p. 102. Talbird arrives at Miami from New River on Aug. 9, and  
leaves walking the beach on Aug. 12.

p. 105. Aug 19, 1874: Talbird arrives in Miami - leaves Aug. 26.

This article mentions it is owned in part by Dr. J.N. Taylor, "An affable gentlemen and a competent and thorough physician and surgeon." It states his professional card appears in the Metropolis of that date but apparently the page it was printed on was not duplicated as I could not find it. I do find it in the issue of October 23rd, but there is no specification whether he is an M.D., an osteopath or a chiropractor. It lists him simply as "Dr. J.N. Taylor."
