Mr. Meyer is not, and has not been, in the employ of W.P.A., but in the employ of the Park Commission. It would surely be a misfortune to the Everglades National Park project, whoever may be in charge, should Mr. Meyer be left out of its activities or decide to withdraw himself.

We are attaching copy of excerpt from recent letter to Governor Cone.

The obtaining of records of abstract of titles to properties in Monroe County is already well advanced. Two knotty problems involved, no doubt, will be the paper-towns of Peinciana on the west coast and Pinecrest near the Tamiami Trail. Hundreds of townsite properties were purchased by the public in both of these locations, though in neither case were towns plotted out. It is to be hoped that some method of procedure can be worked out through which these townsite problems can be successfully handled notwithstanding.

Referring to the footnote P.S. to your letter, this was a product of the Park Association and was not sent out by me. I have asked Miss Hester Scott to reply.

We here have enjoyed several delightful rains quite recently. Seemingly, the dry spell from which Florida very generally has suffered is effectively broken in this section. We do hope that you have been equally fortunate.
