Dr. Quackenbush is a native of New York, born in 1847. After receiving a collegiate education he entered the New York Medical University, from which he graduated in the class of '79, taking the first prize in the class of 215. For a period of one year he was connected with St. Francis Hospital in New York city, and during this time practised in New York city--being also a medical examiner for ten prominent life insurance companies. Prior to the study of medicine he spent several years mining in Montana and Idaho. He came to Jacksonville in 1881, and after practising for two months in the city was appointed quarantine physician at the "Bar," which office he still holds, being located at the bar during the summer and in the city during the winter months. He is extensively engaged in microscopic investigation with regard to the germ of various diseases.

In an article entitled "Some Historical Data" that appeared in the Miami Metropolis (?) Nov. 20, 1896, p. 6, et. seq., he is listed on p. 8 but his name is spelled "Quinnan."

Apparently served in the Civil War, See Med. & Surg. Hist. War of Rebellion, Part III Surg. Vol, p 297, top of Rt hand column - performed a R mid thigh amputation Case # 279, July 1863.
