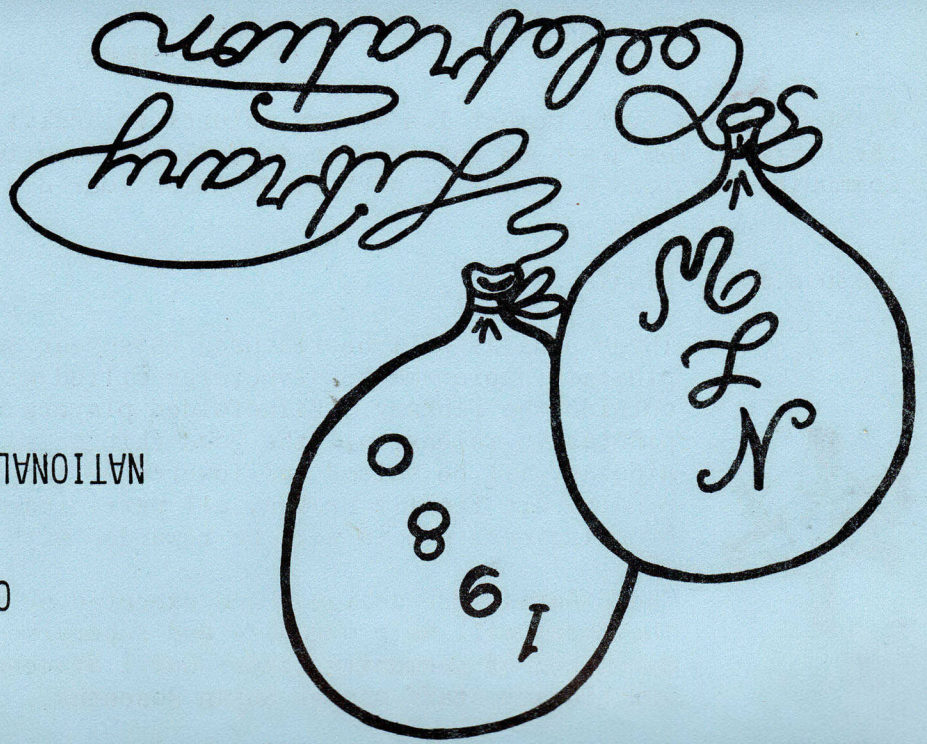

ART, FLOWERS AND MUSIC

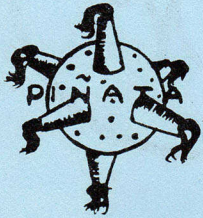

While priority is given to local residents, a number of artists not living or working within Oakland Park have been invited to participate.
- \* FLOWER ARRANGEMENT      Original creations by members of the Broward Garden Club will be on display around the Library all day and throughout National Library Week, April 13-19, 1980.
- \* MUSIC                      Murray Ferguson, local lecturer and member of the Bermuda Club, will present Adventures in Music from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Mr. Ferguson will use his wide angle sound projection system for a new dimension in musical reproduction.

- BOOK SALE                  A book sale sponsored by the Oakland Park Library League will be held from 10 a.m. through 3 p.m. at the Woman's Clubhouse directly across from the Library on 37th Street. Each book sale purchase of \$3 or more will entitle the buyer to a free weather-proof book bag, while they last. The proceeds of the sale will be donated to the Oakland Park Library.
- BAKE SALE                  A bake sale sponsored by the Oakland Park Woman's Club will begin at 11 a.m. Small items such as cookies, as well as larger items such as cakes, will be available. The proceeds of the sale will be donated to the Library.

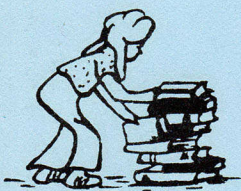
10:30 a.m. PIÑATA

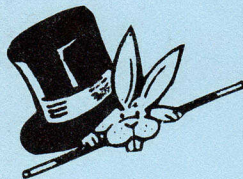

2:00 p.m. BOOK BALANCING CONTEST



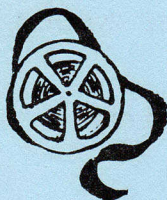

3:30 p.m. FILM PROGRAM



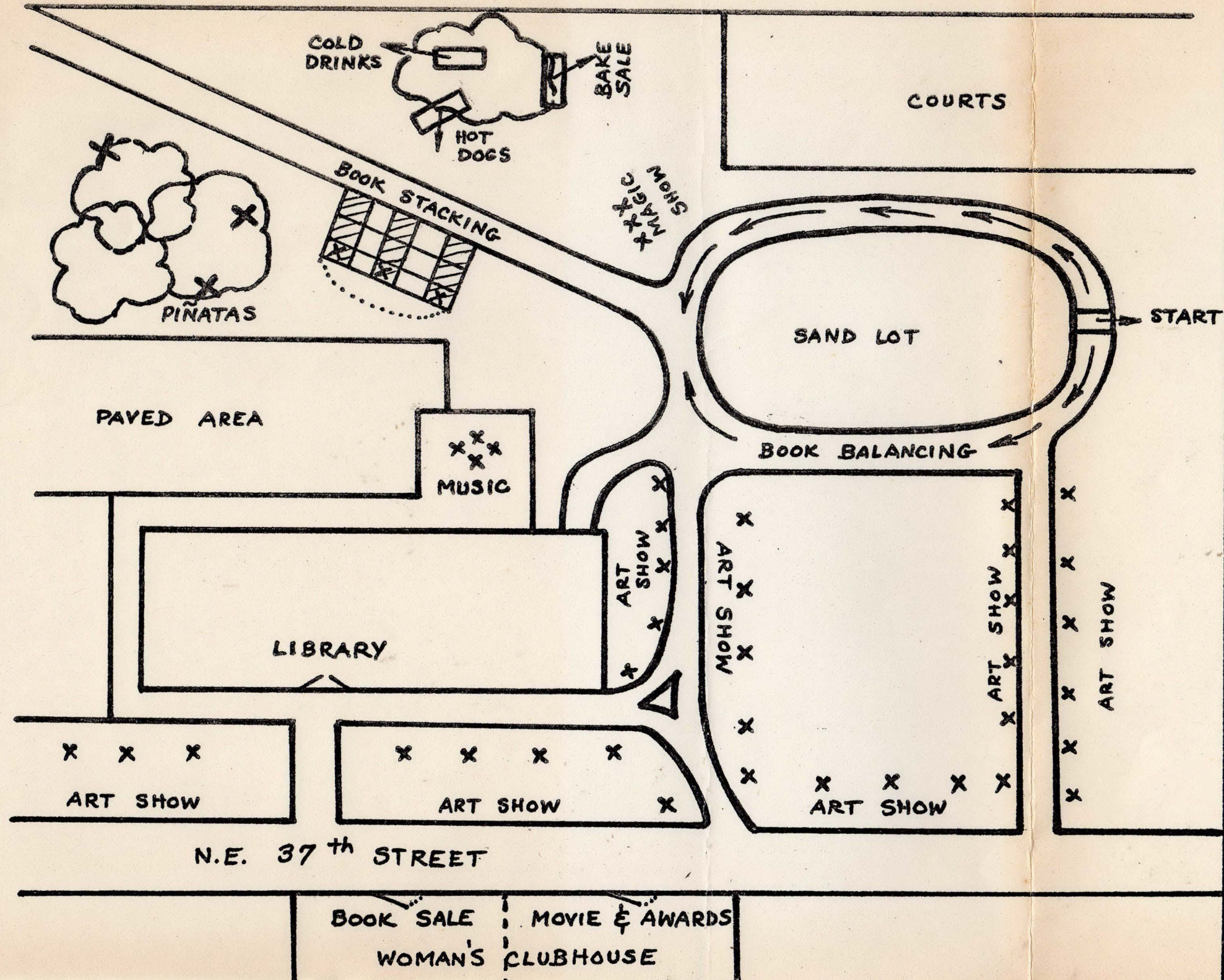
This comedy cartoon program will bring laughter to young and old alike. It will include the following features:
