Ira Silberman, local Venetian blind salesman, and Don Walston, Miami Herald distributor, along with Paul Avery, Castor-Oil salesman, had just embarked on a hunting trip to darkest Africa where they hope to bring back several trophies for their game room.

Leaving the restaurant I ran into Sylvia Smith and Lois Robinson who are both operating the concession stand at the Islander Drive-In Theater, and from them I learned that Mary Gardner, Clara Garcia, Murial Hamilton, Clara Gardner, Elizabeth Braun, Beverly Bailey, Marilyn Adams, Mary Sweeting, Dolores Ybarmea, Peggy McCrea, Marilyn Marsh, Barbara McMeekin, Sonia Plasencia, Alvania Singleton, and Lynn Murchie had all been married and were residing in Key West.

Since it was late I went back to the hotel and went to bed. The next morning I went to see my old friend Donald Key who had just been elected president of the Charter Boatmen's Association. From him I learned that Harry Allen cornered the Shrimp Industry in Key West, while Arcadio Rodriguez and Ervin Higgs owned the largest fish house in the South.

1953 CONCHS WIN STATE CHAMPIONSHIP GO TO SOUTHEASTERN FINALES



The National Honor Society recognizes its duties and responsibilities toward Key West High and is striving toward the goal of making the year 1954 an even bigger and more successful one than last year.







Membership is open to anyone interested in teaching.





The Diversified Cooperative Training Program may be described as a plan for training junior and senior high school students, of employable age, in a variety of occupations utilizing the communities business and industrial establishments as training agencies.

This is done by dividing the school day into four hours of study and four hours of work in the student-learner's chosen occupation. Of the four hours spent in school, two hours are devoted to required high school subjects—such as English and History—which enable the student-learner to graduate with his class; the other two hours are used for study related to his occupation, under direct supervision of the coordinator.

Four high school credits may be earned each year by the student-learner—two of which are for required subjects and two for work experience and related study in Diversified Cooperative Training Program. These credits may be used for college entrance as high school electives.
