Established East Coast Advocate @ Titusville
1890; - sold 1896 + moved to Miami
Established Miami Metropolis - Miami's
1st newspaper - Edited it "about 2 yrs"
Named Miami the "Magic City"
Wrote 1st ordinances for the city and for
3 yrs was city atty. Survived by
wife + 3 sons: John, Ralph, Harold.
Graham was born Apr 28. 1857. Rahway, N.J.

"Dr. W. S. Gramling has located in Miami, and opened an office in the Hatchett building, next door to Col. Arno's office. Dr. Gramling is a graduate of the Alabama Medical College, and has practiced medicine at Greenville, Ala., for the past eight years. He is already quite well known in this end of the county, having spent some winters at Little River,

where he has an orange grove and other
interests. Dr. Grumling comes of one of the
old and most highly respected families of
Alabama, and is himself a most highly
esteemed young man, who will at once take
high rank socially and professionally."
