Monroe St. Was assisted by a son, Dr. Miles Henry Nash Jr. Evelyn Whitfield Henry writes of him: "There were times when his duties as a physician interfered with his duties as a pastor; sometimes he was called from the pulpit to usher a new soul into the world." Dr. Nash Sr. died in Tallahassee and Dr. Nash Jr. and his wife eventually moved to New York.

See in the file "Seminole War Medicine" a copy of House Bill No. 510, a petition to provide a pension for Josephine Nourse, widow of Benjamin F. Nourse, late Assistant Surgeon, U.S. Army. Notes he died of disease in Key West, 19th of May, A.D. 1836. Apparently since he was regular army and died of disease, not battle wounds, his widow was not entitled to a pension. However, had he been a volungeer, his widow would have received half pay for about 5 years.
