Palmer: Physicians of Early Tallahassee, Apalachee,
1944

He was a Methodist minister, as well as one of Tallahassee's early physicians,...lived at 131 N. Calhoun St., a house built for him in 1833. Had a drugstore and office in 'a low one story building with floor level with the sidewalk,' at 509 N. Monroe St. Was assisted by a son, Dr. Miles Henry Nash Jr. Evelyn Whitfield Henry writes of him: "There were times when his duties as a physician interfered with his duties as a pastor; sometimes he was called from the pulpit to usher a new soul into the world." Dr. Nash Sr. died in Tallahassee and Dr. Nash Jr. and his wife eventually moved to New York.

Practiced internal medicine and cardiology in Miami from 1925 until his death of leukemia June 24, 1970. Known for introducing the use of coumarin in therapy of myocardial infarction, organizing the cardiac section at the Jackson Memorial Hospital, founding the Miami Heart Institute and many other contributions.

Gadsden County

Member of the first medical Board of Florida, created by legislative act in January 1828 and appointed in November 1828.

Mentioned by Dr. A.W. Chapman as the one who encouraged him to come to Florida - see in manuscript file "C" the copy of a letter Chapman to Coombs.

Wrote a letter to the Editor of the Medical Record (54:499-500, Oct 1, 1898) pointing out that the typhoid fever at Camp Cuba Libre, Jax., during the Spanish-American War was brought to Jacksonville by the soldiers and spread by flies and the poor hygiene of the troops. His letter is dated Sept. 18, 1898.

NOURSE, Benjamin Franklin, M.D.

Laumer mentions a Dr. Benjamin Franklin Nourse who had come up from Key West with Major Dade and who would accompany Capt. Geo. W. Gardiner's wife back to Key West. Apparently he was an Army surgeon. No more information is supplied about this man.

Sproague; The Fla War, 1848, p 548. In a table it notes him as an assistant surgeon who died at Key West on May 19, 1836 "of a disease contracted in Fla."

NOURSE, B. F. ^{Benjamin} Asst. Surg USA
Report of sick, Key West, 31 Dec 1835

See in the file "Seminole War Medicine" a copy of House Bill No. 510, a petition to provide a pension for Josephine Nourse, widow of Benjamin F. Nourse, late Assistant Surgeon, U.S. Army. Notes he died of disease in Key West, 19th of May, A.D. 1836. Apparently since he was regular army and died of disease, not battle wounds, his widow was not entitled to a pension. However, had he been a volunteer, his widow would have received half pay for about 5 years.
