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SIGNIFICANCE: A - A physical (architectural or archeological) description of the site. Photograph should accompany this description. One-story Mediterranean Revival structure; masonry/stucco construction. Two rectangular wings extend beyond the sexhagonal central mass. Spanish barrel tile hip roof. Five-pane awning windows in metal frames. Wings form entry courtyard. Entry door has arched transom with rusticated keystone above, and sidelights flanked by unfluted Tuscan pilasters with unadorned capitals and plain entablature-type masonry decoration. Narrow five-pane awning windows flank pillasters. Pointed arch bell-tower chimney extends from left center of central mass. Roofline of central mass extends several feet above flanking wings. Plan is H-shaped. Italian cypress on interior corners of wings are significant.

SIGNIFICANCE: B - A brief description of the site's relationship to the history, development, architecture, archeology and/or culture of Miami Shores, Dade County, the State of Florida or the nation.

This house is an unusual adaptation of the Octagon style to Mediterranean Revival architecture. The house also is unusual for its symmetry, accented by the Italian cypress which were planted in the early 1950s. The architects are noted for many important buildings in South Florida during the 1920s and 1930s. Mr. Kiehnel was considered the major force in the introduction of Mediterranean Revival architecture to Miami. Many structures designed by the firm are on the National Register of Historic Places.
