


## Communication With Others






#### **Expressing Yourself!**

Representatives from training schools, colleges, universities, and various fields of service were invited to come.



This was the year basketball really paid off for KWHS. Our Conchs stormed through the Gold Coast Conference to their best record in years and third place in the Conference.


Often taking on teams taller than themselves they always showed a will to win — and most of the time they did!


# Beginning The Upward Climb
