










#### The Thinkers




The Key West High School concert chorus, one of the most colorful organizations on the campus, participates is a wide range of musical activities.






This year a ski club was formed at Key West High, to promote the popular sport, and to make equipment and facilities available to all members.




# Information and Entertainment


The outstanding game of the season was the mauling of arch-rival Southwest 26-0 with the tough defensive line in the forefront.




