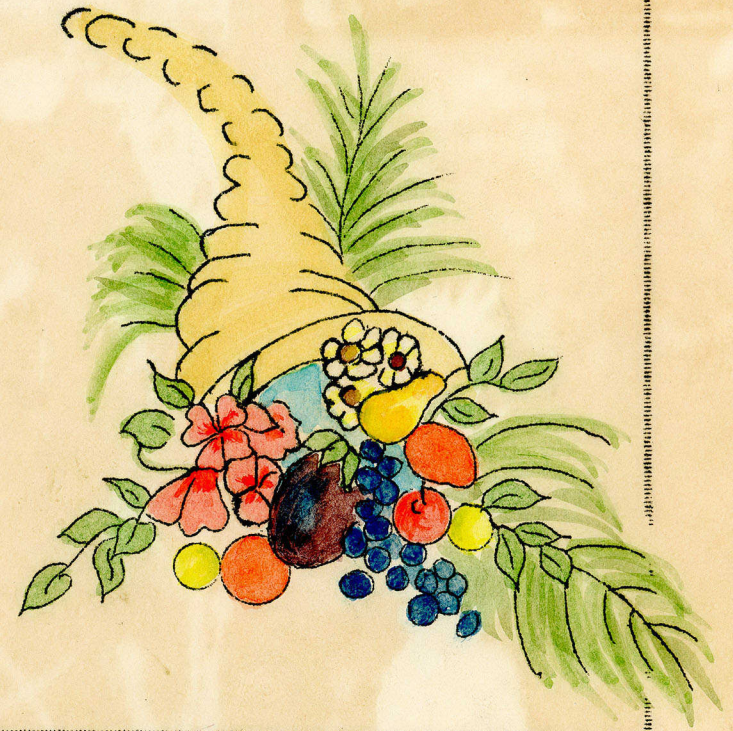

### RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

#### GENERAL RULES

1. Awards: Blue Ribbon (90 - 100); Red Ribbon (85 - 89); Yellow Ribbon (75-84): White Ribbon for Honorable Mention. Horticulture Division Class 1, Sec. B and Class 5 are eligible for the Award of Merit. Horticulture & Artistic Division are eligible for Sweepstakes Awards.
2. The Flower Show Committee regrets that it is unable in any way to be responsible for any entries. However, if entries are placed and removed according to time schedules, there will be no difficulty. It is recommended that container, etc., be inconspicuously marked.
3. Committee is privileged to remove any exhibit not in good condition.
4. Entries must be passed by the Classification Committee before the exhibitor leaves the floor. The Committee reserves the right to remove any exhibit not conforming to schedule.
5. Advance entries may be made by contacting Mrs. William Slattery, 221 NW 51st St., Ft. Lauderdale. Tel. LO 6-3186.  
Entries must be in place before 10 A.M. Tues., Apr. 2.

6. Exhibits may be removed after 9 P.M. Tuesday, April 2.
7. Plants protected by the law or those on the State Conservation list may not be used.
8. Competitive classes are open to members of the Broward Garden Club only.
9. Artistic Division Classes 2, 3, 4 and 5 specifying niches are to be staged in niches 24"W - 18"D - 24"H.

### ARTISTIC DIVISION

#### "A Tribute to the Gifts of Nature"

- Class 1. THE PALMS - "A Tribute to Our Giver."  
An arrangement with a religious theme.  
Palm foliage and fresh flowers to be staged on a pedestal. Limit 5 entries.
- Class 2. GREEN AWAKENING - "Nature's Gift of Song."  
An arrangement using all fresh foliage and BIRD accessories. To be staged in niches. Limit 5 entries.
- Class 3. KITCHEN KAPERS - "Nature's Gift of Plenty."  
An arrangement of crescent line design using foliage with fruits and/or vegetables, and displayed in a kitchen utensil. To be staged in niches. Limit 5 entries.
- Class 4. KEEPSAKES - "Nature's Gifts Preserved."  
A design using dried foliage, dried flowers and driftwood. To be staged in niches. Limit 5 entries.
- Class 5. CENTER OF ATTRACTION - "Nature's Gift of Beauty."  
An arrangement of Hogarth line design with fresh yellow flowers predominating, foliage permitted. To be staged in a niche. Limit 5 entries.

Class 6 CORSAGES - "Nature's Gifts of Adornment."

A - Corsage of fresh flowers. Limit 5 entries.

B - Corsage of dried materials. Limit 5 entries.

ACCESSORIES PERMITTED IN ALL CLASSES.

ARTISTIC DIVISION RULES

(Check General Rules)

1. Each exhibitor is permitted only one entry in each class.
2. No artificial or dried materials may be used unless the schedule so states. There is no restriction as to clipping, trimming, or tearing plant materials.
3. Entries in artistic division must be accompanied by a card naming all plant material used.
4. Exhibits must contain only freshly cut plant materials except in Classes 4 & 6, Sec. B.

CLASS 1. "POTTED PLANTS"

- A. - Flowering Plants - Any meritorious specimen not on the conservation list. All but Bromeliads must be in bloom.
- B. - Foliage Plants - any meritorious specimen.

CLASS 2. "SUCCULENTS AND CACTI"

- A. - Single specimen.
- B. - Dish garden.

CLASS 3. "CUT SPECIMENS OF SHRUBS"

CLASS 4. "CUT FLOWERS"

- A.- Bulbs and Bulbous types s
- B.- Annuals
- C.- Perennials (Herbaceous or woody)

CLASS 5. "ROSES" - 1 stem or 1 spray, classed and sub-classed as to kind, variety and color.

HORTICULTURAL DIVISION RULES

(Check General Rules)

1. Uniform containers for cut specimens will be provided by the Committee.
2. All horticultural entries must have been grown and cared for by the Exhibitor for at least three months.
3. No foliage other than that growing on the stem of the specimen exhibited may be used.
4. Entries in the Horticulture Division must be accompanied by a card with the specimen name.
