He had been born in Berian County near Adele, Georgia, December 9, 1867, and received his M.D. degree at the Univ. of Georgia School of Medicine in Augusta.

He practiced in Adele for 22 years and came to Miami in 1921. He was appointed Superintendent of the Jackson Memorial Hospital in 1931 and served until 1940
