Arch Creek Memorial Park is an eight-acre legend dating back to prehistoric man. It is rich with geological, archaeological, botanical and historical interpretation.

About the most distinctive feature of the site, and the one which made the area most attractive to the uses of man both in prehistoric and modern times, was the natural bridge over Arch Creek. It is assumed that the bridge was used by game, man on foot, and eventually by horsedrawn and motorized vehicles. Indian fighters used the bridge and evidence appears that the first motor car came into the area across the natural bridge.

Arch Creek presents a unique opportunity to tell the story of prehistoric man in South Florida. The site has been noted in connection with military operations of the Second Seminole War during 1842.
