WHAT IS THE DAUGHTERS OF BILITIS? WHAT DOES IT DO?

Aware that many of those who receive our newsletter are neither members of the organization nor subscribers to our magazine THE LADDER, we hereby summarize the purposes of the national organization and the viewpoint of the New York Area Chapter in particular:

1. "Education of the variant . . to understand herself and make her adjustment

to society".

2. "Education of the public" toward understanding and acceptance of the homosexual.

3. "Participation in research projects by duly authorized and responsible individuals."

4. "Investigation of the penal code as it pertains to the homosexual" and promotion of changes where appropriate through due process of law.

The New York Chapter is a relatively new group; we received our official charter at the recent first convention of the national organization. Our means for accomplishing the goals of the D.O.B. are decided upon and worked out entirely by the members themselves. This offers an opportunity for all women over 21 interested in the homophile movement to "get in on the ground floor" and to direct the organization toward meaningful goals. Here also is a framework within which the creative person may more effectively put her ideas into action. And within the group, the action is not only more influential but more personally satisfying.

We also welcome as members those who cannot participate but wish to support our

work. The Daughters of Bilitis needs you - and we think you need us!
