RE: Unresolved Historic Arch Creek Road (Military Trail) Matters

Dear Ms. Siegel:

This is to confirm our conversation of September 16, 1997 in which we discussed the failure of Larry Weiser to comply with commitments to distinguish the historic Military Trail access to Arch Creek state archaeologic site/ county park from the customer parking for his commercial development, by striping and signage.

Although the Trust is working with the Historic Preservation staff on the wording for the official historic marker, there is a lack of adequate identification that there is a Biscayne Boulevard entrance to the Park for school busses. The Trust will contact the City when they have received the approved wording fro the historic marker, so that, as we discussed, North Miami Beach can achieve its installation. But there is still a need for additional directional signage.

The Trust believes that since the ROW is to be maintained by the City of North Miami Beach as part of the Easement agreement, that whether Weiser is having "personal problems" or not, the commitments to designate the road all the way down to the entrance to the park must be completed expeditiously.

A solution to the problem of confusion to the public about the availability of Park access from Biscayne Boulevard would be to reestablish the historic Park Boulevard access at NE 139th street. That access to the park is unambiguous and well defined.
