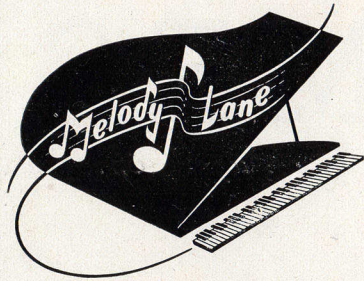

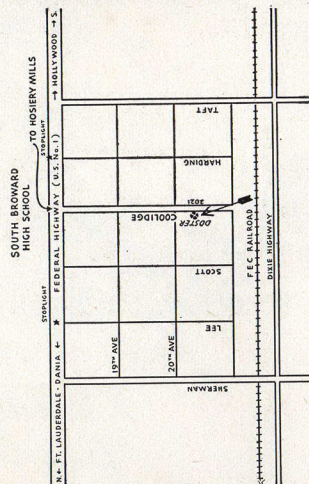

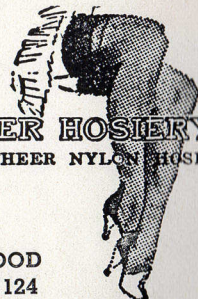

WILL YOU OPEN THE WINDOW PLEASE?

Since it is not like us to pass up the hurricane season, and since we happened to reread an old article by Ruth Brenner published several years ago, we have decided to repay our respects to the big winds by reprinting it in this issue.

Now that hurricane season is with us, the fundamental difference between my husband's and my own reaction to storms, weather and otherwise is again brought home to me. From where I sit, this difference is just another of those unexpected chasms, stretching across the wildly rocky road trod by patient (and not so patient) husbands and wives in their search for the peaceful Plains of Understanding.

Never have the pitfalls of this road been so clearly emphasized for me as they were in October, 1948, less than two weeks after the passing of the "Oxcart Special" — a slow moving hurricane which had lumbered up the peninsular, scattering grapefruit limes, avocados, oranges and lemons in leisurely abandon.

It had taken plenty of hard work, with proportionate grumbling, but Florida was again shipshape. The fruit punch had been quietly disposed of, shutters were down and packed away, dangling limbs sawed from many a leaning

tree, poles were being replaced quickly and efficiently, telephones and electrical equipment worked normally.

At our house, all DC's (displaced coconuts) with accompanying dead palm fronds, had been carted away. The leak in the roof was mended, our living room rug dry once more. Entire contents of one clothes press had been sorted into four piles marked "Wet," "Not So Wet," "Mildewed" and "Ugh," and each pile dried, aired, cleared or discarded, according to label.

With a sigh of relief, we were about to settle ourselves comfortably for another year of perfect weather.

But hush! What was this the Miami Weather Bureau was saying? Oh, no! Alas, Mr. Norton remained quite firm about it.

"Hoist hurricane warnings," he insisted, "... on the East Coast from Miami to Fort Pierce . . .

small but dangerous storm . . . stand by for further announcements." The Little Whizzer was on its way.

Well, we scattered to well known tasks in familiar slashing rain squalls. From an isolated whacking here and a lonely banging there, swelled the full hammering crescendo of a community intent on boarding up and getting in and out of the rain—a sound that always starts little prickles along the spine.

Splashing barefooted down to the grocery for supplies, drenched and disgruntled, with wind whipped rain half blinding me I though how unadaptable I must be. For to me, it was still sheer madness to duck breathlessly into a boarded up store, wipe the rain out of one's eyes and inquire, "Do you think we'll get a storm?"

It's raining and blowing hard enough now, I reflected, to



but ever mind. I've been over this before. There is only one storm in South Florida. That is the heaviest part of the winds from the north east sector of a hurricane. Well, I collected my extra loaves of bread, canned foods, coffee, candles, kerosene and milk. Returning home, I found that Sam had the storm shutters up, loose objects secured, and the children were joyously tracking sand and water through the house, helping Daddy. As they sloshed about, they chattered happily over the arrival of this new storm on a school day. What heavenly luck!

So far, you will note that my husband and I have seen eye to eye on this thing. And so we continue to do so for a time. When I prepared supper, Sam completed the last of our preparations, filling lamps with kerosene, checking flashlights, exhorting the girls to run water into the tubs.

Mixer was chilling in the refrigerator, enough food for ten extra people was piled here and there about the kitchen. We had brought in a box for the dog, which now unfortunately contained a pair of wet rubber boots with a rain coat hung ingeniously above so that its dripping was caught in one upright boot. (I didn't know it then, but our bedraggled pup was sound asleep in the basket of clean clothes.)

There were hammer, a saw, nails, neatly set out in rows all

right, but a pitfall when one attempted to get to the cupboard.

We also had ten large bouquets of hibiscus and oleander which Toni had gathered in order to cheat the winds of them, and there were two dish pans full of guavas Joyce thoughtfully supplied to "eat with salt, while we play Hearts."

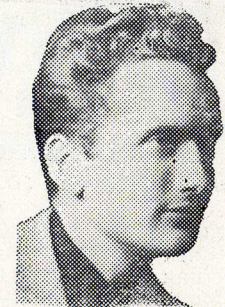

PALM TREES

Of the infinite varieties of palms the coconut is perhaps the most fascinating. The place of its origin is unknown. Legend has it that the seeds of the trees here washed

ashore after the wreck of a coconut ship, the *Providencia*, in 1878.

Although of little commercial value here except for souvenirs, coconuts bear profusely. The seed, which comes from the nut, germinates in about five months and the trees do not bear until they are from six to eight years old. Thereafter healthy trees produce from 25 to 100 coconuts yearly. Contrary to popular belief, the tree's leaning habit is natural rather than caused by the prevailing trade winds.

Other popular palms are the royal, traveler's, bamboo, date, cabbage and petticoat species.

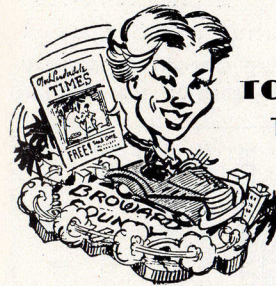

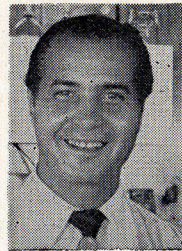
