He served during the war between the states, was graduated by the Long Island Medical College in 1866 and on Sept. 12, 1866 married Miss Isabelle McCall, the daughter of Stephen McCall, one of Gainesville's pioneer residents. In early 1867 Dr. McKranstry practiced a short time as an associate of Dr. G. P. Thomas. In May of that year he announced that he had a building on the Town Square for rent, suitable for an office. That office apparently is the same one he occupied in 1872 on Liberty St., now Univ. Ave., near E. Main St., No., now NE First St. shown in figure 6. Affectionately known as

On this page appears a professional notice (according to the notes of E. A. Hammond which I copied) offering free vaccination to the "poor and indigent persons of Tallahassee and the adjacent country" under which the name of John McLemore appears. Hammond apparently adds an "M.D." in parenthesis. The notice indicates they should apply to the office of McLemore.

Location: Battle of Black Point

The editor mentions a Dr. McLemoure who at the Battle of Black Point Dec. 18, 1835 galloped up with 30 horsemen who then failed to obey his command to charge. This occurred at the time of an Indian ambush. He was forced to retreat with six killed and with eight wounded. No mention was made whether this was a physician but apparently he was a member of the Army during the Second Seminole Indian War.

He had two horses shot from under him and then proceeded on foot "with sword in hand." When he realized he had no support, he retreated and escaped without wounds. Above on this same page M'Lemore is spoken of as "Captain" and a statement is made that ~~h~~ implies he was in command of the 30 man detachment.
