
He was in a very good humor when I left and seemed interested, although I fear he did not know much about the situation until I explained it to him.

I have enlisted some very influential people besides the Senators and Representatives, who have approached the Governor, urging him to sign the bill but from all of them I received the same answer, that he wants the resignations of the commissioners and officers. I think we must continue to have influential people send him telegrams, otherwise we may lose the Park entirely for Florida.

It has been a great pleasure to work with all of you and I regret exceedingly that this break in our association and work together has come and we can only hope for the best in regard to securing the National Park for Florida to which we have all given more or less of our time, energy and work.
