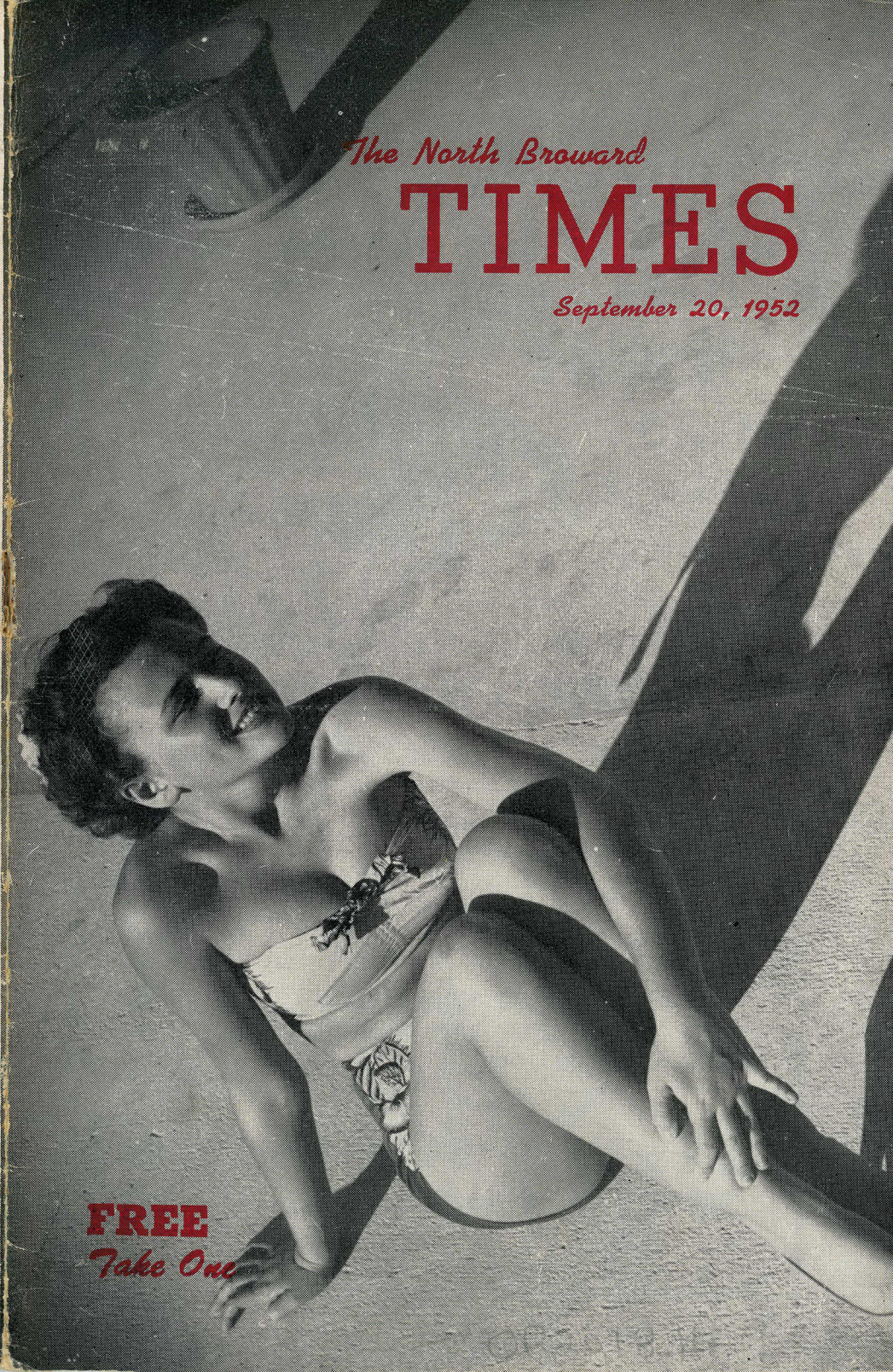

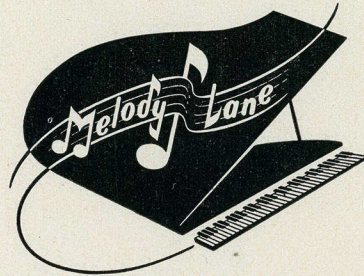

One kind of fertilizer is much the same as another to our friend (what am I saying?); it does splendidly with none at all. Wet seasons or dry do not inconvenience the thin leaved par-

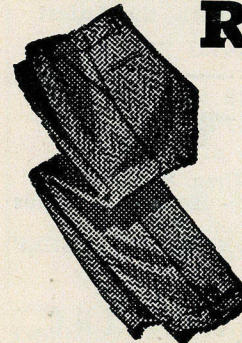

Regardless of the mistakes, the poor judgment, or just plain "cussedness" on my part, she has looked at me with only an expression of love and understanding. Dad, however, often had another look.

Webster's new International Dictionary states that tolerance is "The act or practice of or capacity for bearing hardship and suffering — endurance — now rare. You will note that they end the definition with — now rare. Of course we know there are many exceptions but on the whole, the average individual is not at all inclined toward tolerance, possibly because of inferiority. A lack of tolerance toward his fellow man gives him temporarily, a lift. However, after a short space of time when he mulls over in his mind this judging of others, naught but a sense of shame ensues. When man begins to show tolerance toward his fel-

low beings, then alone will we know that this civilization has been saved, for *tolerance is one of the bulwark's of man's spiritual house.*

The most tolerant being that any of us has ever heard of is, of course, Christ. He exemplifies this wonderful characteristic. Possibly the writing of this article will do me more good than the friends who read it. I often feel so about things going into these little articles as they are brought powerfully to my mind.

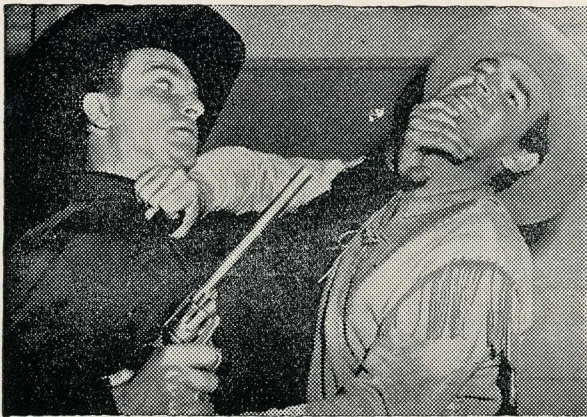
