We, the editors, would like to extend our appreciation and thanks to our faculty advisor and our staff members for their conscientious work in making this "1956 Conch" possible.


May this book always serve as a constant and precious reminder of old friends and good times at Key West High School during the school year 1955-56.







We, the annual staff of 1956, wish to express our appreciation, on behalf of the student body, to the janitors for the hard work which they have done this year.


We would especially like to thank them for being here and helping us prepare for may extra curricular activities. Without their cooperation our school would not be in the wonderful working condition it is now.

typewriters in her sleep.



One can find anything from a secretary to a salesman in the Diversified Cooperative Training. Learning by doing is the keynote of this part-time program. The student spends one-half day in school studying two major subjects and the technical information related to the job for which he is studying. In the afternoon he works on his job in a local shop or business establishment. Here he learns his job under actual working conditions. This job experience is gained under the instruction of a qualified trainer in the occupation the student is learning. This cooperative training carries full credit toward high school graduation and is ac-

On the 21st of Oct. the entire football team and coaching staff were guests of the Quarterback Club at the Orange Bowl for the game between Miami U. and T.C.U.


The Conchs were hampered a great deal this season by injuries. Two of them occured to key players early in the season, Gene Favors and Ronald Parks.

The third game the tables were turned on the Conchs as they found themselves on the short end of 20-0 in favor of Ft. Lauderdale another single-wing team.


