In this modern world of missiles, satellites, and mechanical brains the demand for well trained mathematicians is increasing daily.

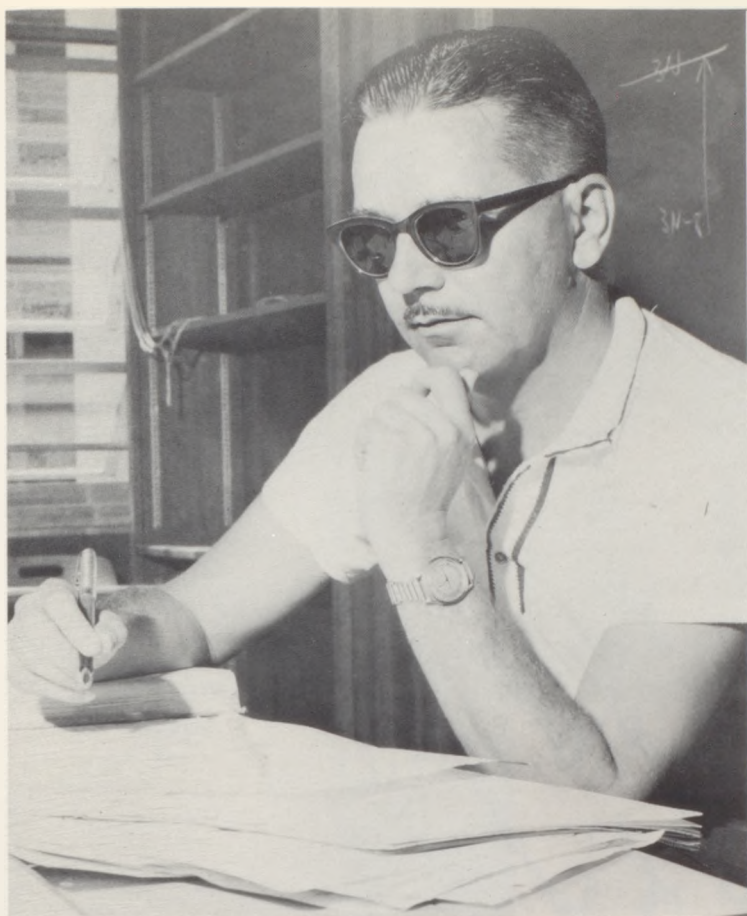
To help meet this demand Key West High School offers a well-rounded math program designed to meet the needs of the future.

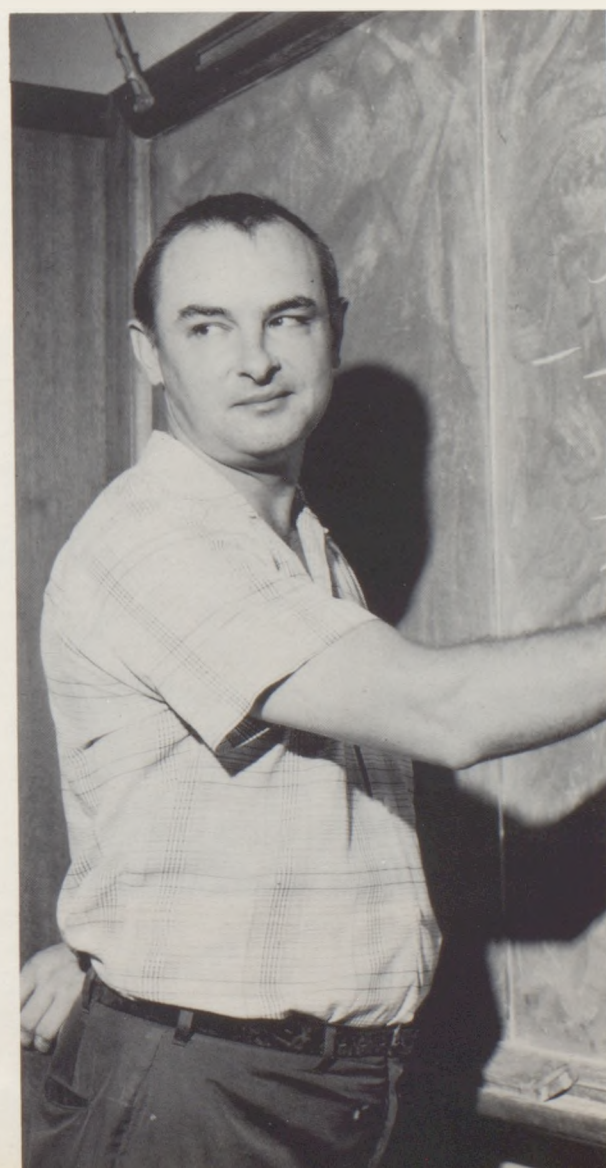

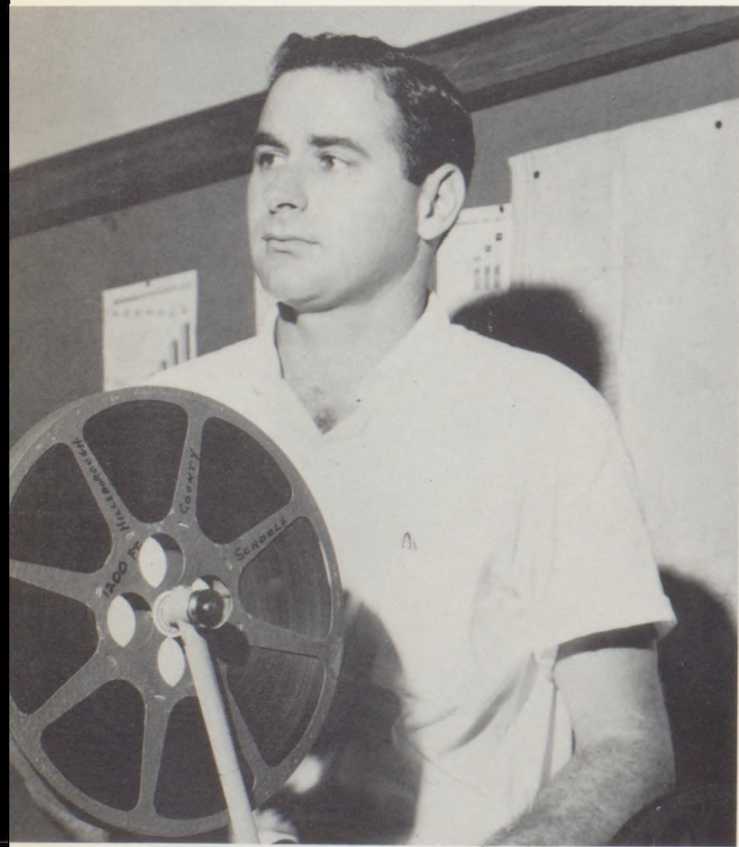

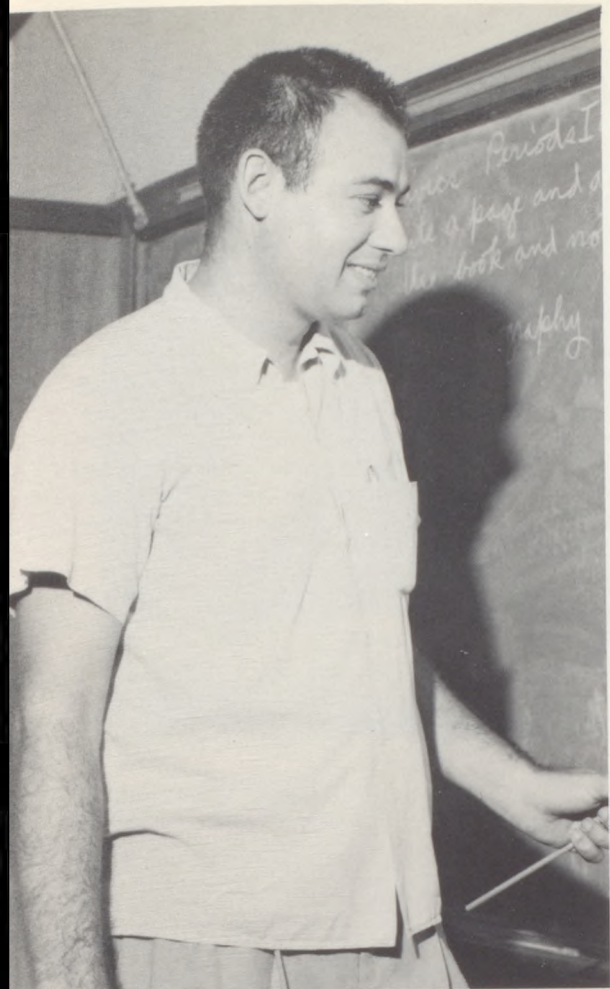
Future Citizens Prepared

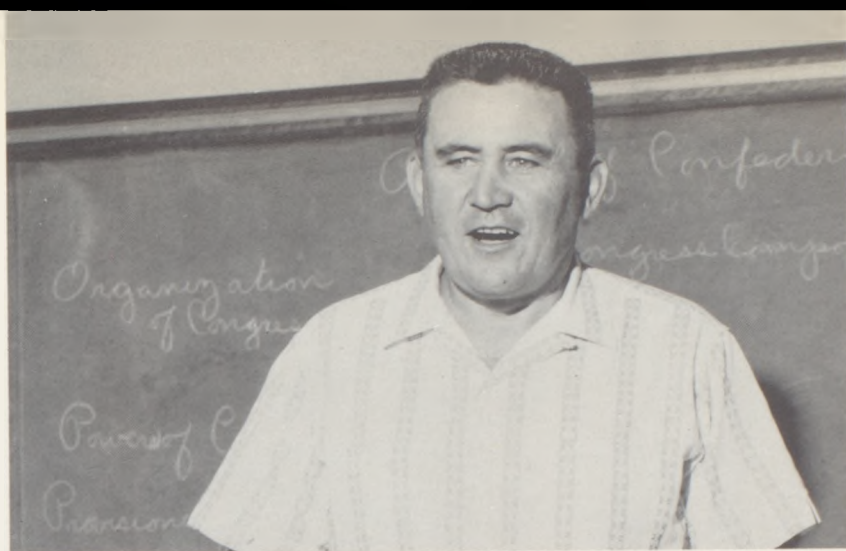
Courses such as Civics, American History, American Government, and World History, are offered to give the student a more solid knowledge of how and why our great country is what it is today.

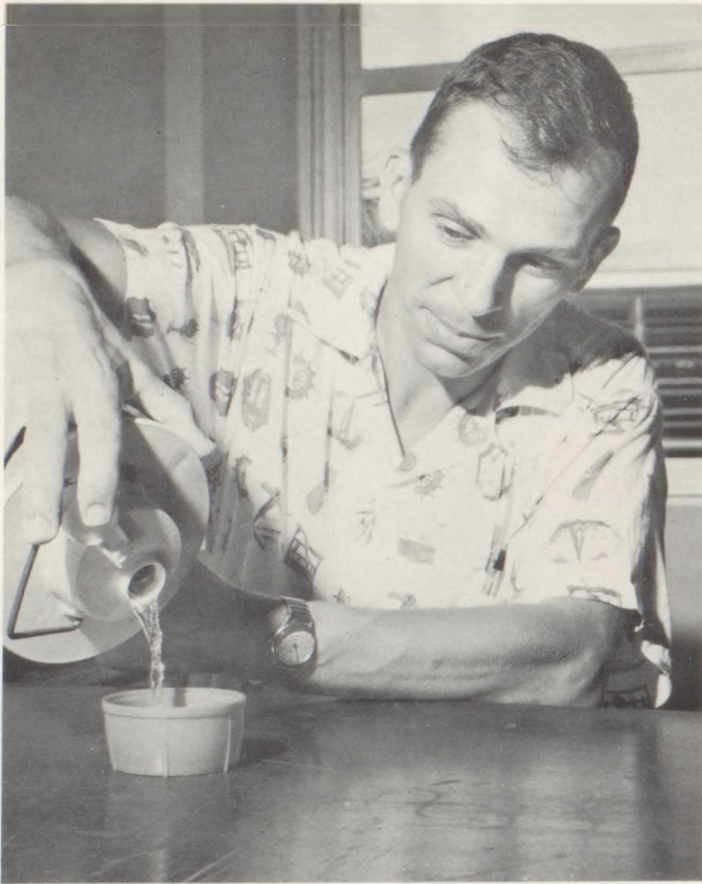

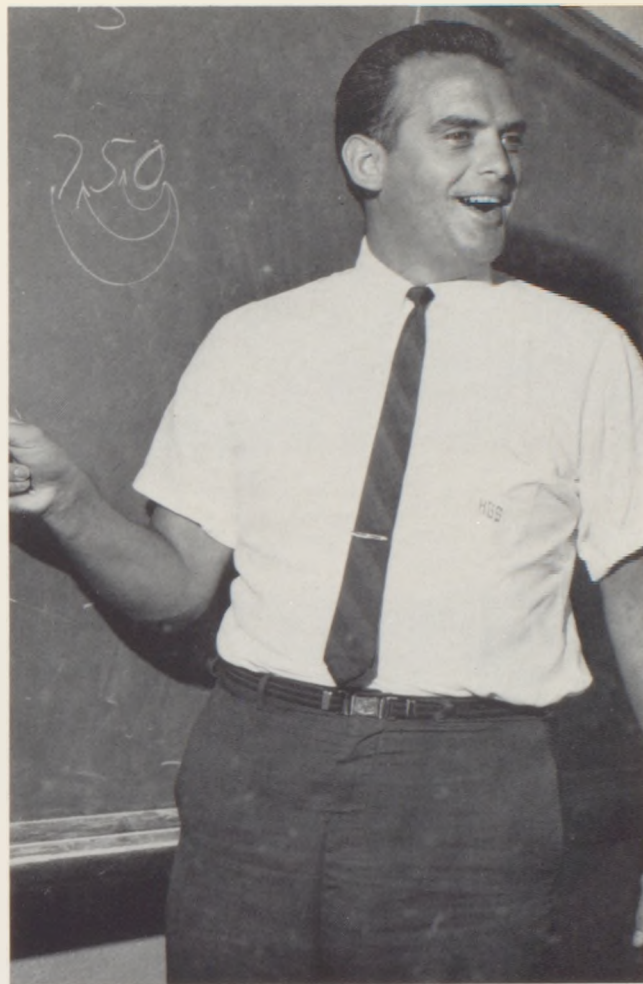

Science Department Meets Challenge

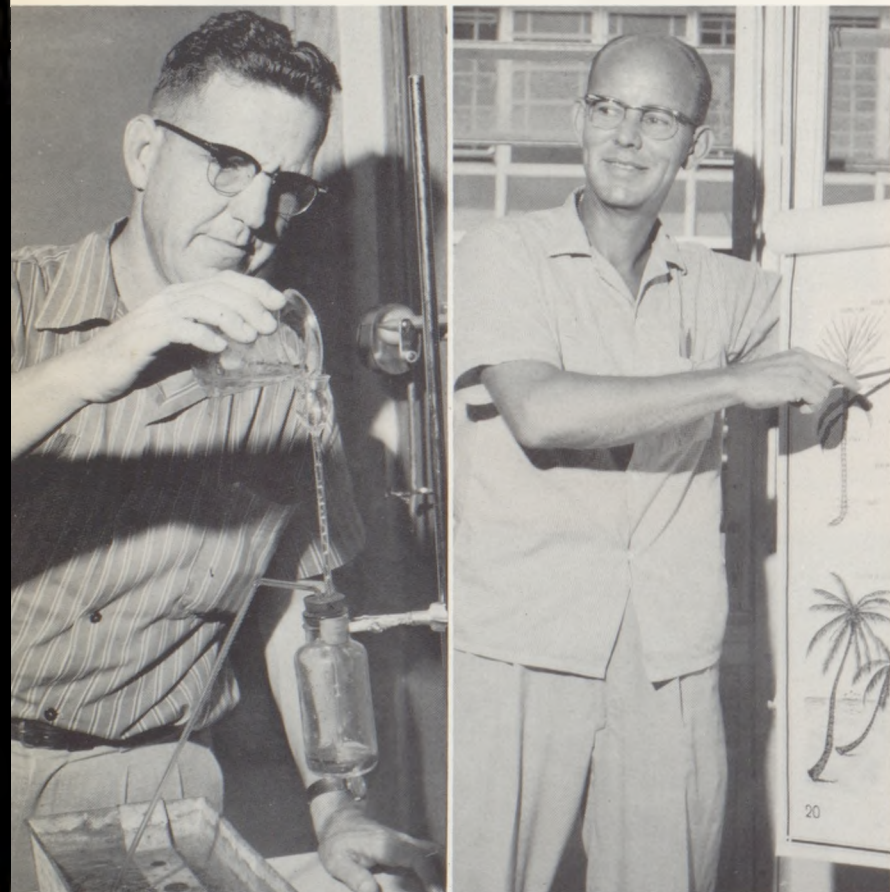

Through the facilities of the KWHS library science students have had access to the Traveling Science Library for the first time this year.

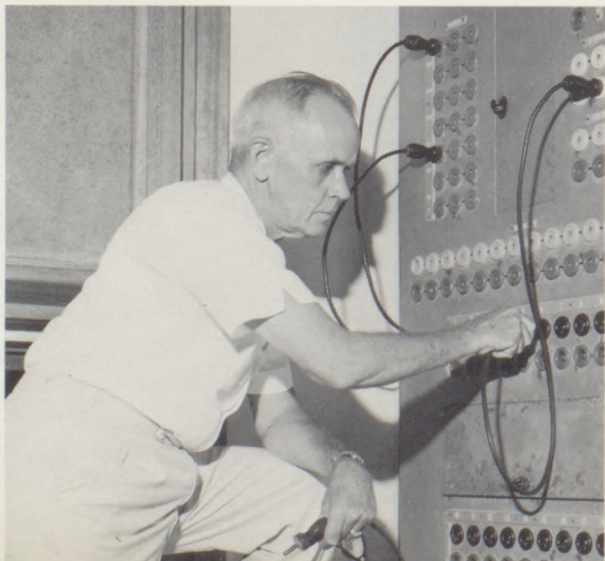

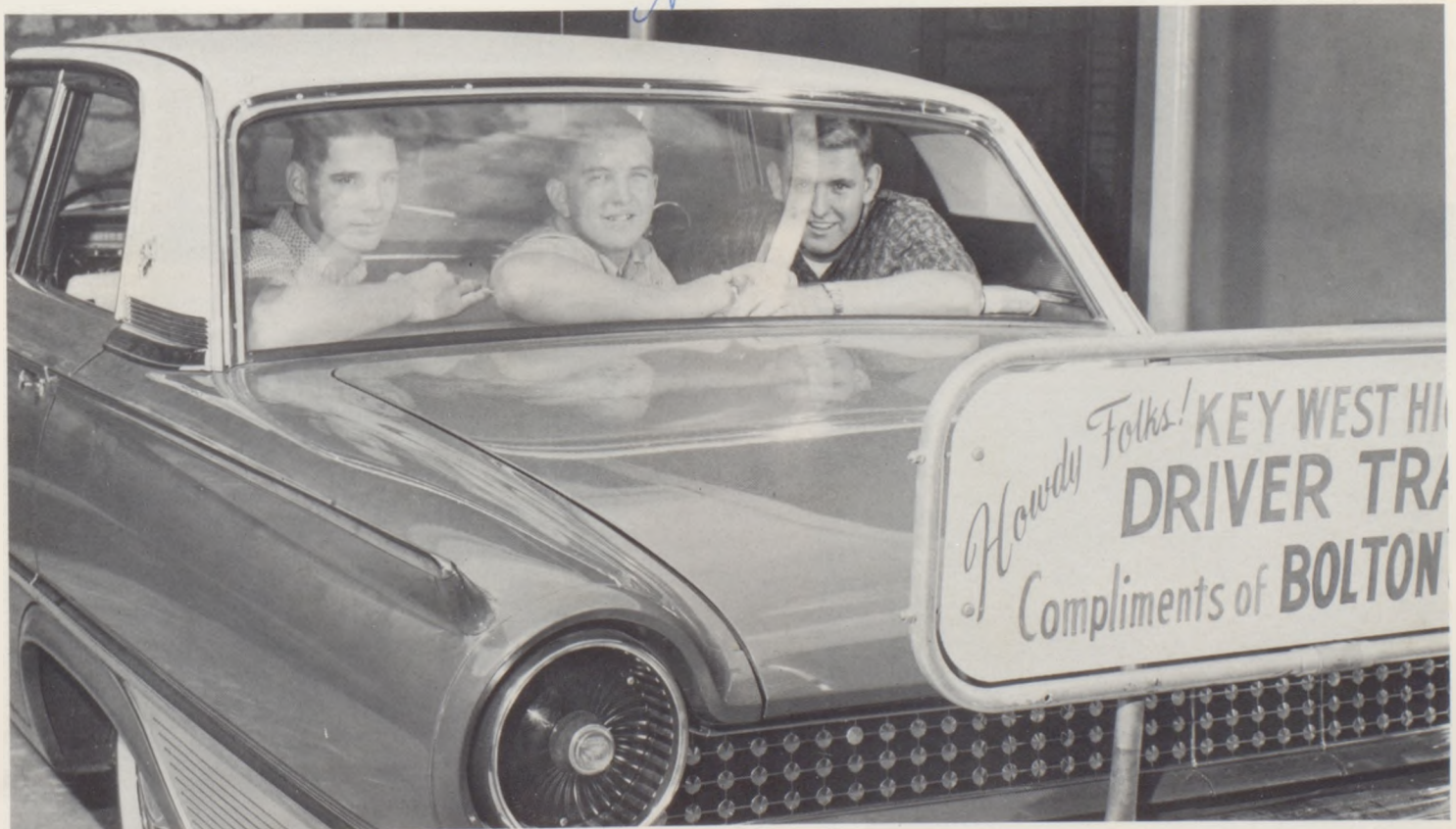
Most people believe that Drivers Education is exclusively designed for learning to drive. They have the wrong assumption because drivers training also teaches the fundamental devices of the automobile.

This course also covers everything necessary to be a sportsmanlike driver. The students are given a thorough view of driving through films, charts, statistics, and actual practice driving.

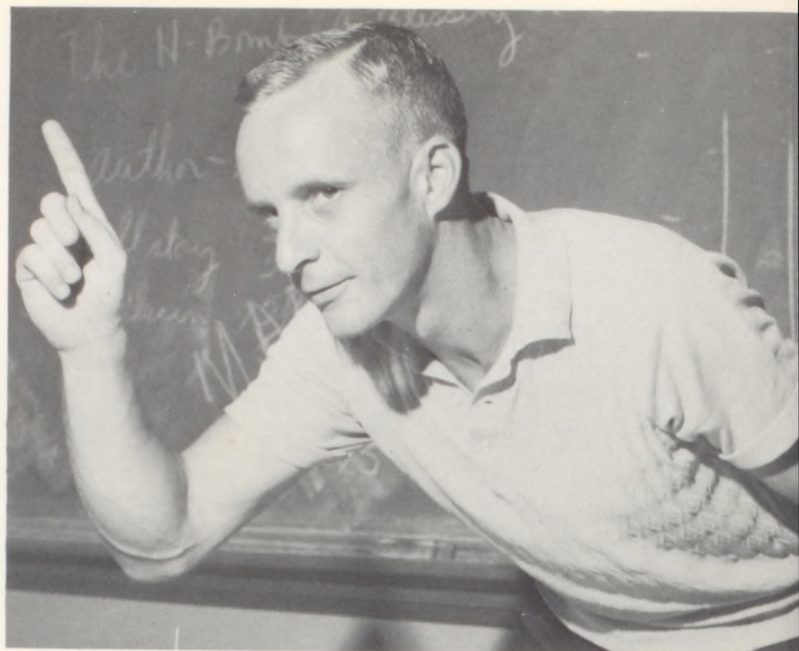

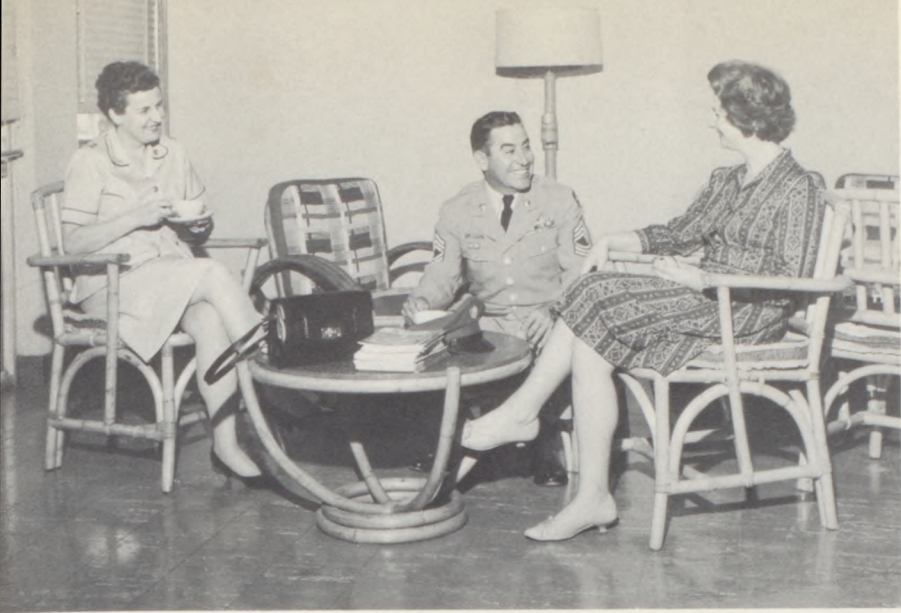
Discussing school events?

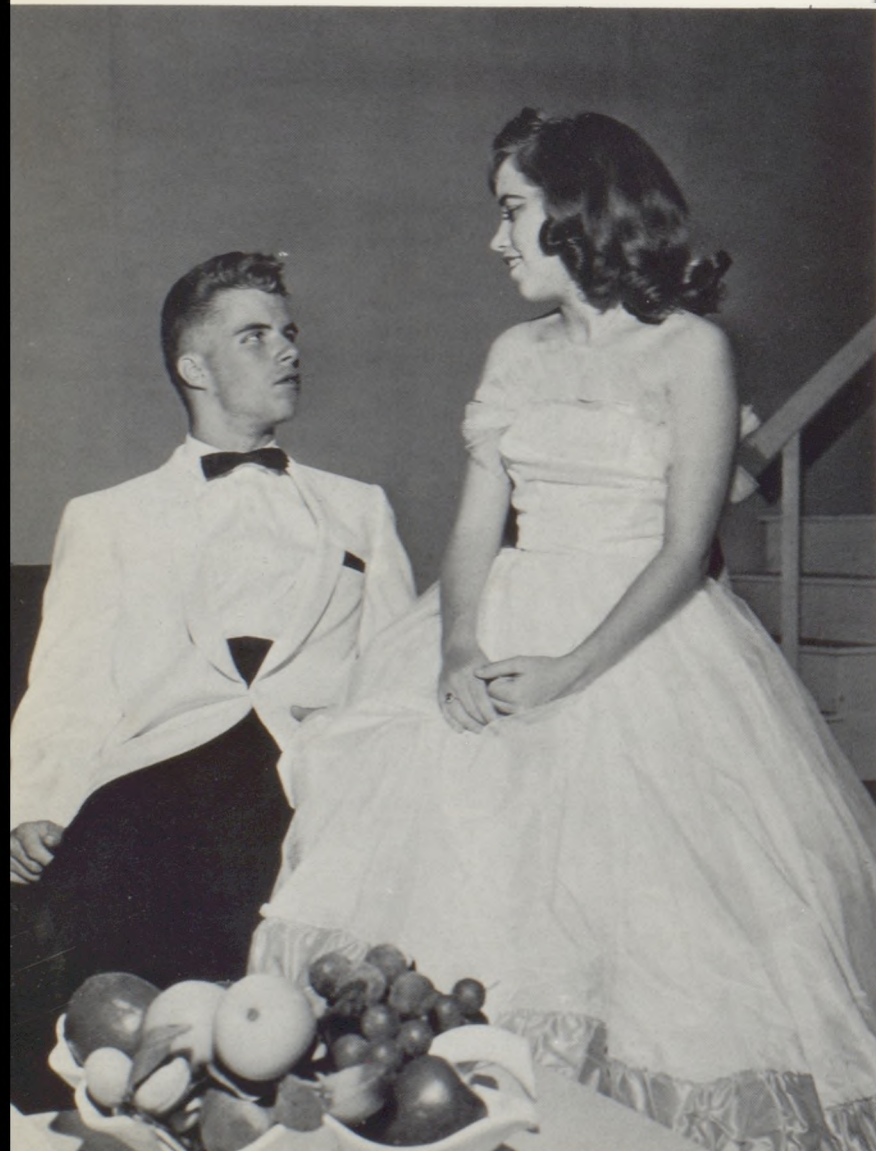

Some of the many activities carried out this year were: having a social evening once a month; collecting and distributing Christmas food baskets; presenting an assembly; and various money-making projects.

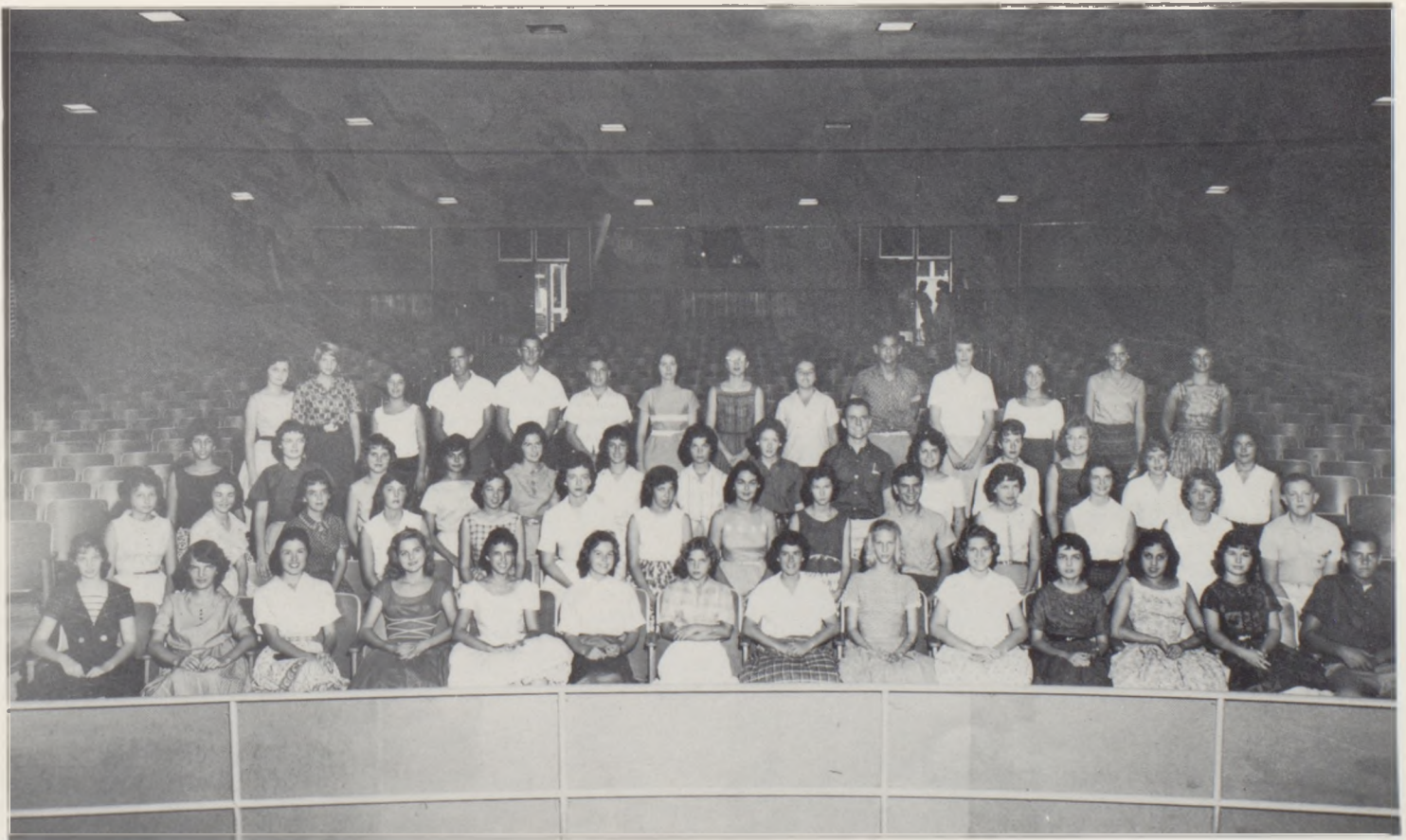

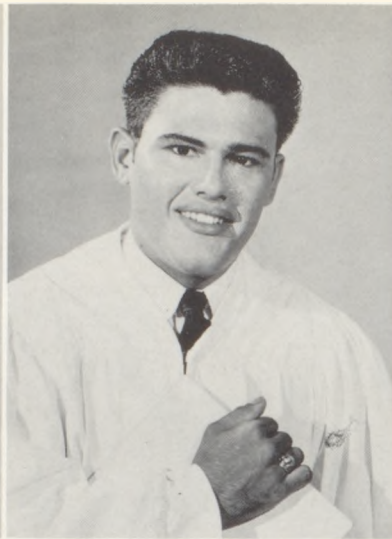
Christmas cards were sold by members of the class to supplement the money gained by the play.
