"There are things you can do to help stop the spread of AIDS..."

- Learn the facts about HIV and AIDS.
- Learn how to say no and feel good about it. You may want to practice how you would say these things with family or friends.
- Remember abstinence IS an acceptable option.
- If sexually active, practice safer sex. Use a **LATEX** condom **EVERYTIME.**
- Talk with your partner (boyfriend/girlfriend) about sexual responsibilities. Find alternative ways of expressing your feelings for each other.
- Stay away from alcohol and drugs; they cloud your judgement and may lead you to make unsafe choices.
- Don't share needles used for drugs (including steroids), tatooing, or ear-piercing with anyone.
- Share what you've learned about AIDS and HIV with others. **AIDS IS PREVENTABLE.**
