Gives his professional card as a physician and surgeon and dental specialist. Indicates that he is a specialist in genitourinary and diseases of women as well as all surgery, crown and bridge work. No address is given. A brief biography of this man appears in Haines and Thoburn, Seventy-Five Years of Dentistry, pp. 21-22. Does not mention his practicing in Miami but states he lived in Bartow and began his practice in 1905 and in 1912 moved to Arcadia where he was killed by accidental contact with an electrical wire while fluoroscoping a patient.

Born in Jan. 1880, in Butler, Pa.; graduated at U. of Penn Med. School, 1904; came to Ft. Lauderdale in 1910 (was the second physician there being preceded by Thomas S. Kennedy); served in the U.S. Navy 1917-1925; returned to Ft. Lauderdale and practiced until 1930; caught pneumonia and died in Ashtabula, Ohio in 1931.
