The Conchs ended their season by playing an out-of-town game at South Dade on November 24. After a thrill-a-minute game the Conchs again succeeded in out doing their opponents by a score of 28-7.

The season record was impressive!








Student Council

The Diversified Cooperative Training Program was organized to promote trade and industrial education among D.C.T. siudents.

This is done by dividing the school day into four hours of study and four hours of work in the student-learner's chosen occupation. Of the four hours spent in school, two hours are devoted to required high school subjects, which enable the student to graduate with his class; the other two hours are used for study related to his occupation,

under direct supervision of the coordinator.

Five high school credits may be earned each year by the student-learner. Two of which are for required subjects and three for work and related study in the Diversified Cooperative Training Program.

All D.C.T. students are members of the D.C.T. Club and have had various activities throughout the year.

They deserve any and all recognition that is given them, and we know they realize how we do appreciate their services.




