Time periods for topics range from pre-Columbian history to the late twentieth century. While most articles are scholarly studies, many first-person accounts also appear in the journal. The breadth and depth of the articles make *Tequesta* one of the best sources for the study of South Florida history.

The contents of *Tequesta* are copyrighted, and all rights are reserved. Reprint of material is encouraged; however, written permission from the Association is required.

The editors welcome inquiries and submissions. *The Chicago Manual of Style* should be consulted on matters of style. Illustrations may be embedded in electronic manuscripts to indicate their locations; submit them also as separate, 300 ppi or higher jpegs or tiffs. Include credit lines in the illustration captions.
