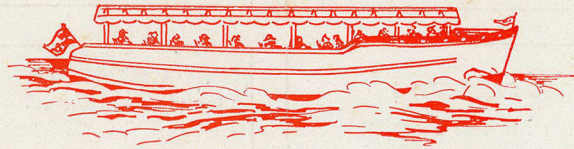

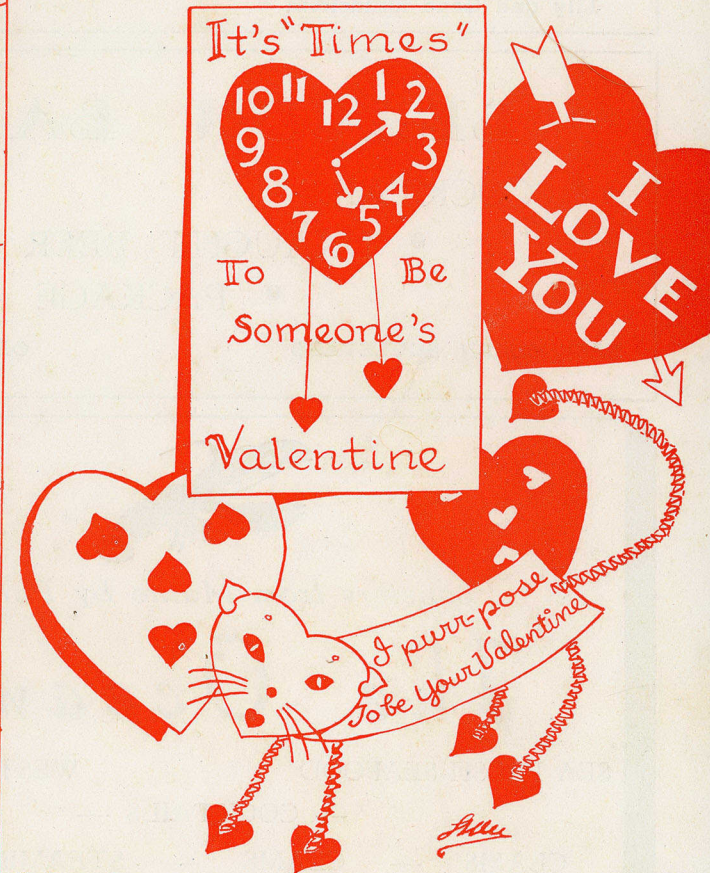

JETTY WINS APPROVAL

A new 150-foot jetty at the south side of the Hillsboro inlet has been approved for construction by a representative of the U. S. Army Engineering Corps.

Dan Garnsey, local boatman, stated that the engineer, R. B. Hodges of the Miami Beach district office, approved the proposal after inspecting the inlet, but could promise no financial assistance from the government, but will give the fullest cooperation otherwise.

This proposed jetty should eliminate the formation of sandbars at the mouth of the inlet and build up the south beach.

With the recent removal of sunken ships in the inlet water drains more freely, but sandbars will again form unless the jetty is constructed to prevent sand from being washed back into the basin.

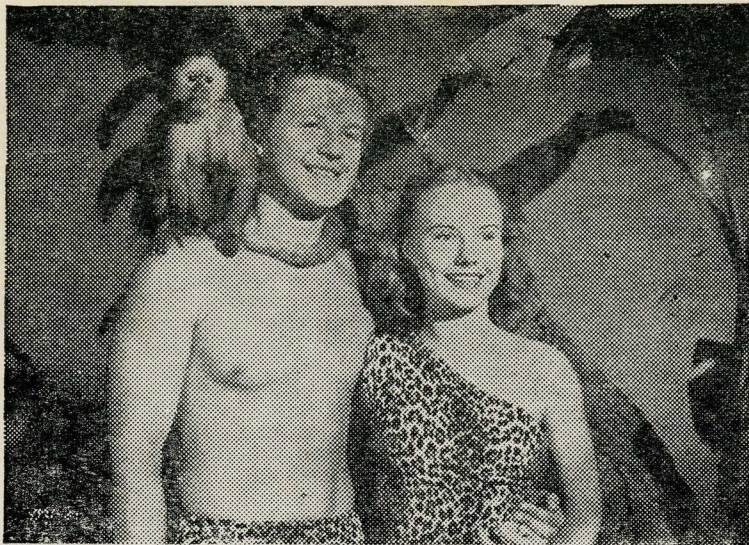
