(First mention I have seen of him)

Oct 20, 1899

Mea Metrop Vol 7<sup>th</sup> 24, Oct 20, 1899, p 8

Mention of Dr. Dupuis sweet potato patch  
"finest potato patch for its size in the  
County"

Have seen 3 mentions of DuPuis as going  
fishing - once got 2-6 foot shucks + once wet.  
Also going dove shooting

"Dr. Dupuis has moved his drug store  
into W.W. Moran's store on Lamon Ave."

Miami Metropolis Vol 5<sup>#</sup> 40 Aug. 9, 1901 p 8

"Dr. De Luis is having his ten acre lot, on the rock road, cleared and pegged for a orange grove. We also hear he will build a neat residence on his place, at no distant future."

Lenon City Items

"Our merchants Dr. De Luis & Co. and  
D. R. Knight & Bro. are getting a large  
quantity of seasonable goods for the fall  
and winter. . . ."

Oct 1915

From: Minutes of the DCMA, Minute Book 1915 thru 192  
— obtained from DCMA office

Meeting Oct 21, 1915

Dr. Smitzoff officiating; Dr. C. F. Sayles, secty.  
(written in long hand apparently by Sayles)  
Mentions Dr. DuPuis presenting a case of heart  
ruptured aortic aneurysm "with specimen of heart  
and aorta."

An Early Autopsy

Sept 21, 1916

Meeting of DCMA at office of Dr. Sayles  
(DCMA Minute Book 1915-1925)

Dr. DuBois presents an infant of 10 mo - (apparently)  
hypertrophic pyloric stenosis. Apparently

DuBois had the pathological specimen.

Dr. Jackson stated he had seen many of them  
"in the City."
