Florida U. Students Plan Sit-Down Strike

RETURNING students from the University of Florida, here for the holidays, brought word that a general strike of the student body at that institution impends, if—

Governor Cone exercises his official prerogatives and removes University President John J. Tigert from office in order to name a political henchman in his place.

Tom Leonard, head of the Florida branch of the American student Union, and editor of the school paper, has already taken steps to corral all students in a general sit-down strike in the event that President Tigert is summarily ditched for "political expediency."

Tigert, former United States commissioner of education, is extremely popular with the student body. During the past five years an increase of 600 students has been made. He is recognized as one of the country's foremost educators.

The merchant "shook down" the easier of the two debtors, then killed him with a pistol-shot in the back. The merchant then informed a noted sharpshooter that the SURVIVING debtor was gunning for him. The next step was to tell the debtor that the noted sharpshooter was laying for him. The scheme failed only because the surviving debtor made overtures to the sharpshooter, pleaded together their stories and learned of the merchant's foul scheming. If that isn't some calculating, murderous planning, we'll stack any thief's depredations up against it anytime at 100 to 1.
