Dear Sir:

The writer is just in receipt of a note from Mr. Fisher advising me that you contemplate visiting Miami Beach soon after January 1st. We would be very pleased, indeed, to have you with us at The Flamingo and I am enclosing herewith a floor plan on which I have indicated rooms for your consideration. It is my understanding that you desire accommodations for Mrs. Rauh, your daughter and yourself.

I have checked on the plan rooms 228 and 230 with bath between; also rooms 307 and 309 with bath between. Either of these suites are very choice. The first mentioned faces West, directly overlooking the bay. The rooms are large, have immense big closets and I am sure you would find them most comfortable, the double rooms being equipped with twin beds. The rate on these rooms for three persons, including meals is \$54 per day.

Rooms 307 and 309 face East, looking out over the hotel grounds and the golf course toward the ocean. They are on the third sleeping floor and are very nice rooms. They do not overlook the water, but being on the East, get the breezes from the ocean and would probably be cooler than rooms on the West. The rate on these rooms is \$51 per day for three persons.

We are to open on December 29th and our bookings are already very heavy. Our season is rather short so that we have been obliged to make a more or less arbitrary rule that rooms must be taken on or before January 20th. I understood, however, that you would be with us right after January 1st. Should either of the suites indicated meet with your approval, would appreciate your advising me of your selection by wire as one of these suites is already under consideration by another party. If it is not necessary for you to have the rooms together, I could offer you two very nice rooms, each with their own bath on one of the upper floors.
