


FOREWORD

The first Key West High School was founded in 1900 on Simonton Street, near Fleming, in a wooden building, and was known as the Sears School. Amid unfavorable surroundings, the students worked until 1908, when it was moved to the present Harris Grammar School. This was a great improvement, but it was soon evident that a larger and more modern school was needed.

During 1914 the demand for a larger school was felt, and resulted in the present Division Street Grammar School. In 1921 the citizens of Monroe County felt the need for a larger and more modern building, and therefore voted to erect the present building that is now occupied by the Junior High School.





Amid great festivities, the cornerstone was laid on May 30, 1923, and it was ready for the students to enter in September. The building, beautiful in every respect, and the pride of the county, was large enough for the time being, but soon the citizens decided that Monroe County must not only be up with other counties, but must be a leader in education, offering her sons and daughters all she can in this line.

This could be done only by another building, and at the beginning of the present year the Annex was completed and occupied by the Senior High School. In addition to all Senior High Classes being conducted in the Annex, it has a cafeteria, manual training shop, cooking and sewing rooms, laboratory, and a lecture room.





Key West High School had already made a name for itself among the other teams of the State on account of its athletic teams, but the students were greatly handicapped because of lack of a gymnasium. This was soon remedied, and in a few months, after the completion of the Annex, the gymnasium was ready to be used.

It is equipped for basketball, indoor baseball, and all indoor sport activities, and has a seating capacity of five hundred. Shower baths, hot and cold, are included in both boys' and girls' dressing rooms, including locker space for every student in the school.

In brief, Key West High School is about all a school should be, and the members of the Class of '28 feel a pang of regret as they leave these buildings where they have spent some of the happiest days of their lives.





FOOTBALL

Never before in its history has the football prospects of Key West High School looked so promising as the afternoon that the pride of the school went in training for the second time under Coach Anderson. With the lineup as strong on the offense as it was on the defense, it looked as if the high school lads would make this season a banner year in victories.

The Conchs pried the lid off their season by licking the local Marine team to the tune of 27-0. This looked well, and the school could visualize a nice string of victories to its credit.

However, after the first game it seemed as if an evil spirit was following the team, because, just before the annual game with St. Petersburg, our old rivals, one of the best players was hurt and had to be left behind. While training in Tampa, Kermit Baker, another star player, was injured and was on the sick list for the rest of the season.

The game with St. Pete was a slaughter. The Conchs were facing a team heavier and more experienced, and the result was, before the game ended, about ten Key West boys were on the sidelines, knocked out or injured seriously. The







score at the conclusion of the game was 27-0, and this seemed to break the spirit of the boys.

After that the team lost to Fort Lauderdale by only one touchdown. However, the following week the boys staged a comeback and licked Lemon City. Daytona Beach was licked on our home ground by one point, and the Gesu boys and the wearers of the crimson and grey fought for four heart-rending quarters in the last game of the season for the local team, neither side being able to score.

The school loses a number of players that have been with the "Fighting Conch" team since it was organized three years ago. These boys have shared the sorrows as well as joys, sticking with the team in victory and defeat, and are worthy of all the praise that can be given them.

They are Harry Capo as center, Robert Knight and Theron Gato, star ends, Captain "Dizzy" Roberts, the plunging full back, and Floyd Ayala, who amazed the school with his devil-may-care playing in his last year, Victor Larson and Earl Yates.

The school is losing on the line Glynn Archer, one of the best ends that has worn the crimson and gray; Kermit Baker, who was hurt several times, and, when advised by doctors to quit, said, "As long as the school needs me, I will play"; Fred Carbonell, the Cuban phantom, and George Adams, who relieved the regular center in a number of games. John D. Jenks, manager for three years, will also graduate.

The senior class is justly proud of these boys of hers, who sacrificed all in following their creed of "Service Before Self," and "Deeds, Not Words."
