LETTER FOR COMMENTS

The Dade County Historic Preservation Board will be considering the designation of the Arch Creek Archeological Site (Da23), located at 1855 Northeast 135th Street. Pursuant to the Metro-Dade Historic Preservation Ordinance we are notifying you of this pending action and request that you inform us of any potential conflict of plans, projects or regulations. Comments or questions should be addressed to the staff of the Preservation Board, Office of Community and Economic Development, Historic Preservation Division before the next public hearing of the Preservation Board on October 17, 1984.

The legal description of the property being considered for designation is:

Beginning at a point at the SE corner of Arch Creek Park at the intersection of U.S. 1 and NE 135th Street, then 675' westly along the park's southern boundary to the ROW of the Florida East Coast Railroad, then 950' northeasterly along the Florida East Coast Railroad ROW, then 300' southeasterly along the park's northern boundary to the NE corner of the park, then 895' southwesterly to the Point of Beginning.
