My dear Mr. Coe:

I am enclosing the clippings which I promised you. You will note that one of them says that the Wilcox Bill passed the House and I know you will be delighted. I think, as long as you have the office running, you should copy this clipping and sent it to all the members of the Commission, saying that I had asked to have it done. I have written Senator Andrews and Senator Pepper, urging them to do everything possible to secure the passage of the amendment in the Senate. I imagine they will take up the Wilcox amendment and shoot it through. The bill, without the amendment, as originally introduced by Senator Fletcher has already passed the Senate three times, you recall, so I imagine it will not be difficult to this ever now.

Did you get Mr. Dominick's and Mr. Axelroad's resignations? I do not believe the Governor is going to move until he gets them.

Please note the clipping in regard to the new National Park suggested by Lex Green - which I think is most unforntunate with the Everglades National Park question so decidedly unsettled. A great deal of this land suggested belongs to the Government already and it may be the Governor will much prefer this area. You will see what procrastination has done for the Everglades National Park, I fear, before we get through with the whole thing, if we ever do. I must say I don't like the complications.
