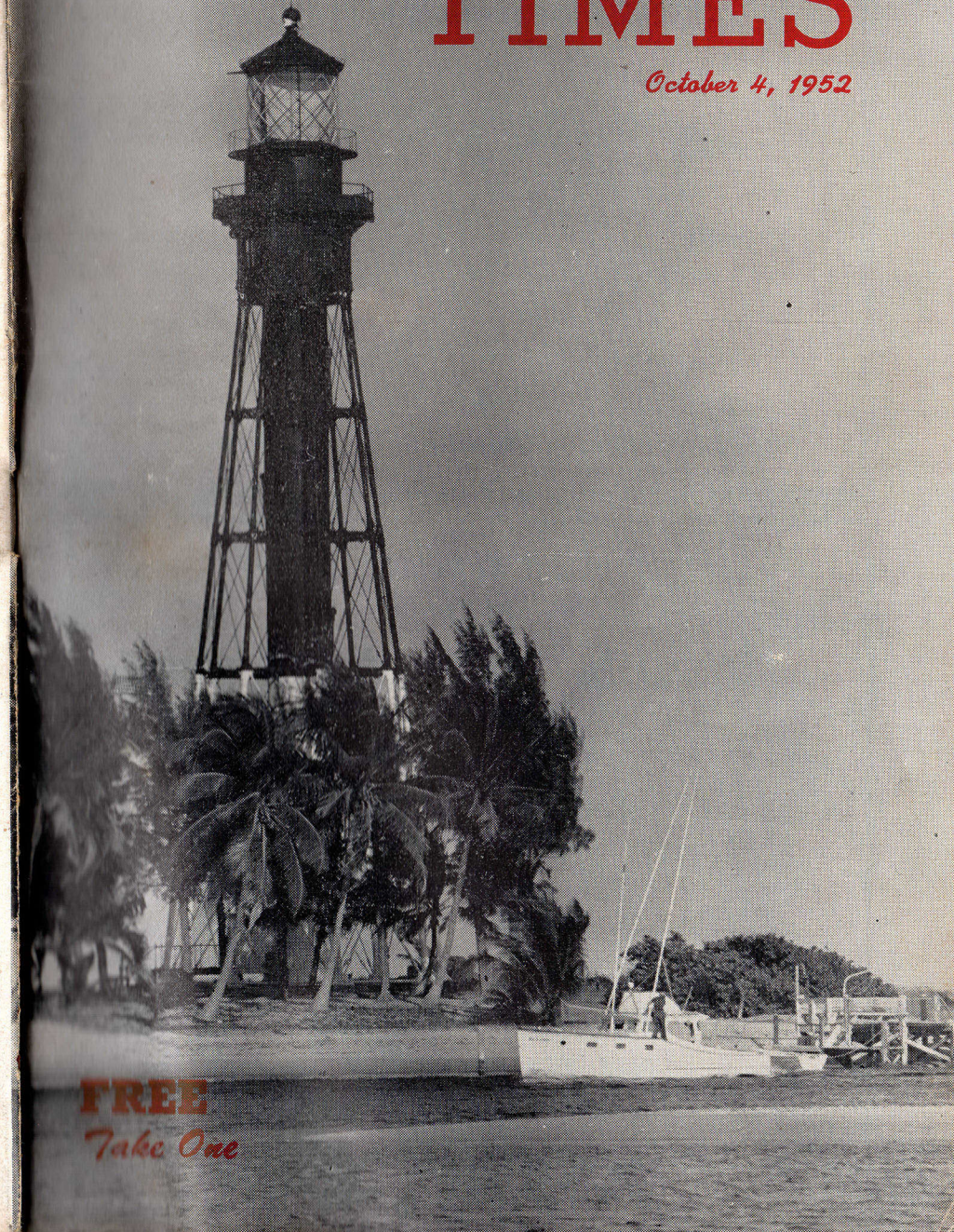

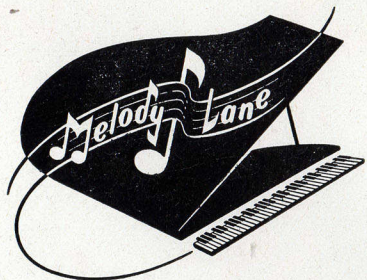

CULTURAL PLANS CENTER ON ORCHESTRA

A new era of culture will be born soon in the resort city of Fort Lauderdale.

With its three-year-old symphony orchestra serving as the keystone, the city's cultural program will be expanded during the coming winter season to include ballet, opera and even art.

"We expect to perform no miracles overnight but have in the making a long-range plan to use the orchestra as a means of coordinating the whole aspect of culture in the community," declares Vasilov Priakos, the orchestra's new and first professional conductor.

Priakos developed a similar program during 10 years as associate conductor of the Oklahoma City symphony. Prior to affiliating here, he assisted with a specialized project at Columbia University in

which the effect of music in daily living is being studied.

The results of that study will be applied in integrating the symphony orchestra in the community and resort life of Fort Lauderdale. Priakos will have William Revio, who conducted the orchestra last year, as his associate.

The new conductor pointed out, in announcing his program, that qualified amateur musicians would be welcome to try out for the symphony, which starts rehearsals in October. The first of four regular subscription concerts is scheduled in early December.

In addition, the orchestra will present two matinee concerts for school children and will accompany the famed Fort Lauderdale community chorus in its annual "Messiah" cantata at Christmas.

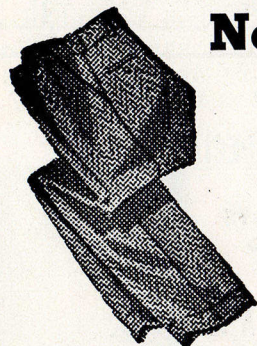

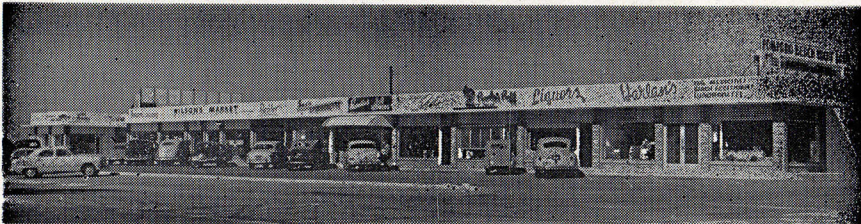
