The band, under the supervision of Mr. Higgins, provides the entertainment during half-time at the football games, presents various concerts, participates in parades, and attends the district and state contests.

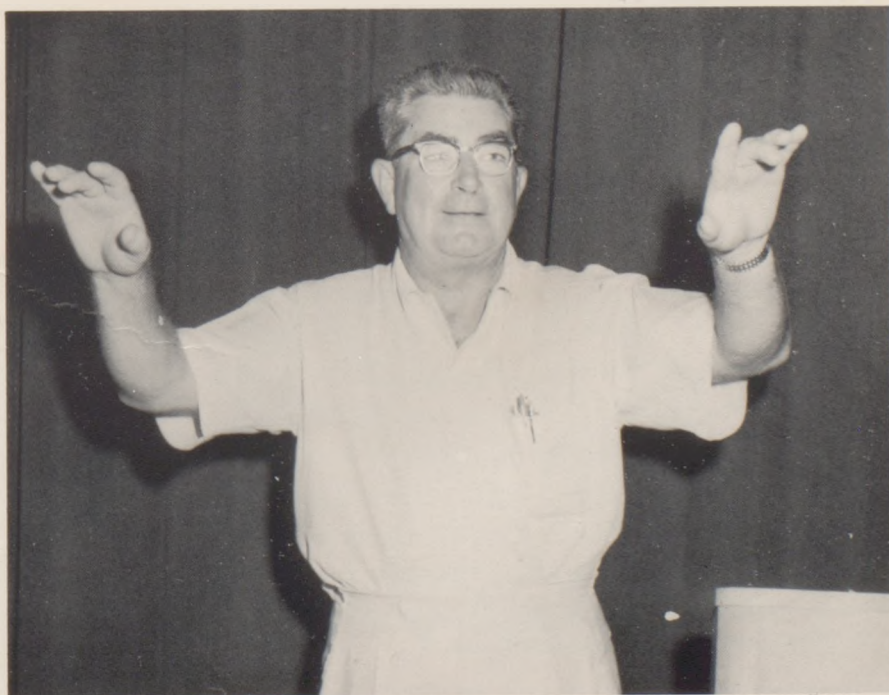

Excellent equipment and dedicated teachers help to prepare the homemakers and career women who will lead tomorrow's world.

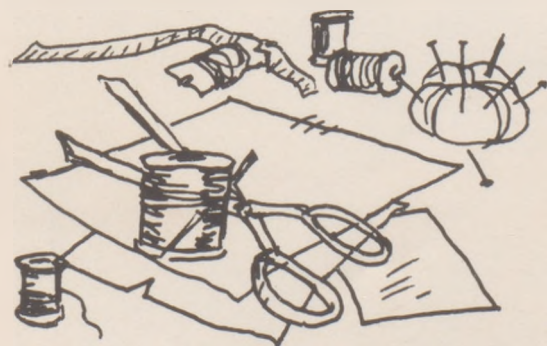

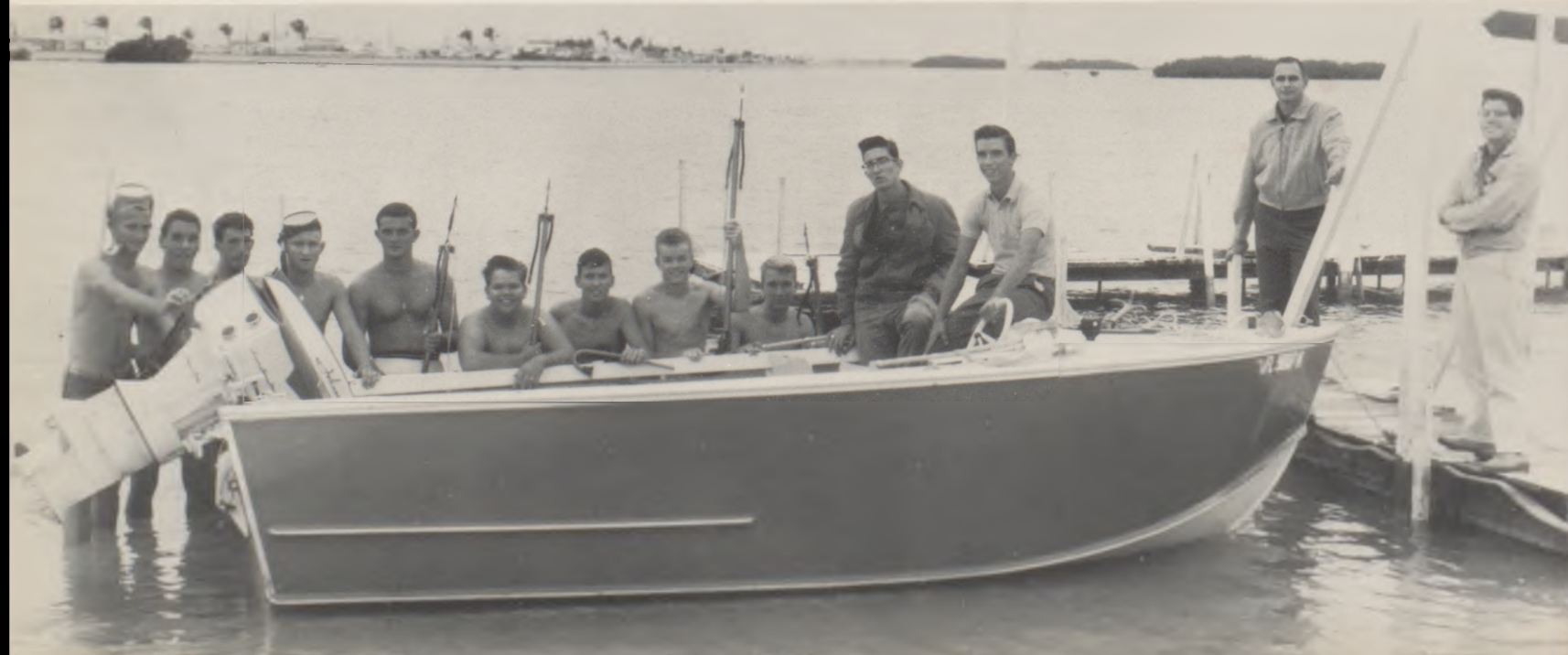
## Fish 'n Flippers

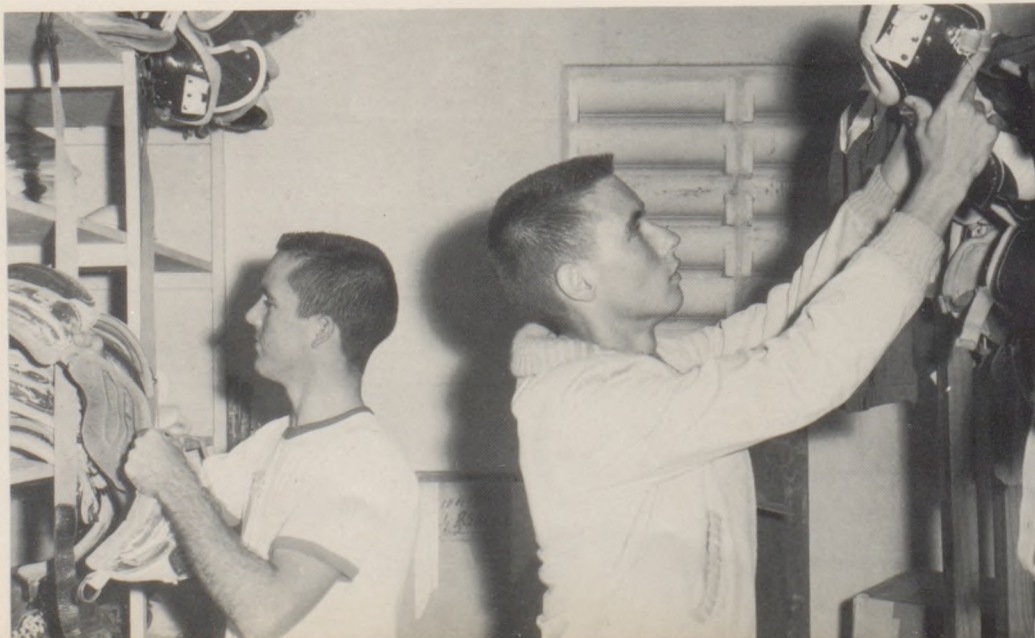
## Victories for Varsity
