Things I'd Like To Know

The government is suddenly interested in lyinching and unless something happens to prevent it a bill is soon to be passed to give federal agents full authority in lynching cases. State authorities, of course, will be deprived of a branch of law enforcement which heretofore has been left in their hands. The bill is a direct thrust at southern states and is meeting much opposition. If the bill should pass and the government really tries to make it stick it could be enforced very simply. Let the government offer a reward of \$100 for each witness who will come forward and identify, under oath, any member of a mob.

And speaking of law enforcement the wave of counterfeiting which is sweeping the country could be broken up more quickly if the government adopted a policy of replacing counterfeit money instead of seizing it. When an otherwise honest person gains possession of a bill of which he is suspicious his first thought is to pass it on rather than take it to a bank where it is sure to be seized and stamped "Spurious." Counterfeits would be detected immediately and would provide clues before they became cold. Counterfeiters, or their "passers" would not take advantage of the procedure because any person who became a persistent "presenter" of spurious notes would fall under suspicion and lay a trail straight to his own door.


