



### Only Five Ocean Sites Left For Beach Hotels

When projects already under construction or committed are completed, only five more oceanfront hotels can be built on Miami Beach between the White House at 15th Street and the Deauville at 67th Street.

One of the sites face on the Promenade (old Miami Beach Drive) between 25th and 26th Streets and is not actually on the oceanside. Miami Beach City Council is being urged to buy 350 feet of the frontage for public bathing facilities, there being none except street ends between 23rd Street and the Firestone Estate at 44th Street.

In addition to this tract, sites still available for oceanfront hotels along the strip mentioned are:

1. One hundred feet immediately south of the Tatem Hotel;

2. The southeast corner of 43rd Street;

3. The south side of Lincoln Road at the ocean;

4. Two lots immediately south of the Rio Hotel, 6301 Collins Ave.






