Both vocational and aesthetic values are offered in the English curriculum to prepare the student for a productive and enjoyable future as a thinking citizen in a free society.

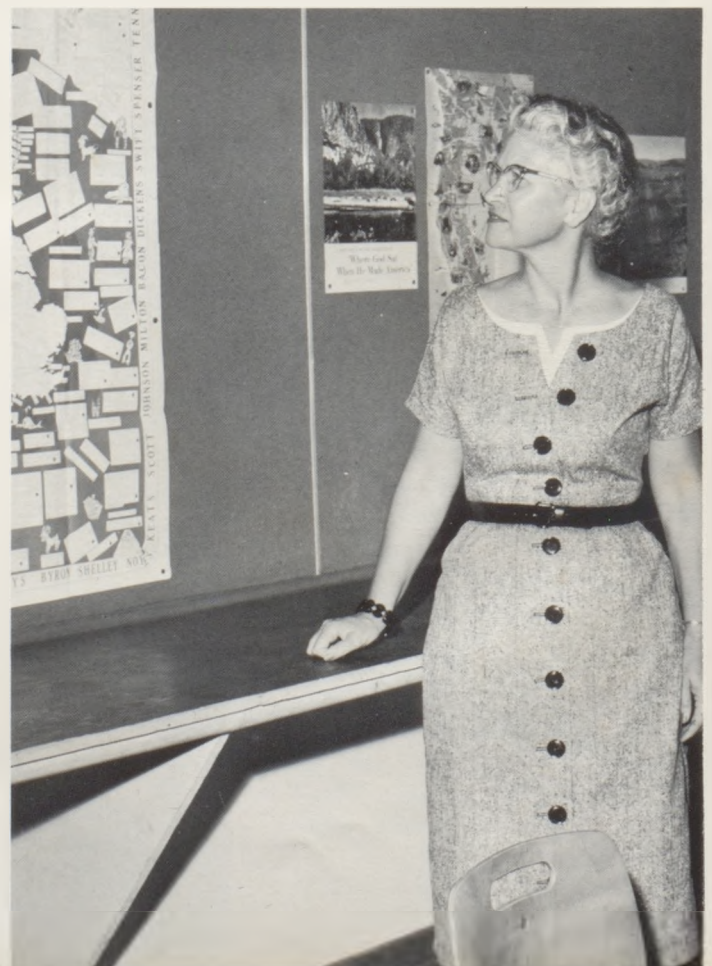
Communication skills are developed, language processes of democracy are emphasized, understandings are broadened, and life is enriched through the speaking, listening, reading, and writing activities of the English program.

A course in journalism was offered for the first time this year and students published the school newspaper and helped gather and write school news for the local papers.

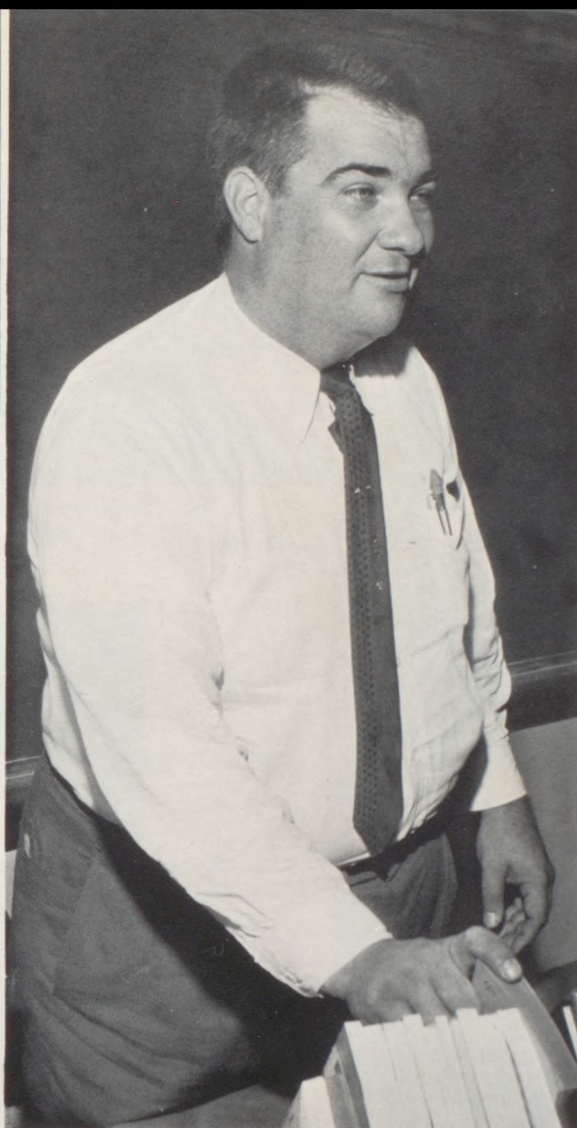

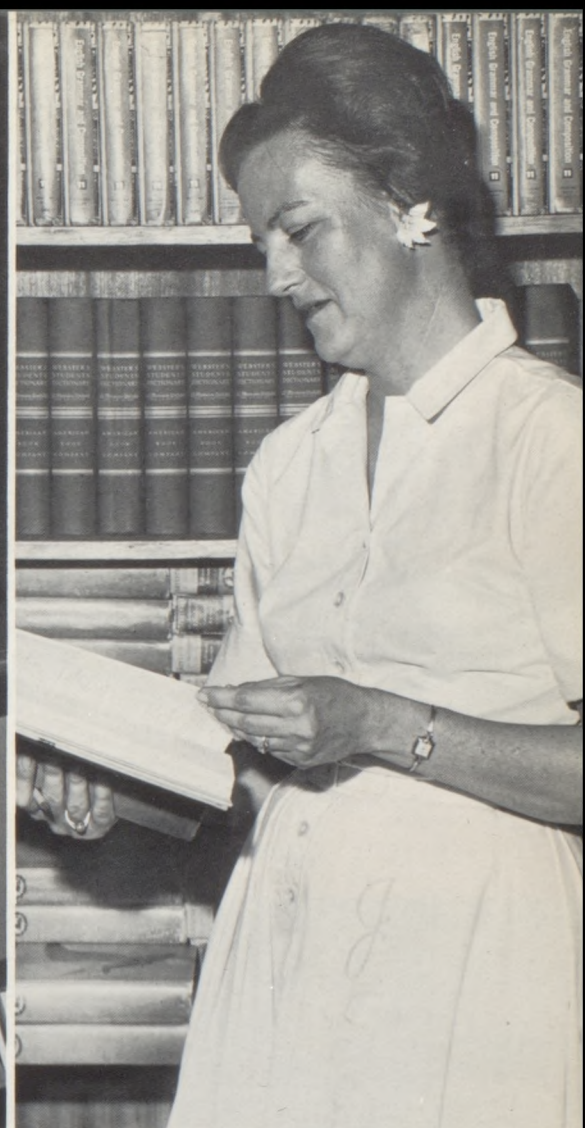

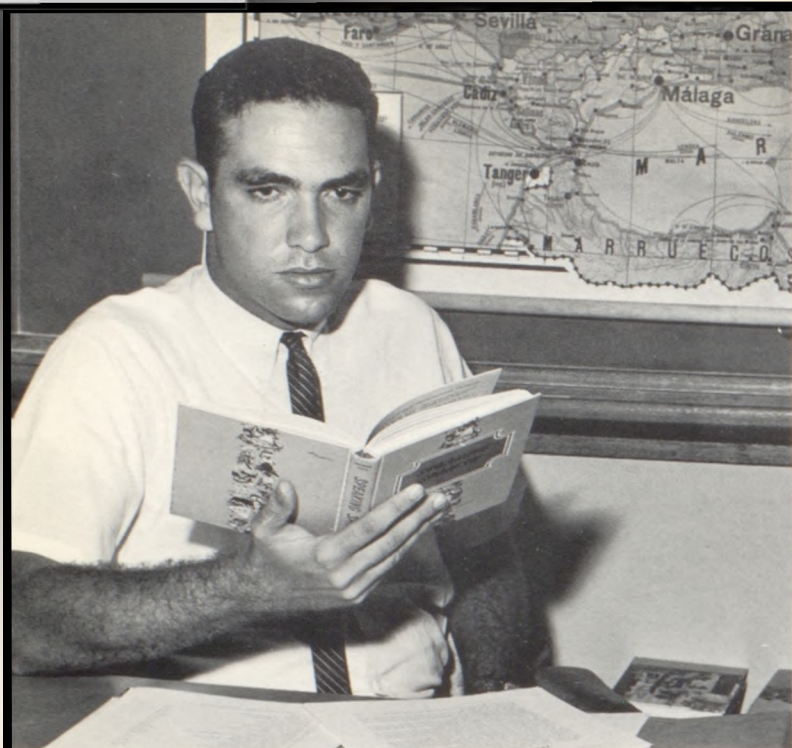

The language department consists of Spanish I and II, Latin I and II, and French I.

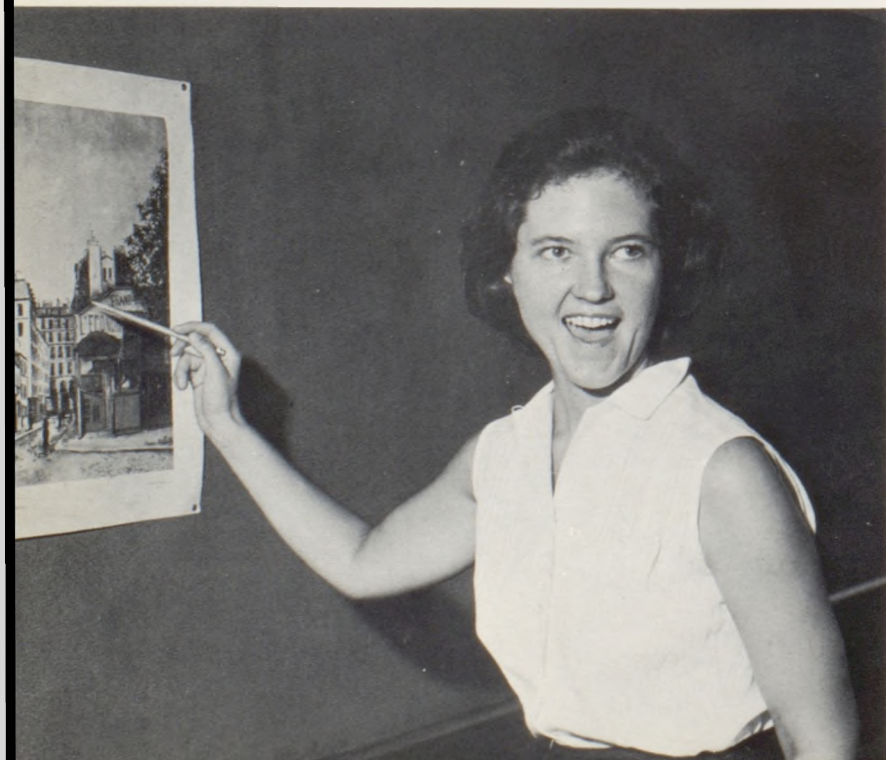

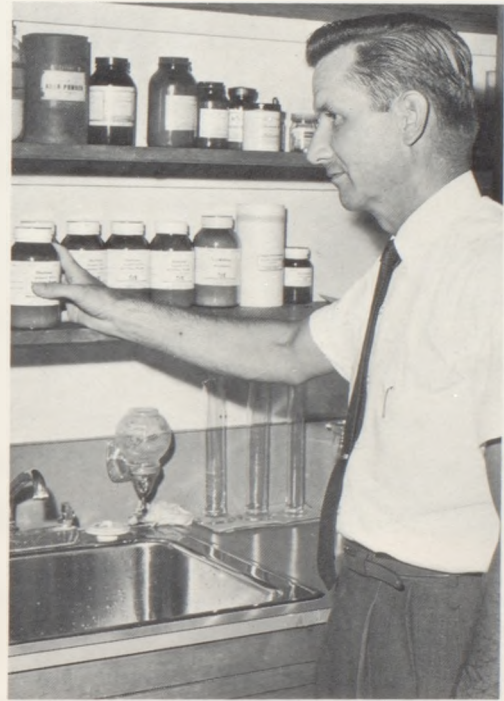

The Science Fair in March gave proof of the quality of the department for the exhibits showed much resourcefulness and work.

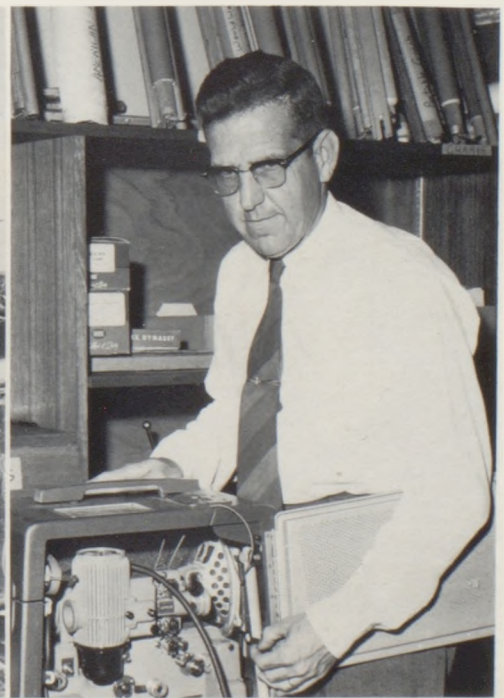
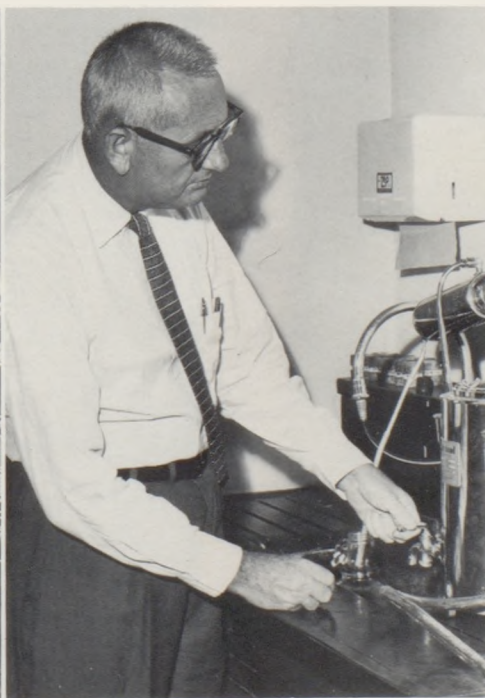

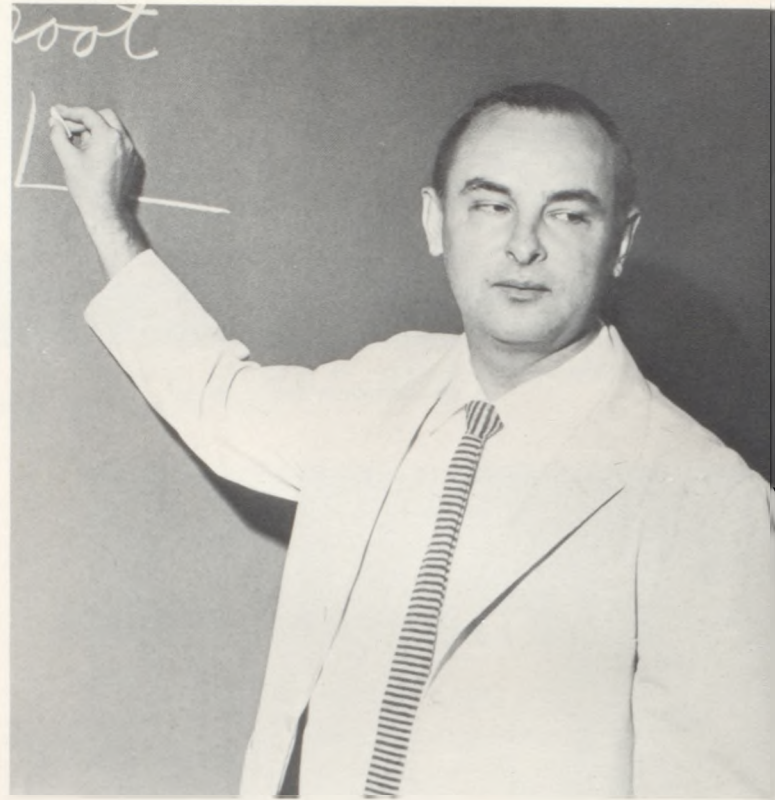

Precision Thinking

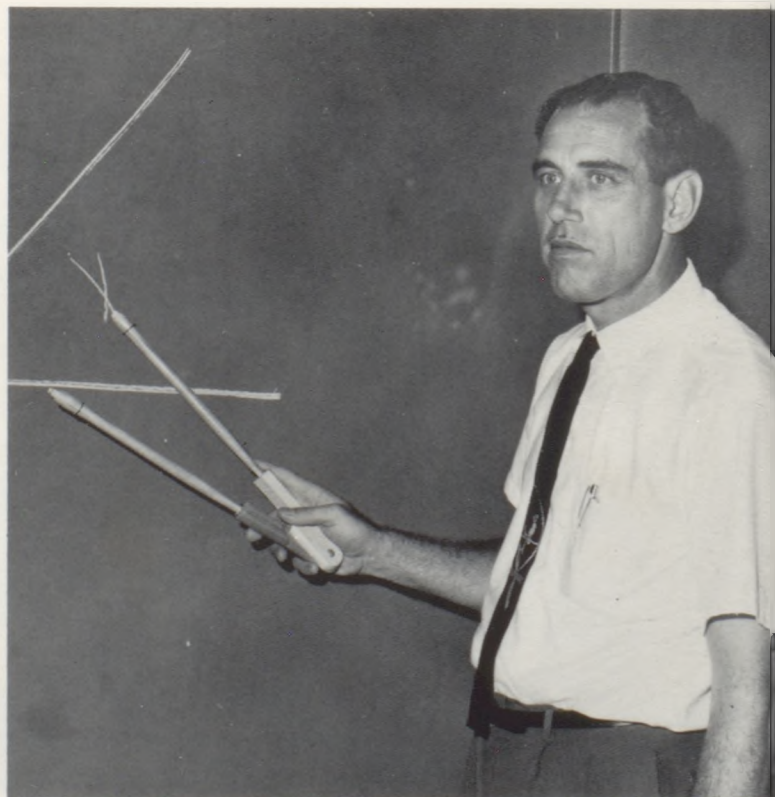
Math is becoming more and more necessary in this world of precision thinking. The field of mathematics is broadening out into many different subjects.

The chorus, under supervision of Mr. Whitley, made various appearances for civic organizations, the school, and competition with other schools.



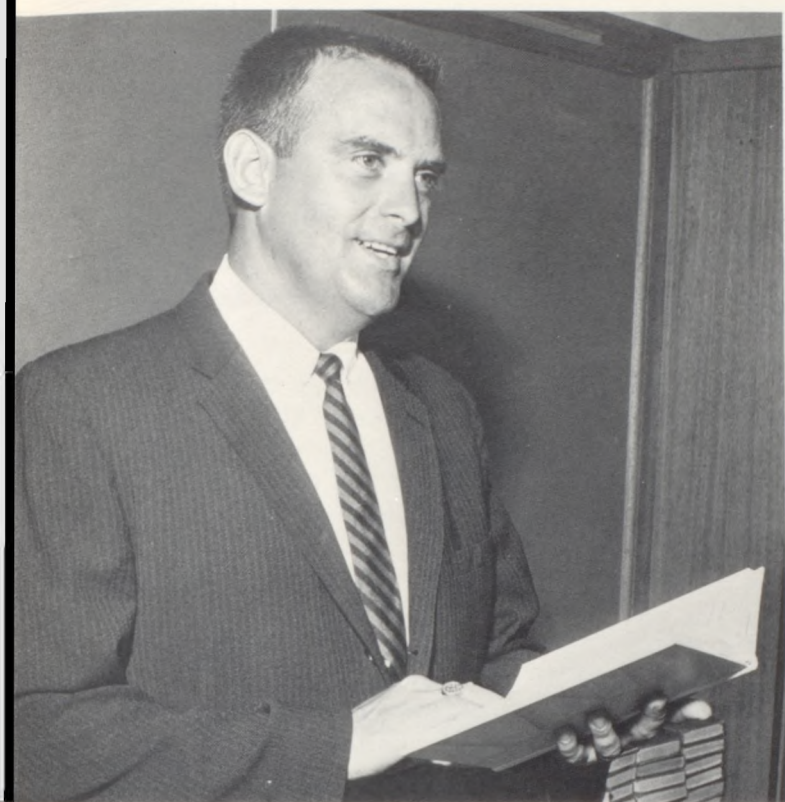

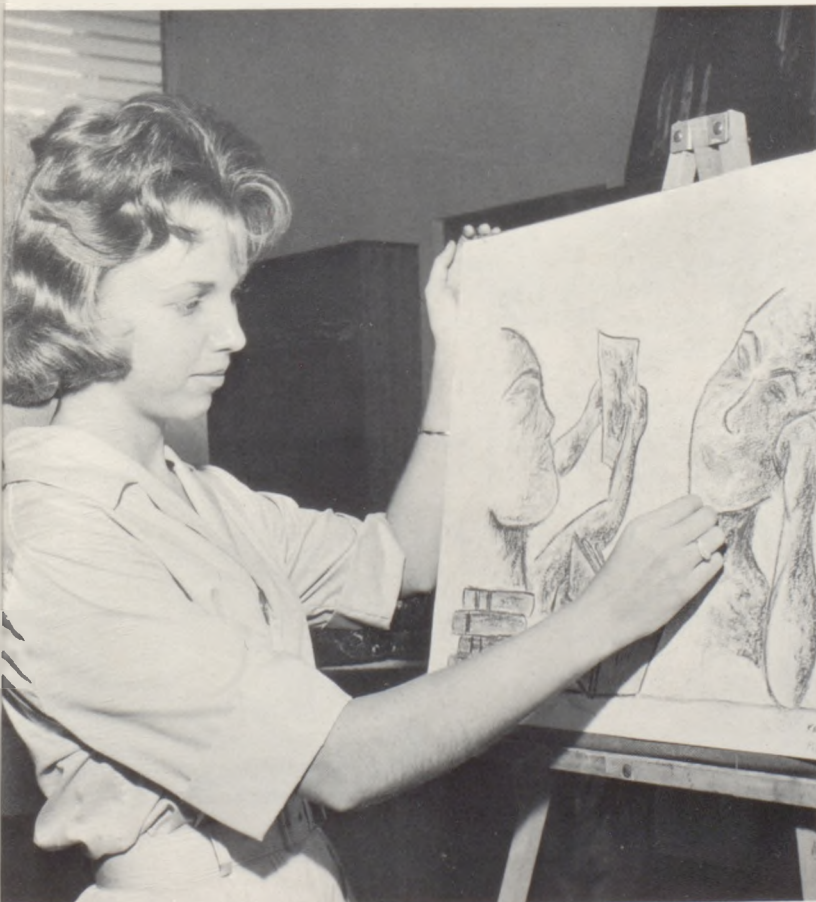
One of the basic purposes of the arts and crafts department is the development of self expression. In addition an appreciation of the heritage of arts and crafts is developed.

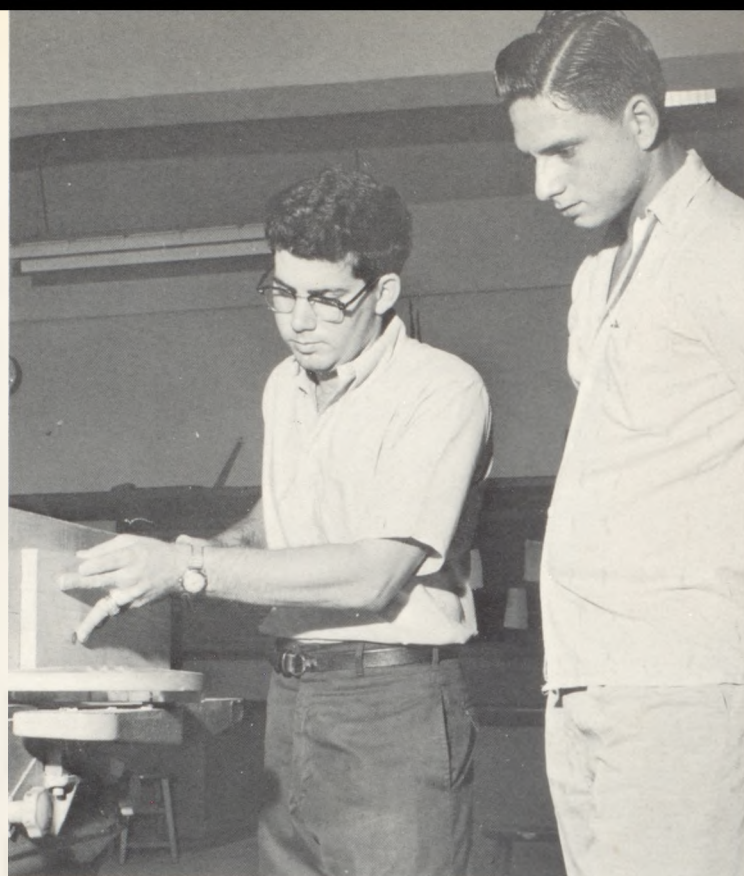

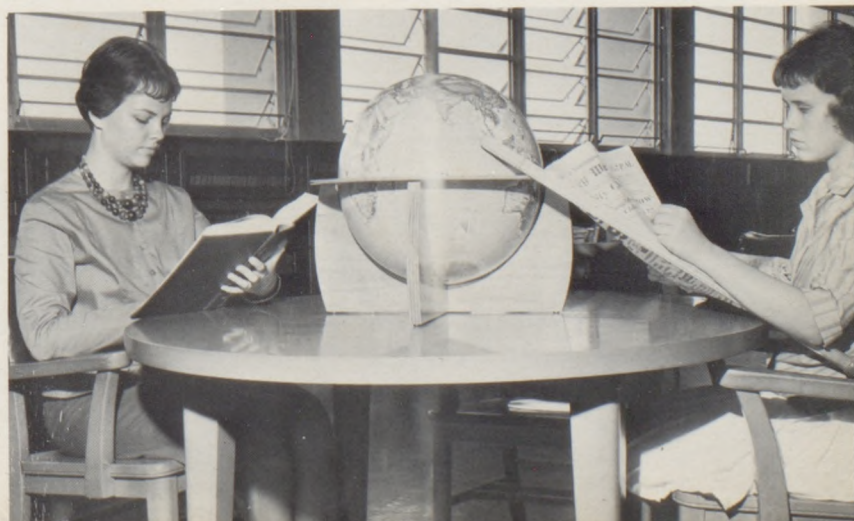


On October 6, the city fathers turned their offices over to the participants of Girl's Day, 1961.

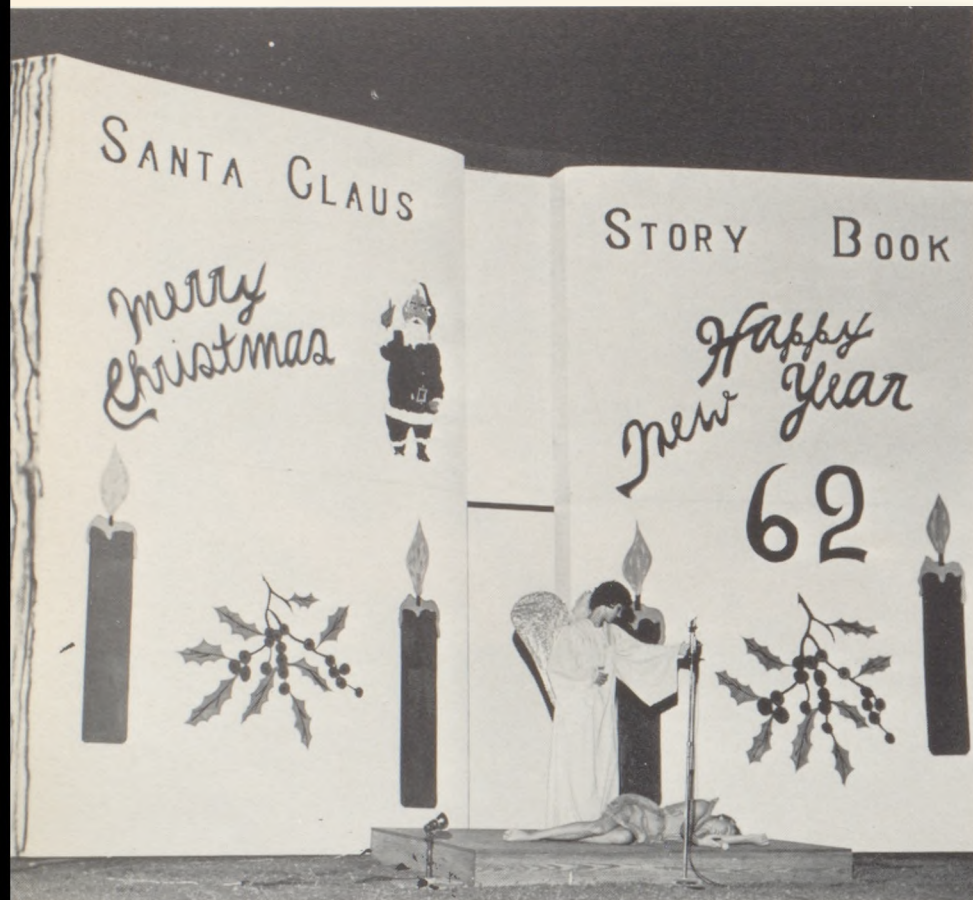

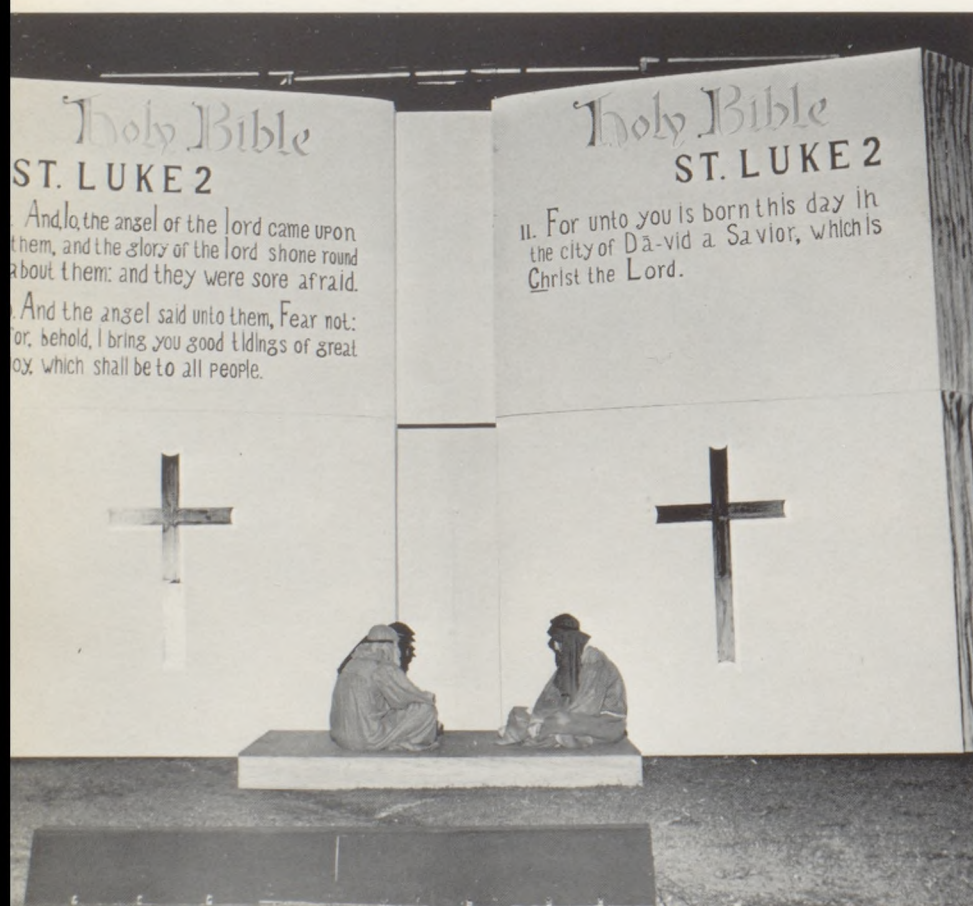

Christmas Book Spectacular

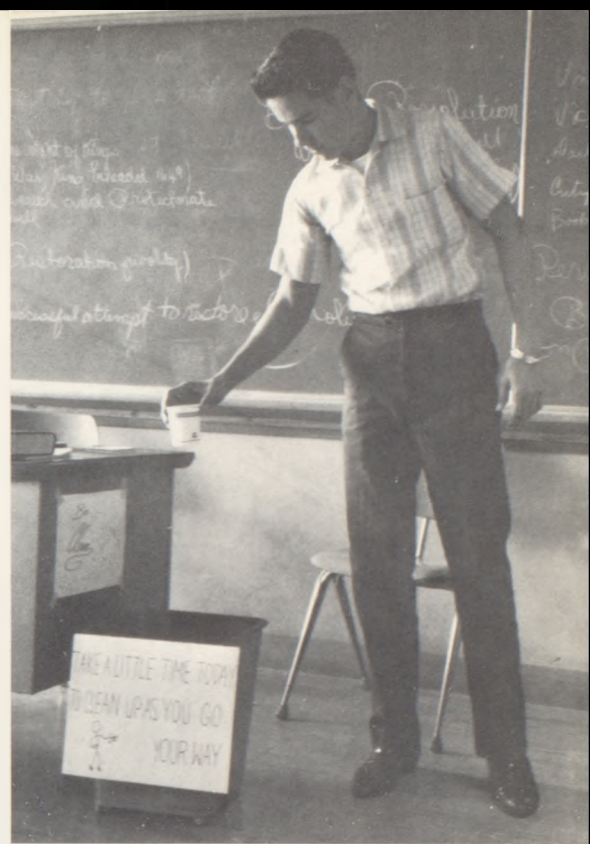
This year's pageant presentation "The Christmas Book" was a tremendous success drawing over three thousand people. The show was divided into two sections—the storybook and the secular.

The school board gave a special commendation to all participants. The chorus, band, majorettes, conchettes, and Senior English students helped to put on this seventh annual program.

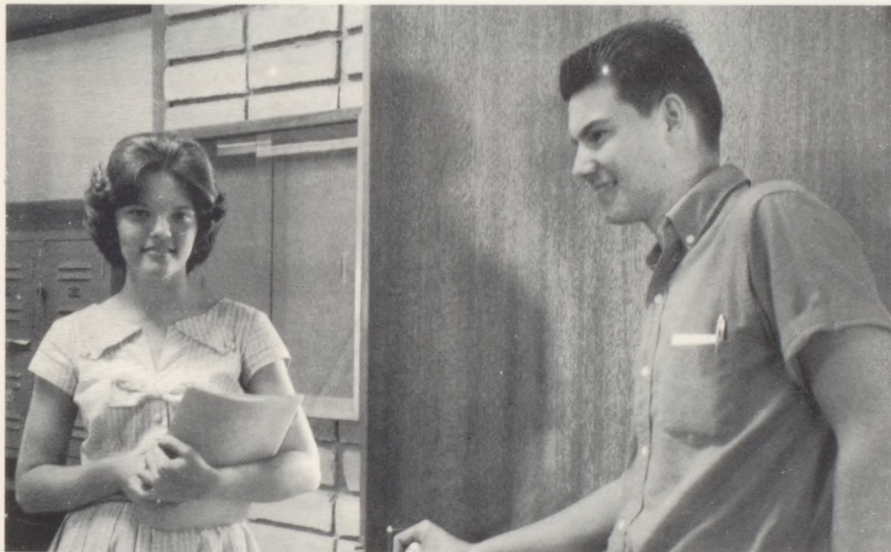

The Monroe County Fair was twice as good as last year's because of the new attractions and the many (over 125) educational, cultural, and commercial exhibits.

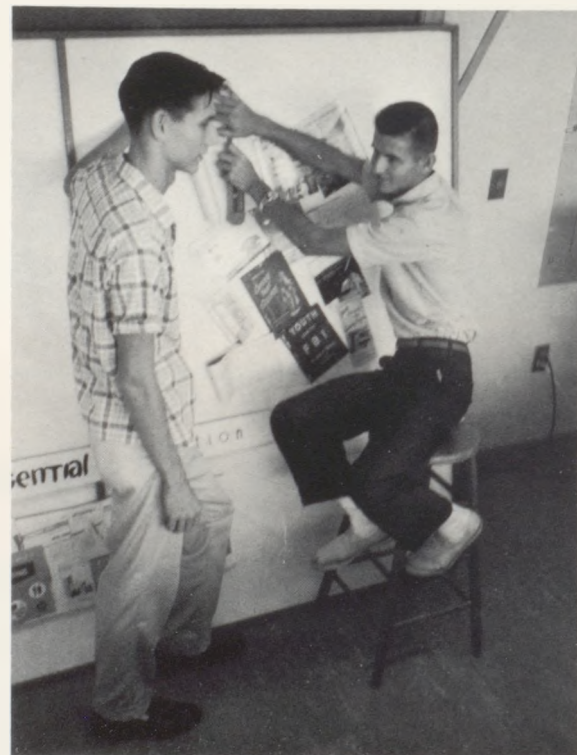
All schools participated in the fair, including our own KWHS. The theme of our exhibit was "Time to Decide on Essentials."

Student Government

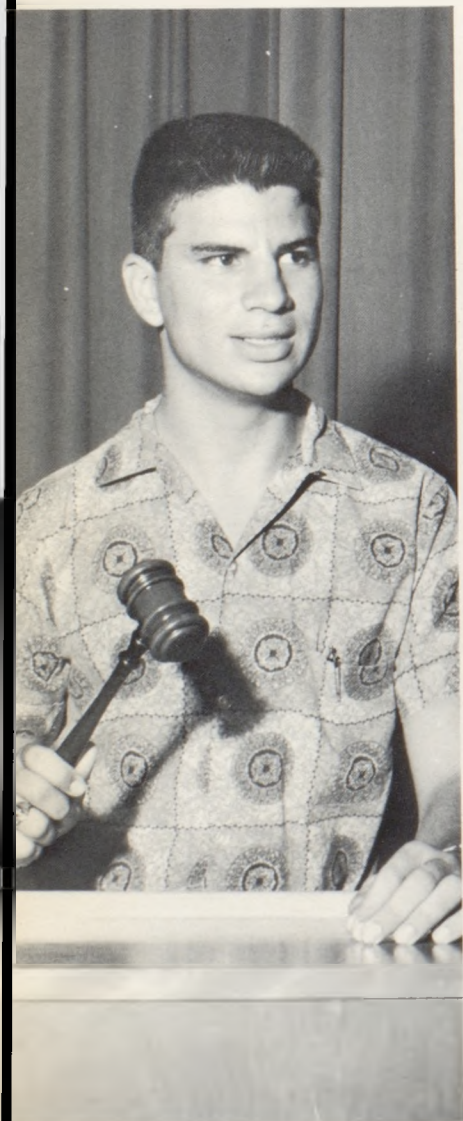
One of the most active organizations in our school is the Student Council. The Council serves as a go-between for the students, faculty, and administration. Its aim is to keep the school at its very best at all times.

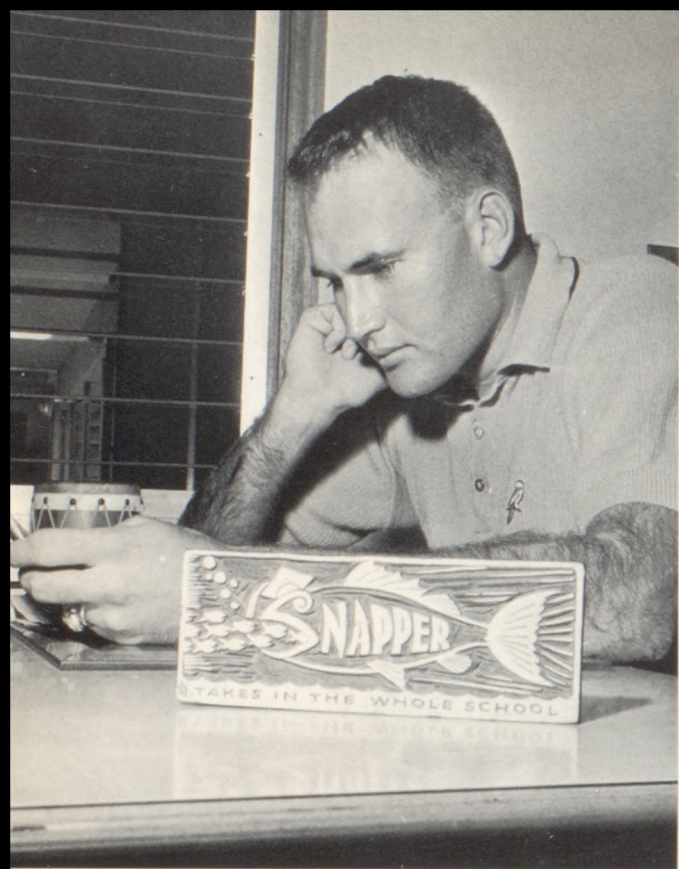

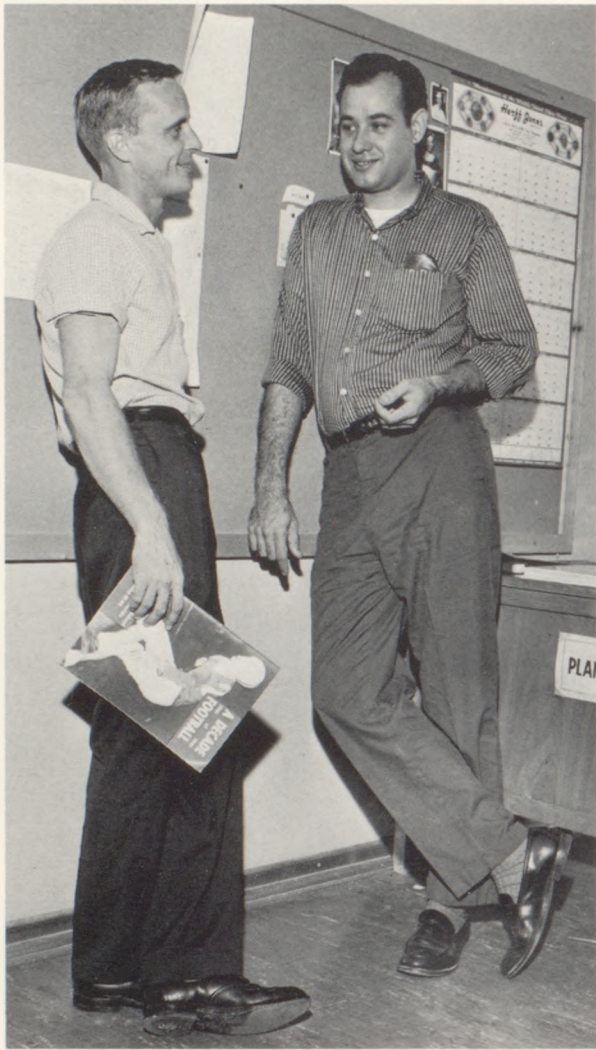
Information and Entertainment

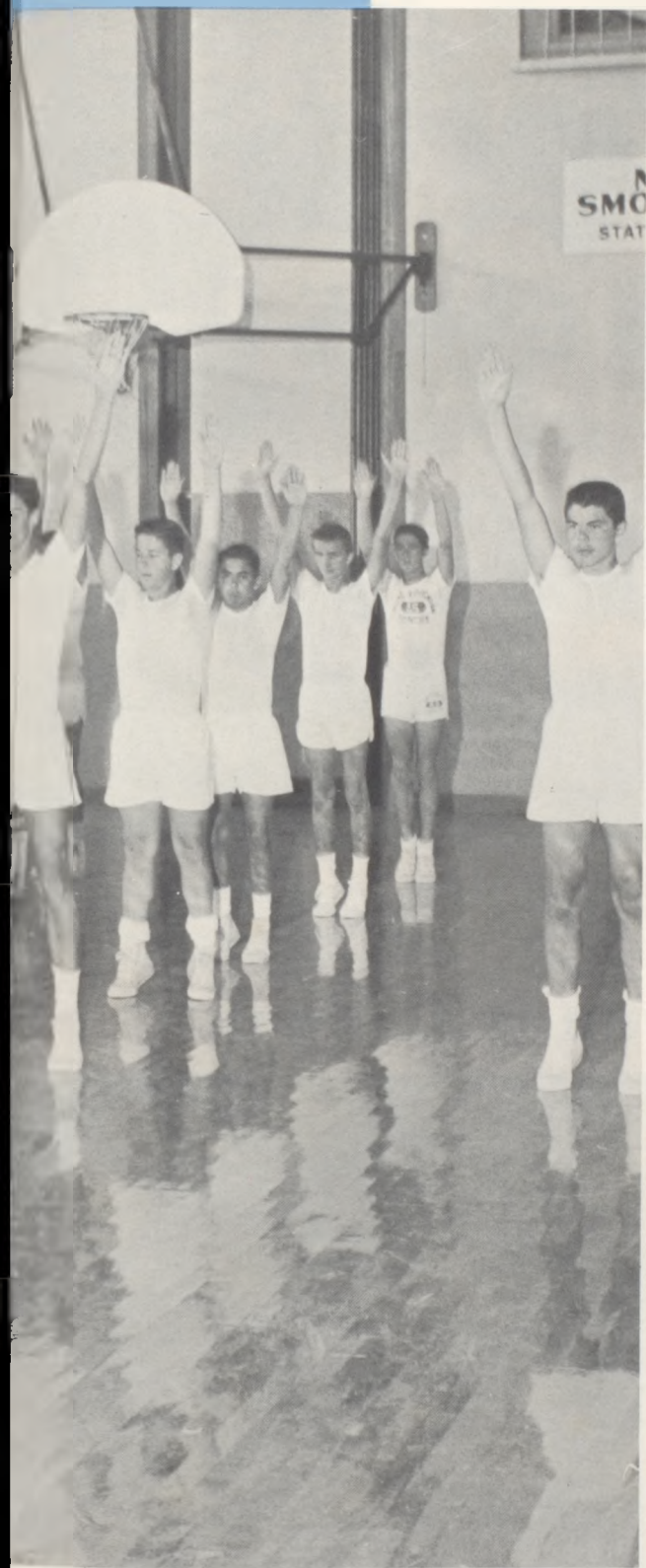

Conchs Chased Conference Crown

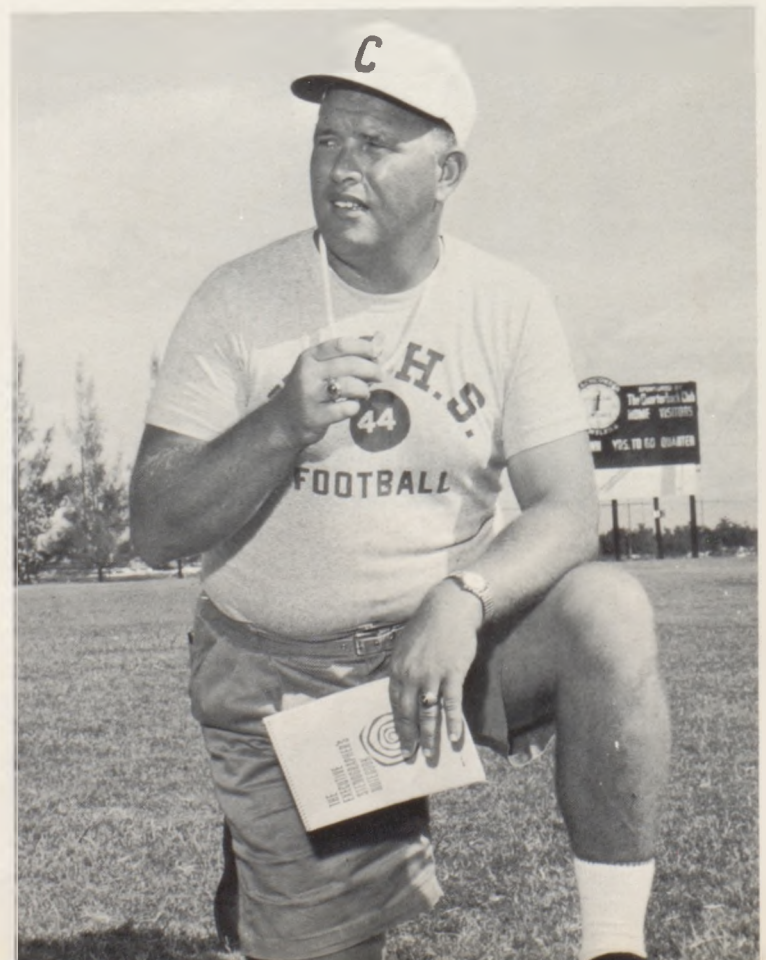

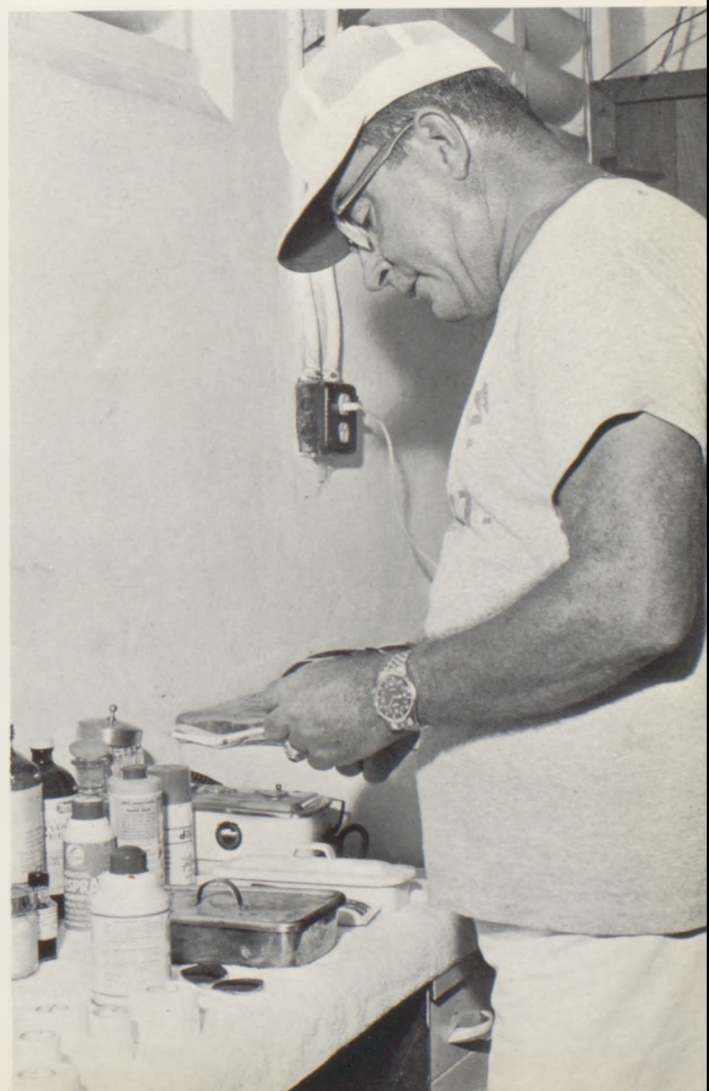

Graduation will be remembered as a serious parting, a parting that opened the door to a different life for the Class of '62, a life which will parallel the principles and ideals followed here.



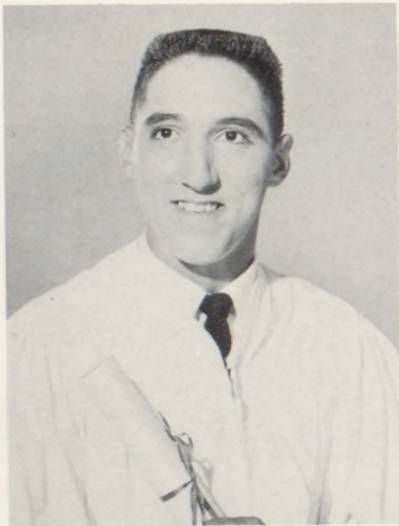
