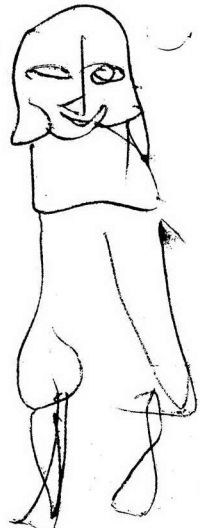

1. The seminar will take place during February 1 - May 31 1963 and everybody is expected to be participating during the whole period.
2. At the end of the seminar a diploma will be distributed to those participants, who have fulfilled claims put in the run of the seminar. *no van a graduarse! ¡Díctelo!*
3. All fixed hours for lectures and study visits should be kept precisely. This is a prerequisite to obtain the diploma.
