
Structure is an excellent example of Mediterranean Revival architecture. Noteworthy features include its large size, detailing and landscaping including several large live oak trees. Architects Kiehnel & Elliott were among the most popular during the 1920s in Dade County and were one of the firms that helped set the Mediterranean theme of the original Miami Shores development. It is one of the original homes built during the time the Shoreland Company was developing Miami Shores. Mr. Simmons (deceased) was a prominent Miami attorney. The Simmons family has occupied the home since 1929. The property is a designated Miami Shores historic landmark.



Physical Description:

Structure is an excellent example of Mediterranean Revival architecture in a two-story residence on a large, well-landscaped lot. Front (S) projecting wing on W has double French doors separated by molded pilaster, carved masonry lintels. Second story has 3 sets French doors, molded pilasters, arched solid transoms and a masonry balcony. Main mass (E) has French doors with carved lintels and pilasters on 1st floor, 4-pane casement with pilasters on 2nd. Porte cochere on W has round arch pedestrian bay; square auto bay with carved lintels; 3 round arch bays on W. Hip roof on residence has exposed rafters. Masonry wall with pedestrian arch connects house to one-story garage in rear (N).
