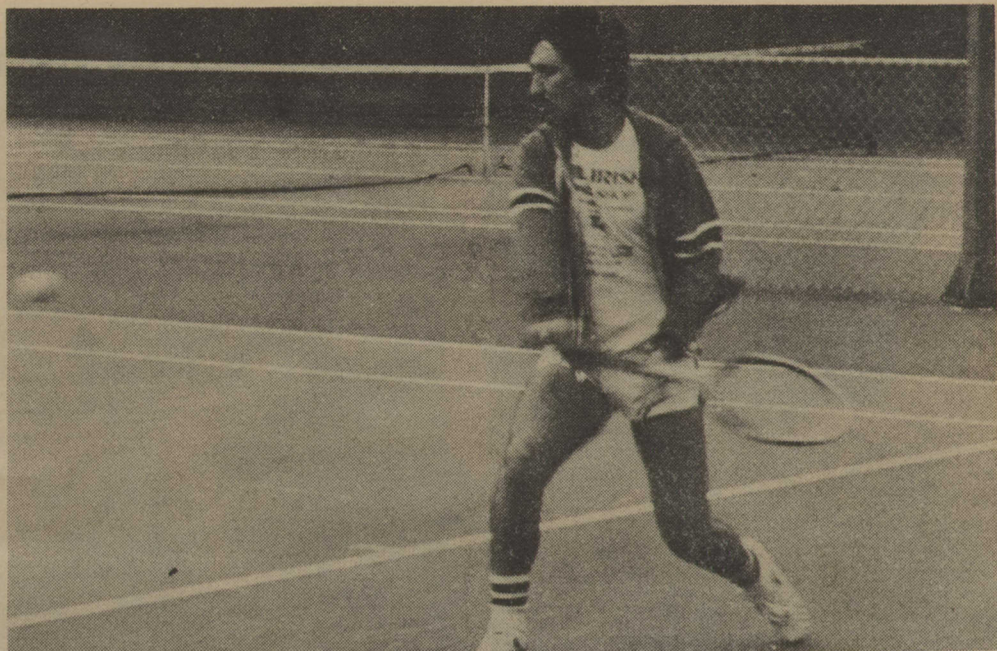
"If we can beat Central Florida in Orlando (FIU defeated the Knights at home earlier this season), then I believe we're the No. 2 team in the state,"

Nuttal said. "If we can pull an upset over Rollins..."

The top four Sunblazer netters are senior captain Rubin Zarate, seniors Luis Vallejo, Ford Oliver and Andy Nawrocki. Zarate, Vallejo and Oliver all competed in last year's nationals held in San Diego, California.

"I'm happy with the way the team has worked under me," Nuttal said. "It's been a total team effort."

Bids for the May 17-20, nationals in Little Rock, Arkansas, will be issued at the end of the month.

# Baseball team should go on to championship

When you have a baseball team that plays its schedule right in the heart of collegiate baseball's hot-bed of talent, boasts a 40-8 record against some well-regarded opposition and is ranked number one in the country, you have yourself a baseball team.

We have such a team here at FIU, and not by accident. All the ingredients of a successful baseball team are evident. But all the talent in the world is meaningless unless it is used, and these guys know how to use it.

The pitching game is there, and it's strong. The ace of the staff, Chris Lein, sports an 11-1 record with 61 strike outs and a 2.64 ERA. Steve Boland is 6-0 with a sparkling 1.98 ERA, Bob Schaffer is 5-0, and Steve Van Camp is 4-0 with a 2.74 ERA and 3 saves.

The defensive game is solid. The Sunblazers have posted a fine .955 fielding percentage, chalked up 49 double plays and have limited their opponents to 5 runs per game, while averaging about 9 runs per game themselves.

The hitting game is another story. It has been incredible. The Blazers have hit for an almost unbelievable team batting average of .353. Any opposing coaches looking at a list of FIU individual statistics will think he's looking at

murderer's row.

Some of these FIU hitters have been having phenomenal years. Hits thunder off their bats rather noisily, like to the tune of Mark Campbell's .403, Jose Fernandez's .382, Tim Knight's .382, Ron Koenigsfeld's .344, and Joe Kubit's .321.

These guys aren't just pesty little singles hitters, either. They kill the ball. Campbell (7 hrs, 39 RBIs, 89 total bases), Fernandez (a school record, 8 triples, 38 RBIs, 90 total bases), Koenigsfeld (8 hrs, 32 RBIs, 90 total bases), Knight (6 triples, 12 doubles, 36 RBIs and 90 total bases), Kubit (8 hrs, 90 total bases, 54 RBIs - 3 short of an FIU record), and Karl Becker (.307 average, 14 doubles, 32 RBIs) are the big guns in FIU's dangerous and rather awesome offensive line-up.

With statistics like those, it's hard not to be the top-ranked team in the nation. But it hasn't been all that easy this year for the Sunblazers. Because of a lack of facilities, FIU plays all their games in the heat of the afternoon sun. Also, they receive very little attention from the local media, who focus most of their attention on the University of Miami Hurricanes.

But they've stuck together, and are playing like national champions. And in about four weeks, when the NCAA Division II championships get underway, they'll have a chance to prove that they are number one.

## Baseball series cancelled; coach seeks 300th win

The three-game baseball series against Southern University of Baton Rouge, La., originally scheduled for Sunblazer Field on the Tamiami Campus this Thursday, Friday, and Saturday afternoons, April 19, 20 and 21 has been canceled.

Southern Coach Leroy Boyd cited financial difficulties as the reason for canceling the series just 48 hours before its start.

"We're of course disappointed at their cancellation," said Coach Tom Wonderling whose Sunblazers are just

three victories shy of presenting him with his 300th career coaching victory, "but like so many other colleges, they're in a financial bind."

FIU will next see action on Friday and Saturday, April 27 and 28, against Stetson University in Deland, Fla.

The Sunblazers will also end the regular season on the road, playing the University of South Florida, May 1 and 2, in Tampa, and the University of Central Florida, May 3 and 4, in Orlando.

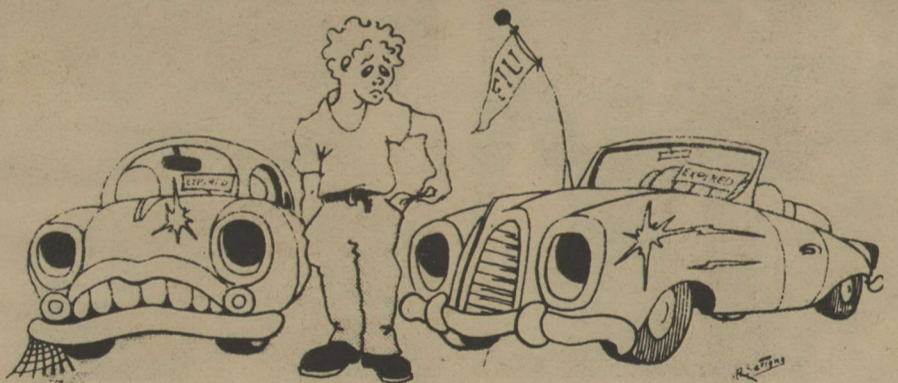

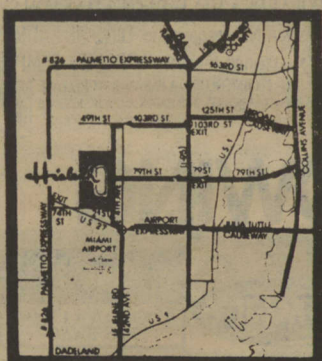

# 'Battlestar Gallactica' moves to a bigger space

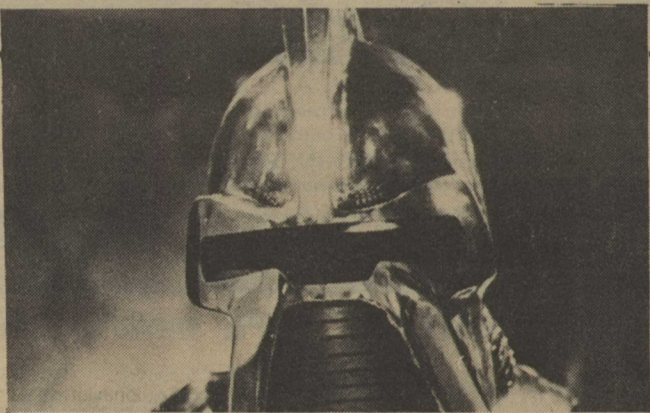

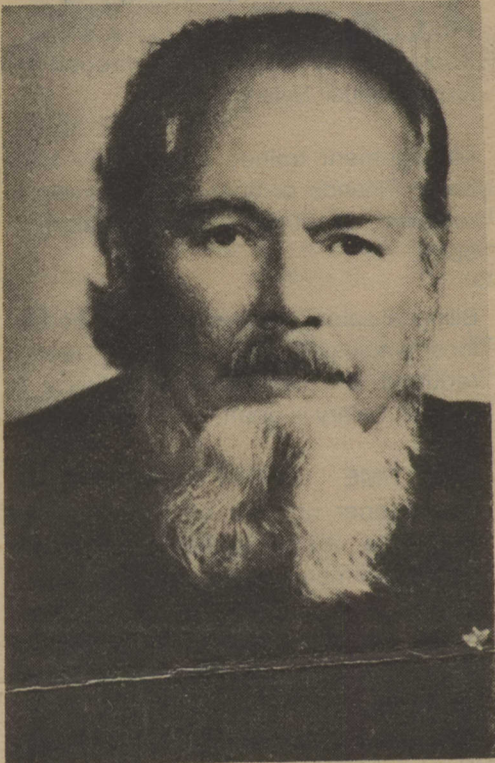

## Exodus spokesman to speak here

Relive a moment in history with the movie "Exodus" and remarks by Rev. John Grauel, leader of the Exodus, at 7 p.m. Monday, April 23, in UH 150.

Grauel was the spokesman who urged the United Nations in 1947 to allow the ship Exodus and its 4,500 passengers to land in Palestine.

Over the past three decades Grauel has continued his efforts on behalf of the State of Israel and yet has not been idle in other fields. He still preaches and functions as a churchman, devoting that effort almost exclusively to the black community.

He says he has deep concern for the "generation gap" and has worked in youth fields, serving on drug and racial tension committees.

The movie and talk are free. The event is sponsored by Hillel of FIU, The Herzl Institute and the United Jewish Appeal.

## Falashan Jews' plight discussed

Zacharios Yonah, a black Falashan Jew from Ethiopia, speaks on the plight of Falashan Jewry and what can be done to help Tuesday, April 24, 12:30 p.m. at Tamiami Campus, UH 210.

Yonah immigrated to Israel in 1972, attended Tel Aviv University for four years and is presently secretary general of the association of Ethiopian Jews.

Falashas are being sold as slaves; hundreds are reported killed, thousands are reported to be rotting in refugee camps and, because of anti-Zionist feelings by one faction in Ethiopia, the Falashas are being singled out for unusual punishment.

Israel and world Jewry, recognizing the potential destruction of the Falasha Community in Ethiopia, are just beginning to act.

Prime Minister Menachem Begin supports immigration of Falashas as resource of 28,000 Jews dedicated to the growth and survival of Israel but formidable problems have to be surmounted before this can be achieved.

Recognizing this as a basic human rights issue, FIU Hillel and United Black Students are co-sponsoring this event. Lunch will be provided. The public is invited.

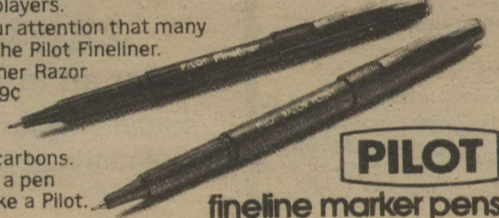

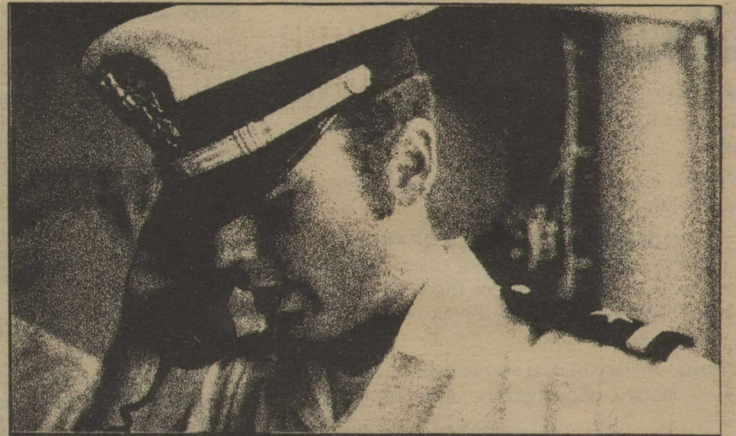
