MIAMI'S NOTORIOUS "Torture Doctor"-Dr. T. Earl Moore, whose "front" is a so-called psychiatric elinic at 4825 S. W. Eighth street (Tamiami Trail)-last Monday reputedly knocked down a boy-patient of his with a wrench, inflicting injuries so severe that he grew alarmed and called upon his long-time pal and confederate, Dr. S. E. Chambers, to come out and sew the boy's head up.

MIAMI LIFE interviewed the boy. We saw the threeinch cut in his head-saw for ourselves the bruises he had suffered at the hands of this racketeering M. D., who is making a fortune out of his pseudo-psychiatric racket.

This boy's parents are wealthy people-but, like so many of Dr. Moore's victims-were misinformed and illadvised as to Dr. Moore's training, background, and sordid record. Until a week or two ago they were paying out \$150 weekly to get the boy the mental care that they had been led (Continued on Page 8)

THE STORY has come to us that in the summer of 1947 Dr. Moore stripped a 13-year-old girl, took her out into his yard, nude, and chained her to a dog house.

He runs across an article in Consumers Reports warning of the danger in fluorescent lights, of the poisonous powder and fumes that may be let loose if the glass is broken. 



RIGHTS OF CITY SUPERCEDE ALL OTHERS IN CONSIDERING REMOVAL OF F.E.C. STATION

Hon. Robert L. Floyd, Mayor Miami, Fla. My Dear Mr. Floyd:

I was in earnest Wednesday in discussing before your body, the FEC new station. It is best to face problems in all their ramifications which must include the obstacles. The easiest way is never the best way. This problem is similar to those that have confronted other cities. The city grows up and at the same time the railroad grows up. It then becomes necessary to revamp the whole structure. That time is present in Miami.

If I was a railroad man (and I once was) and operating the FEC, certainly I should present as many obstacles as possible in opposition to Miami's plans for meeting this problem, with the idea of saving the railroad expense in the inevitable transition-always hoping that the city would not think of too many ways to embarrass the railroad.

There is one absolute fact which cannot be ignored: Conditions in Miami demand, without compromise, the elimination of railroad tracks from our main business center. Obviously this cannot be done overnight, but, even so, a start must be made. Then it will be years before we could possibly rid ourselves of the network of service tracks which stretch paralysingly across our arterial streets and boulevards. These tracks must, of necessity, be left until the removal of the industries can finally be accomplished. Meantime, the switching operations car be relegated to the hours of night when they will interfere least with the city's progress. and adhered to. All the blather about a new station is secondary. When a new location has been allocated, we will then automatically get a new station. What we want is relief from the strangulation of traffic we are suffering by reason of our already too narrow streets being 4015 Irvington Avenue. continually blocked by the putting together and starting out, and the receiving and taking apart of long passenger trains (which by the way, will never get any shorter) which extend over five or six streets while such movements are in progress. It is academic to say that it is just these conditions which daily scramble our already badly snarled traffic. After the paralyzing effect of operating a big railroad terminal in the heart of the city have been eliminated, our traffic experts will still have plenty to do with the problem of street congestion.

ailroad is finally adjudicated, the service of some out. standing transportation man will be obtained to operate it. He too may be expected to make demands. The city should meantime have formulated its plans and be even more demanding. Of course there will be a battle. Miami,

however, is in just as powerful position to enforce its demands in the interests of its citizenry as will be the bondholders, et al. If this problem is to be solved in the best interests of Miami and its future, it will certainly entail a fight. Nothing is to be gained by being timid of what the opposition might do. Those opposing the city's interest will do plenty, but even those powerful interests canot deprive Miami of its rights under the laws of the land to demand free usage of its streets and to regulate speed within the city limits, mindful of the safety of its citizens. Those rights can certainly be maintained if the city's interests are courageously defended, regard-

less of who is objecting. In the present circumstance, the city of Miami has no recognized agency with which it may deal in the solution of this problem. Therefore it seems logical for the city to consider the problem solely as it relates to Miami and be firmly established on that basis when there appears a responsible agency with which it can deal. Then will be the time to negotiate always on the fundamental demand that the railroad tracks be removed from our principal thoroughfares.

I am not promoting any particular location for the new terminal, except that it seems that nothing south of 62nd street (where the cut-off starts) could be considered in the intrests of the future development of the city. 





to believe he needed.

He got to beating her with his fists. On one occasion he was seen knocking her clear across her bedroom.




