

808 INDIVIDUALS WERE SERVED THROUGH OUR CORNERSTONE SERVICES, INCLUDING INFORMATION AND REFERRAL, CARE COORDINATION, REVIEW OF CORRESPONDENCE AND NATURALIZATION AND PASSPORT SUPPORT. THE WORK WAS DONE BY A TEAM OF 15 STAFF MEMBERS AND 18 DEDICATED VOLUNTEERS AND INTERNS.


